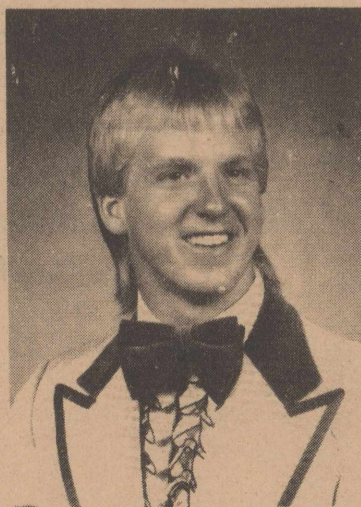
Honor grads named

Absentee voting set for run-off

Absentee balloting for the Second Primary (Run-off) Election will be held in Coke County and across the state from May 28 through June 3. Eligible voters from both the Democratic and Republican parties may cast absentee ballots at the clerk's office in the courthouse at Robert Lee during regular business hours. The election itself will take place on Saturday, June 7, 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.

Polling places for the Democratic voting will be slightly different than in the

first Primary election on May 3. For the run-off election only, Mrs. Patti Ivey, county chairman, reported Robert Lee's voting precincts 1 and 3 will be combined to vote at the courthouse while Bronte's precincts 2 and 5 will cast their ballots toge-

ther at the city hall.

On the Democratic ballot will be the only county race involved in the election, the electing of a new county treasurer, with candidates Phelan Wrinkle of Robert Lee and Bobbie Arrott of

Bronte appearing on it. Also on that ballot will be run-offs for the Railroad Commission, Court of Criminal Appeals, and Justice Supreme Court.

Four races will be decided on the Republican ballot, stated county chairman James Pentecost. Although

no county race will be on that ballot, run-offs will be listed for the Attorney General, Railroad Commission, Lieutenant Governor, and the Commissioner of General Land Office. Locations of the polling places will be the same as for the Primary -- the Bronte school and the Robert Lee school.

Williams announces

Troy D. Williams of Ozona announced he is a candidate for the Silver Haired Legislature, an advisory group created by the last session of the Legislature, composed of citizens 60 and older. This Silver Haired Legislature will meet in Austin in September to draft legislation to aid in solving problems which relate to older Texans.

Two persons will be chosen in a special election to represent the rural counties of the Concho Valley Region, the 12 rural counties include Coke, Crockett, Irion, Kimble, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Reagan, Schleicher, Sterling, Concho and Sutton Counties.

Absentee voting will begin May 1 and end May 23, voting in person will be May 30th. Only persons 60 years of age and older will vote, and they must be Texas residents and registered voters.

Coke County Museum holds open house each Sunday and Wednesday from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Reservations may be made for other hours through County Judge Aubrey Denman's office. School classes, out-of-town visitors, family reunion groups, et cetera, are welcome.

Commission members hope that families who wish to display family heirlooms will volunteer to do so for the period of time of their choice. Such special displays should be advertised ahead

of time so all interested viewers could attend.

A new name was added to membership, that of Mrs. Robert G. Blackwood. She brought an interesting collection of barbed wire which will be displayed soon. New members are welcome.

Brenda Hines, of Bronte, chairman of Coke County Historical Commission, urges families whose land has been in use by descendants since 1886 or before, to obtain an application for "The Family Land Heritage Program", through which Texas Department of Agriculture hopes to honor such

families. Many counties in Texas have numerous families listed, but, although several Coke County families qualify, none from our county are named on the official list sent from state headquarters. Applications may be obtained from Judge Denman. Application deadline is July 15, 1986.

Regular third Monday meetings of the Historical Commission will be discontinued for the summer, but open house will continue on Sunday and Wednesday. Volunteer hosts and hostesses are needed. Contact Mrs. Bobby (Jeffie) Roberts.



Disqualification clouds winning effort

Disappointment and frustration clouded Jim Bob Jacob's disputed win (by as much as 10 yards) of the Class A, 400 meter race at the State Track Meet in Austin last weekend. The trip to the meet culminated several seasons of hard work for Jim Bob, a senior Steer, who was runnerup in the 400 in 1985. The 400 was his race; he got off to a good start and simply ran away from the field finishing in 48.5. Officials then made a heartbreaker ruling. Jim Bob and 3 other runners were disqualified for allegedly getting out of their respective lanes.

The disappointment of the disqualification in the 400 should not in any way overshadow Jim Bob's super State Class A gold medal win

in the 100 meter dash. It was a triumph in itself; he had only competed a few weeks in the 100 before the big win with a 11.1 clocking.

Even the weather was not cooperative for the state contests. Saturday's afternoon events were delayed until dark due to heavy rains and tornado watches and wound up in the wee morning hours.

Robert Lee's second Steer State qualifier, J.P. Skipworth, also suffered some disappointment at the meet when he failed to place in the shot put. J.P. was State bound also in his main event, the discus. Going into the meet, he had the best throw among the field of contestants in Class A, but placed 3rd to gain the bronze medal

with a 147-7½" throw. J.P. is a junior and is a sure bet to repeat his State contention.

The entire Steer track team is to be commended for its highly successful season under the coaching of Ed Poehls and his assistants. They placed high in every meet they attended and in almost every event offered. A large number qualified for Regional with two athletes going on to the State Meet and winning a 1st and 3rd there. That's pretty high cotton for country folks!

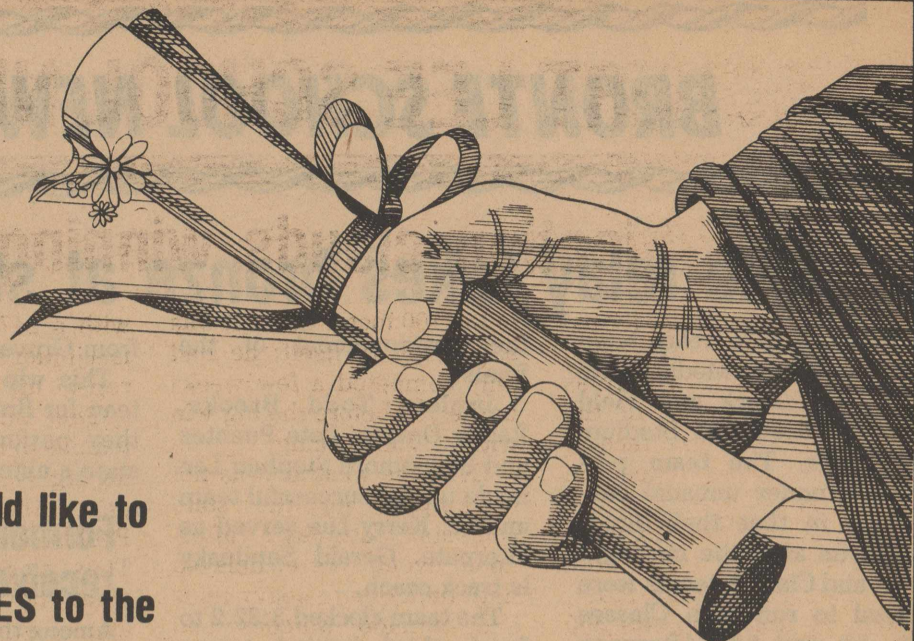

Mile relay takes bronze at state

Bronte's mile relay team won the Bronze Medal at the State UIL Track and Field Meet at Memorial Stadium in Austin. The team performed under unusual conditions in that their finals were run after the midnight hour and Class A teams were forced to run with Classes 2A, 3A and 5A. Afternoon downpours in Austin caused

the postponement of the finals.

Juniors Todd Brooks, Randy Draper, Pete Puentez and Sophomore Stephen Lee made up the successful team and Sr. Kerry Lee served as alternate. Gerald Sandusky is track coach.

The team clocked 3:32.2 to finish third behind teams

from Gruver and Italy.

This win was a new plateau for Bronte tracksters as they performed among the state's elite teams.

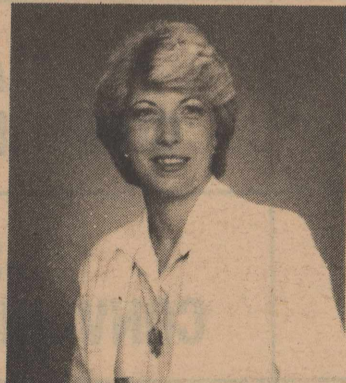

Texas Tourist Bureaus are located in Amarillo, Anthony, Austin, Denison, Gainesville, Langtry, Laredo, Orange, Texarkana, Harlingen, Waskom and Wichita Falls. There are State Department of Highways and Public Transportation offices throughout Texas, with at least one in most Texas counties.

Don't Mess With Texas bumper stickers are also available free at the same locations.

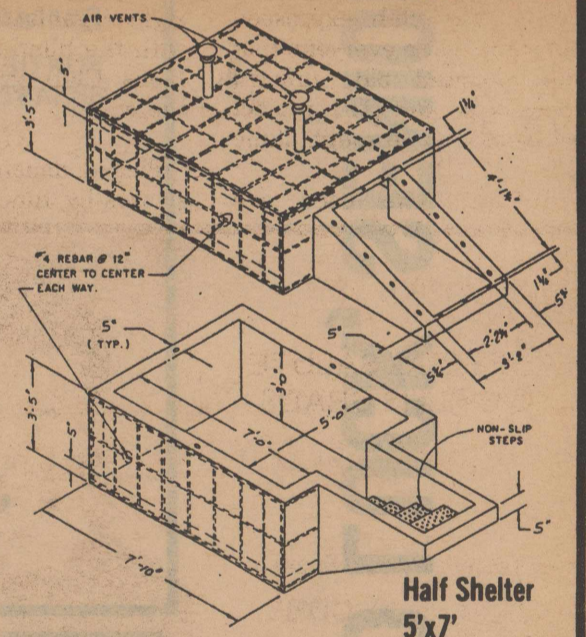

TIME TO CHECK FOR CASEBEARERS

Pecan growers need to be on the look-out for pecan nut casebearers, those perennial pests that can destroy a pecan crop if not controlled.

Based on various prediction models and trappings, casebearers should be showing up in Coke County on about May 15-20.

Normally, casebearers damage nuts within a two week period.

To time spray applications for effective control, first check for eggs on a daily basis. Eggs are usually found on the tips of nutlets and are about the size of a ball in a ball point pen. These are white when first laid, then turn red over a three to five day period before turning white again after hatching.

Apply an insecticide the third day after the first eggs hatch to kill the larvae before they enter the nutlets. Since the larvae will hatch over a week-long period of more, a second application may be necessary.

Insecticides recommended for casebearer control include Diazinon, Pydrin, Malathion, and Zolone. It is also recommended to add zinc to any spray application to control rozette of pecans which stunts growth and reduces production.

INVADING BEETLE CAUSES CONCERN

Those yellow and black beetles about 1/2 inch long that seem to be invading everywhere are known as soldier beetles. They are closely kin to lightning bugs, but do not emit light.

Adult soldier beetles are usually found on flowers or weeds where they feed pri-

marily on pollen or other insects. One preferred food source is grasshopper eggs. They will also feed on aphids, caterpillars and other insects. Occasionally, some species will feed on plant tissue, but soldier beetles are basically "good guys". Control of soldier beetles can rarely be justified, but if they are annoying to you, common insecticides such as malathion, diazinon or dursban should provide good control.

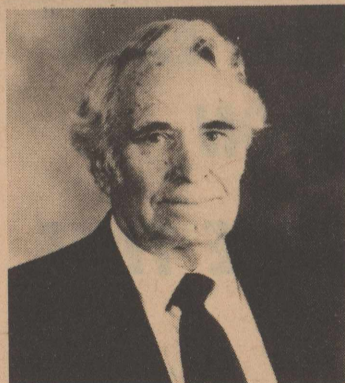
ASU graduates
