## County youth qualify for state contests

### Steer golfers place second at regional

The Robert Lee Steer Golf team qualified for the State Meet by virtue of their second place 642 total last week in the Region II-A meet in Abilene. Baird won the tournament with a 604. Twenty-four teams make up Region II-A and the Steers ended the tourney tied with Knox City,

went into a sudden death play-off, and won.

The Steer golfers headed for Austin May 11 & 12 and their Regional results are: Clint Smith 75, 83 - 158, Jody Tavarez 83, 83 - 168, Michael Lee 74, 86 - 160, Joel Herring 82, 85 - 167, and Stephen

Epperson 78, 82 - 160.

Robert Lee B team finished with 5th a 684 total at the Regional meet. Team members and their scores are: Jason Wink 84, 85 - 169, Scott Antilley 82, 89 - 171, Brent McPeek 81, 93 - 174, Brent Gibbs 88, 93 - 181, and Jon Rogers 79, 91 - 170.

The Lady Longhorn track team qualified four girls in four different events for the state track meet which will be held May 12 & 13 in Austin.

As a team, senior Misti Taylor, sophomores Eboni Taylor and Angela Reyes and freshman Teresa Vaughn finished in second place behind champion Munday. There were 41 schools represented in the girls division.

The four Bronte girls all turned in season best performances in qualifying for state. Teresa won the high jump with a jump of 5' 6". She also finished third place in the 200 with a personal best and school record time of 25.84. Eboni won the 3200 with a personal best and school record time of 12:20.4. Misti ran her best time of the year in the 800, 2:23.4 which was good for a third place finish. Misti finished second in the 1600 with a time of 5:33. This is the third straight year Misti has qualified for the State Track Meet. The 1600 relay team consisting of Angela, Eboni, Teresa and Misti finished in second place with a season best and new school record time of 4:07.1. Alternates for the relay are Junior Melinda Gentry and Freshman Darla Scott.
