Pageant opening set for tonight

OLE COKE COUNTY may not have "a cast of thousands" but a roster of approximately 90 in a small county of under 3000 folks is impressive. Those 90 characters are in full dress rehearsal this week in preparation for the opening of the historical musical pageant which opens Friday night, July 18. It will be replayed July 19, 25, and 26.

"Texas Singout" will begin at 8 p.m., followed by the flag rising ceremony, and the pageant opening at 8:30 p.m.

The production, written and directed by Lucile Bryan, is based in part on historical events and other scenes are fabricated. OLE COKE COUNTY is sponsored by patron memberships, ticket sales, and souvenir booths. It has no paid employees and members of the cast range from young children to older characters. Some members of the cast portray ancestors while others are relative newcomers to the county. Represented in the pageant are Robert Lee, Bronte, Sanco, Tennyson, and other surrounding

communities.

There is room for all in the 900 seat amphitheatre on Mountain Creek in Robert Lee. It is located behind the baseball fields at the county park in the north part of town. It has been suggested that attendees bring cushions or stadium seats for the wooden benches. Ticket prices for the production are \$4 for adults and \$2 for children.

The 1986 version of the pageant will be the 10th annual presentation. Some cast members, as well as scenes, change from year to year so if you, your family, and guests have seen the musical before, it will still be fresh to you. Out of state residents and relatives of county folks have planned their vacations or visits around the production in the past. Those who are so convenient to OLE COKE COUNTY and have not taken advantage of this fun community achievement are missing out on four chances at a pleasurable evening's entertainment. This pageant does not come across as an amateur effort by the group.

Death ruled self-inflicted

Everett Warren Haynes, 85, was pronounced dead at his home in Robert Lee on Tuesday at 4:45 p.m. by Peace Justice Opal Jacoby. Cause of death was ruled self-inflicted gunshot wound with death occuring about noon.

Mr. Haynes lived alone in a Robert Lee Housing Authority apartment where he had lived since moving from Alpine in March 1986. A longtime friend, Mrs. La Verne Earwood, of Robert Lee checked on him periodically and often cooked his meals. It was Mrs. Earwood who discovered the body.

She stated that he was sleeping early Tuesday morning and she returned in the afternoon.

The name of the victim was with held on Tuesday, pending notification of next of kin, according to Sheriff Marshall Millican. Mr. Haynes only immediate survivors are a brother, John J. Haynes of Hemet, CA and a nephew, Robert Chambers of Botchell, WA.

Jeff Barnes of the Coke County Sheriff's office was the investigating officer.

Services for Mr. Haynes are pending with Shaffer Funeral Home.



Winning first place by virtue of a playoff at 63 were Randy Lewis, Dan Martin, Tony Martin, and Troy Jordan.


