The West Coke County Ambulance Service volunteers held a regular monthly meeting at the Ranch House Monday, June 24. The group is making plans for the annual Labor Day Barbecue to be held at the new rec hall on Monday, Sept. 2, 1985. Everyone is reminded to keep that date open for the great EMS barbecue and trimmings.
Another item of business included changing the time for the monthly free blood pressure clinic. The blood pressure clinic will continue to be held on the second Saturday of each month at the Post Office, but the time will be changed to $10: 30-$ 12:30 p.m. Everyone is encouraged to have a blood pressure check each month.

Keep an eye on your blood pressure and prevent heart attacks and strokes. Remember. . .this service is free of charge. A record is kept for physicians to review if needed.
Mike Fluhmann reported his concern about the increased possibility of EMS calls around Lake Spence. The ambulance has a radio that is on the common hospital frequency, but many of those people at the lake have citizen's band (CB) radios. He noted that he feels the ambulance should add this piece of equipment to aid in responding to emergencies at the lake. It was decided to mention this to the citizens of our area in case someone has a CB they would like to donate or if someone would like to donate toward this equipment.
The ambulance volunteers have scheduled two Sunday afternoons a month for continuing education and training in order to serve the
public even better.: The service is now able to offer advanced life support care to the citizens of this area. Our biggest need at this time is for more volunteers. Plans are underway to offer a basic-EMT (emergency medical technician) course in Robert Lee beginning in January or February of 1986. We need to find people willing to give of themselves and their time to help their fellow citizens.
