Violent storm brings rain

Gusting winds, hailstones and that precious commodity, rain, were ushered into Bronte last Wednesday afternoon. The clouds stayed around and the area had additional rainfall bringing measurements of slightly more than two inches before clearing into a sun-filled weekend.

The Wednesday storm, briefly produced pea size to golfball size hailstones which pelted leaves and limbs, along with high winds, but little damage was reported.

Roving thunderstorms, rumbling back and forth over Robert Lee, produced electrical displays but little rain last week. Spotty showers ranged from ½ inch to 2 inches over the immediate area, accompanied by small hail. Lightning did more damage than wind or hail, splintering trees, and knocking out phones and televisions. One Robert Lee resident lost a family dog when it was struck by lightning.

Winters neighbors to the northeast were not so lucky. Roofs, cars, trees, and gardens were hammered by golfball size, and up, hail.

Haberdashery celebrates 80th birthday

The year 1986 marks a milestone in the Cumbie family dry goods establishment in Bronte, as it is the 80th anniversary of the firm.

In 1906, the Reverend R.M. Cumbie, a pioneer Baptist minister, and his son, R.E. Cumbie sold their cash crops and invested their return in T.R. Butlers interest in Hickman and Butler. The name was then changed to Hickman-Cumbie Co.

In July, 1909, the business was divided with Frank Hickman taking the hardware and implement business and remaining in the building now housing Sav-On Food. Bob Hickman moved the grocery stock into the building where West Texas Utilities is now located, and the dry goods portion was moved to its present location, changing the name to R.M. Cumbie & Son.

Early in 1911, Mae Cumbie Wilkins and her husband H.R. bought into the family business and the name became Cumbie & Wilkins. He remained a partner in the firm until his death in 1933.

In January 1929, J.B. and Georgia Mae Mackey became partners in the firm and bought Mae Wilkins' interest in 1946. The name was changed once again to Cumbie and Mackey, which it remained until December 1985.

On January 1, 1986, the fourth generation of the Cumbie family bought the Mackeys' interest in the business. Susan Cumbie Arrott and husband Nick Arrott are presently operating the firm in its original location. In February, restoration work was done on the building and fixtures, and the

store now reflects the ambiance of the early 1900's.

"The restoration work was hard, but never dull," said the present owners. "Each day we made a discovery. The walls behind the windows had two layers of murals, one of an outdoor scene with sailboats, and the other was an Art-Deco print that would be in style today. The walls behind the shelving along the walls bore water marks of various (cont'd. on page 2)

No action was taken upon discussion of the proposed baseball acreage.

Jack Tubb and John Sheen met with the court to discuss the roadway for Lake Spence Estates. The court decided to accept the roadway upon meeting county specifications, and that the county would maintain the road for a period of one year, at current rates for private roadwork. At the conclusion of one year, the roadway would then be dedicated to the county.

The Bronte VFD will provide a concession stand and a box for donations toward the new fire truck. There will be a gate charge of \$3.00 for adults and \$2.00 for child-






Crowd enjoys Moore bbg



Anyone finding a balloon is urged to fill out the information and return the card to Bronte Elementary.


