## Fall hunting season opens

That long-awaited weekend has finally arrived-the opening days of the fall hunting season which includes whitetail deer, turkey, and quail. In Coke County, hunters may begin firing one-half hour before sunrise Saturday morning, Nov. 4.
Deer and turkey season will hold forth until January 7 with quail season going longer, to Feb. 25. Mourning dove season drew to a dismal close Monday, October 30. Javalina hunting is in progress, Oct. 7Feb. 25. Archery only hunting season ends Sunday, Nov. 5 , but bow hunters may continue, and compete with gun hunters, through-out the gun season.

## Special election Tuesday

Tuesday, November 7, will be Special Election day statewide in Texas as voters try to decipher whether to adopt or reject the 21 proposed constitutional amendments on the ballot. Absentee voting will continue until 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 3, in the County Clerk's office. Any registered qualified voter may now vote absentee. Under a 1987 state law that relaxed absentee balloting requirements, Texans were given the option of casting absentee votes by personal appearance without having to give a reason for doing so.

McNeil Wylie, 92, died Saturday, Oct. 28, at his Lubbock residence following a lengthy illness.

Service was at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Resthaven Funeral Home chapel with burial in Resthaven Memorial Park.
He was born Nov. 2, 1896 in Erath County.
A former resident of Robert Lee, Mr. Wylie served Coke County first as tax assessor and held the county judge's position from 1935-1946.

Mrs. Wylie taught in the Robert Lee school system. The family moved to Lubbock in 1952.
He served on the Lubbock Police Department several years. He was an Army veteran of World War II, a member of the Methodist church and American Legion Post No. 575.

Survivors include his wife, Weta Wylie of Lubbock; one daughter, Jane Aebersold of Bennington, Vt.; two grandchildren; and a number of nieces and nephews.

## The Best of Europe

On September 6, Ernest and Louise Clendennen and Fred and Alice Beaty flew to Phoenix, Arizona to meet with a group from the First Christian Church to see "The Best of Europe." There were 38 on our tour. The tour hosts were Dr. William Boise and Mr. Randall Secrest of First Christian Church of Phoenix. Our tour included England, France, Switzerland, Germany and Holland for September 7-24. Travel arrangements were by Dillard's Travel of Pheonix. We flew directly from Phoenix to New York, changing planes for London on TWA.
In London, we visited the Jewel House of the Tower of London to see The Crown Jewels of England in all their splendor. They are seen by more than a million people every year. They are cherished for their historic and religious significance. To the British Nations the Crown Jewels are priceless. The Tower of London is one of the chief treasurers of the Me dieval Kings. The Jewel House also contained banquet and church plates, state swords, processional maces and trumpets, the robes and insignia of the orders of chivalry decorations, and medals.

We attended Her Majesty's Theatre to see the musical "Phantom of the Opera", one of the most popular plays presented in any theater.
Enroute to crossing the English Channel from Dover we visited the Canterbury Cathedral, the mother church of Episcopalians. It is the historic church where Thomas A. Beckett was murdered.
We crossed the English Channel from Dover to Calais, France, on over to Paris. In Paris we had a moonlight boat ride on the Seine River, past the shadowed towers of Notre Dame to welcome us to the City of Light--the Arc de Triumphe, the Eiffel Tower (celebrating 100 years). We crossed under 27 bridges on this beautiful boat ride.
The tour of the Louvre Museum was exciting. We entered through the new-glass pyramid that was designed by American Architect I. M. Pei its sides reflect the mood of the Paris sky. The Louvre was originally a medieval fortress built in 1200. The Lourve collections are divided into seven departments. The out standing painting we saw was the Mona Lisa by Leonardo di Vinci.
In Chartres we visited the Chartres Cathedral where we saw some of the world's most beautiful stained glass--and just for our group the Cathedral organist played a concert for us on the magnificent organ.
Another outstanding visit was made to the Palace of Versailles and the beautiful flower gardens. It contained painted ceilings and the furniture was 300 years old. The Versailles Hall of Mirrors reflected the reign of Louis XIV.

We were transfered to Gar du Nard to catch the TGV ex-
press train to Geneva Switzerland. This train travels very fast--168 mile per hour. After sightseeing in Geneva we continued along the Lake we continued along the Lake
of Geneva to Montreux. We of Geneva to Montreux. We
visited the Chillon Castle, near visited the Chillon Castle, near
Montreux. Of all the castles in Montreux. Of all the castles in Switzerland, Chillon still offers the most complete picture of what a baronial castle was in the Middle Ages.
The spectacular vistas of the Alps were experienced as we traveled up the Matterhorn we traveled up the Matterhorn wheel railroads in Europe to Gornergrat. We enjoyed the lovely little town of Zermatt in beautiful Switzerland.
We traveled on to Interlaken where we stayed at a holiday resort that was over 300 years old. After another day of sightseeing in the country o William Tell we journeyed on to Zurich to see the overwhelming Rhinefalls.
In Germany we had a guided tour through the Cathedral of Freiburg then on to Rothenburg for shopping at the burg for shopping at the
Christmas store. We transferred from our hotel to ferred from our hotel to
Rudesheim where we boardRudesheim where we board-
ed a Rhine cruiser. We saw vineyards, castles, and the mountains. Our coach was waiting for us at Koblenz to take us to Cologne.
After a guided tour of the
After a guided tour of the
Cologne Cathedral, we drove Cologne Cathedral, we drove
through the lowlands of the Netherlands. Along the way we visited the Kroller-Mulle Museum wher paintings of Vincent van Gough were exhibited.
We stayed in Amsterdam two days. In Haarven at the St. Bavo Church, an organist told us about their organ and then gave us a recital. In the afternoon, we transfered to Zaandam for a recital on the Flentrop organ at the Church of Zaandam.
Just outside Amsterdam in Aalsmeer we visited the flower auction. We had a walkthrough of the largest flower auction in the world. The building covers a hugh area in the largest commercial building in the world. Over 4700 growers of flowers are members of this cooperative. There are five auction rooms with a total of 13 hugh clocks. Each clock is used for the daily auctioning of the products, so that buyers know where they go. Auctioning takes place five days a week, from about 6:30 a.m. Each auctioning room seats 300 buyers. These buyers include exporters and wholesalers, as wel! as shop keepers and street vendors.
In Rotterdam we visited the Wooden Shoe Factory and a fine Pottery Factory--then to Kinderdijk to see the Windmills.
In the medevial town of Brugge, Belgium we visited a shop where they make lace-then we toured the ancient town.
After a farewell-dinner in Rotterdam we were taken to the Hook of Holland where we boarded a ferry boat for Harwich, England. A coach took us to Heathrow Airport in London for our flight back to the USA
