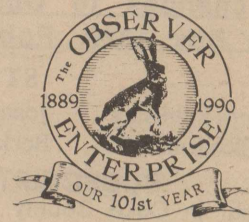

Lee voted county judge in runoff election

Tuesday culminated the campaigns of many hard-working politicians as races were put before voters in the second primary or runoff election. Only slightly less voter turn-out was noted for the runoff than the primary in Coke County. In the primary 1,171 ballots were cast; Tuesday 1,045 voted.

Only one county race was on the ballot, that of county judge candidates Royce Lee and Kenneth Green. Lee took the nomination with a relatively close 553 over Green's 483.

Coke Countians chose Ann Richards, 478 votes, over Jim

Mattox, 417, for the governor's nomination.

Nikki Van Hightower got 459 votes locally to Tom Bowden's 378 for state treasurer.

In the justice supreme court, Place 2 Bob Gammage's margin was big, 632, over Ross Sears with 196.

In the race for judge criminal appeals, place 1, Frank Maloney won over Morris Overstreet, 414-352.

County Democratic candidates will appear unopposed on the November 6 general election ballot and take office the first of the year.

RL Sr. Dance

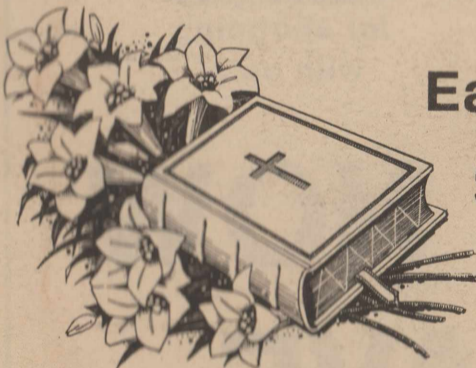

Communities to conduct blood drives

There will be a community blood drive conducted by United Blood Services of San Angelo on Thursday, April 26, 1990 in Bronte. The drive is sponsored by the City office personnel. The drive will be at the Fire Department from 10 am until 1 pm. On Thursday afternoon, the county drive will continue at Robert Lee from 2:30 - 5 pm at the Rec Hall with United Blood Services in charge.

United Blood Services supplies blood to 26 west and central Texas hospitals. There is a need of 75 units per day to supply these needs. "There are two concerns when donors are accepted: the donor's safety and the safety of the blood which will be used later for transfusion," stated Paula Kennemer, Director of Community Relations with United Blood Services.

For those reasons the blood services personnel interview each donor for a medical history and check the donor's temperature, pulse, blood pressure and hemoglobin (iron) content before the donations. All of these guidelines are set forth by the Food and Drug Administration and the American Association of Blood Banks.

After the blood is drawn it is typed and tested for diseases which could be transmitted to the recipient. If any of the tests indicate the need for medical attention, the donor is notified by mail.

Donors must be between the ages of 17 (with parents or guardian permission) and 75 (over 66 with doctors permission), weigh at least 110 pounds and must have waited

eight weeks since their last donation. If you donate try to eat a good meal before and after your donation.

United Blood Services, a division of Blood Systems,

Inc., is a non profit organization relying solely on the support of volunteer blood donors. Your donation will help meet the demands for blood products in this area.

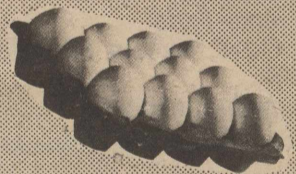

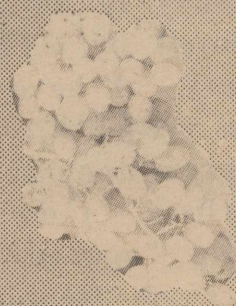

Shorthorns are district track champs

The Bronte Shorthorns became the District Champs Monday evening when they participated in the District Track Meet in Water Valley. They scored 152 1/2 points.

The Shorthorns have had a good season this year as they have won all of the meets they have participated in.

Jacob Golson had a good day as he pulled through for 4 gold medals. He won the long jump with 17' 10". The 200 M run saw him breeze across the finish line in a time of 25.16.

Jacob also runs the 2nd leg of the 400 m relay and is the anchor man on the 1600 m relay. Both relays came in 1st. He also came in 6th in the discus.

Gary Bilbrey also turned in a good meet as he placed 2nd in the high jump, 2nd in the shot put, he runs ancho in the 400 m relay and is on the 1600 m relay team. Gary crossed the finish line 1st in the 800 m run but not until after a close race with teammates Jamie Flores and Brent Taylor who came in 2nd and 3rd respectively.

Jay Parker took 2nd in the triple jump with 34'2" and helped the Horns to a 1st place finish in the 400 m relay by running the 3rd leg. He also placed 6th in the 300 m hurdles.

Jamie Flores took 3rd place in the triple jump, 4th place in the high jump, 2nd in the 800 m. run and runs the 1st leg on the 400 m relay and is also on the 1600 m relay.

Rudy Sanchez placed 3rd in the shot put, 6th in the 100 m run and 4th in the 400 m run, followed by Freddie Montez - 6th in the 400 m run.

John Lewis came in 2nd in the 2400 m run and 4th in the 1600 m run followed by Randy Bilbrey who took 5th place in the 1600 m run.

Brent Taylor took 4th place in the long jump, 3rd in the 800 m run, tied for 5th in the 200 m run and ran on the 1600 m relay team.

The relay teams have done an exceptional job this season as they have breezed by their opponents quite handedly. The 400 m relay team had no problems winning 1st place with a time 49.35. Members of the team are Bilbrey, Flores, Parker and Golson.

The 1600 m relay team eas-

ily took 1st with no one closing in. Bilbrey, Golson, Taylor and Flores make up this team.

Other Shorthorn participants who helped make up the track team were David Cason, Brandon Tinney, Eddie Pullan, Casey Thorn, Devlin Pierce, Justin Lampier, Raymond Fuentez and Jason Cooper.

Results of the Ready Writing Competition have not been determined at this time.

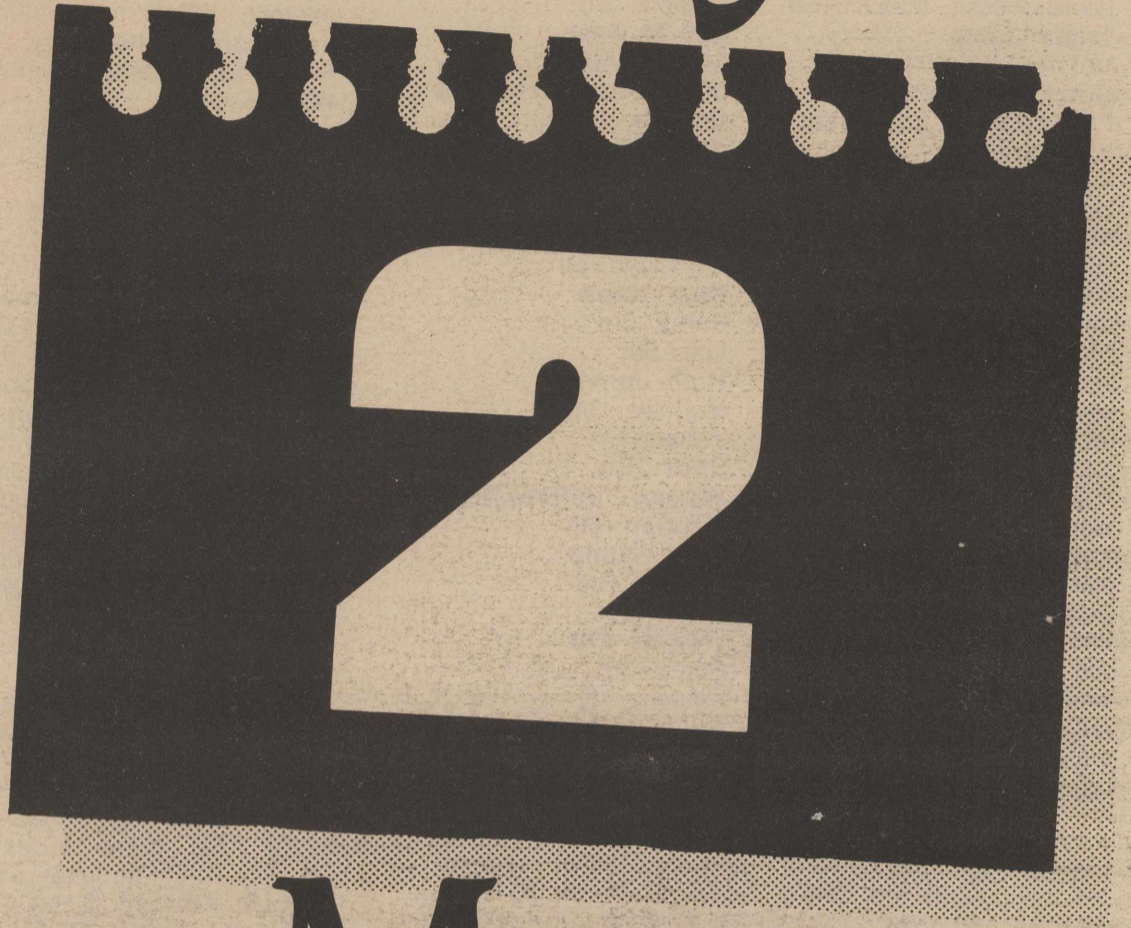

Walker is city candidate

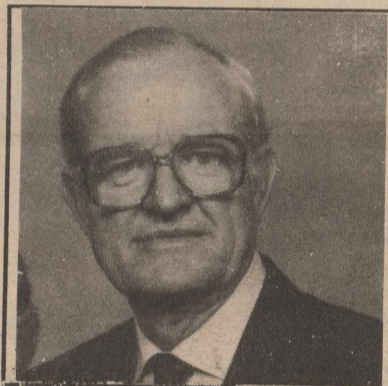
