Locals donate seed to Boys Ranch

The West Texas Boys Ranch harvested a bumper crop of large round hay bales this past year, thanks at least in part to a group of Coke County residents who donated the seed for last year's hay crop on the ranch.

What makes this hay so important is that most of the hay that is baled goes to feed the ranch's growing herd of Beefmaster cattle, which now numbers sixty head. The ranch's cow herd was started years ago with the donation of a single heifer. And last year's dry weather conditions placed even more importance on the hay crop that would have to feed the herd through the dry weather.
