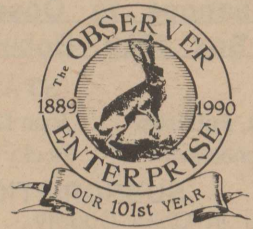

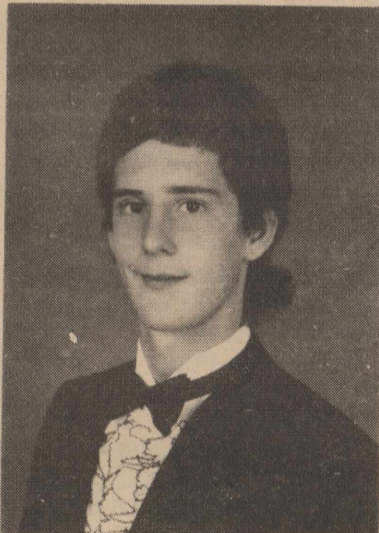
All county residents are encouraged to bring their favorite freezer of homemade ice cream to the covered picnic area of the park no later than 6 pm for judging. All en-

The family has requested memorials be sent to the Crestview Baptist Church Building Fund.

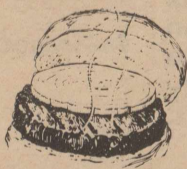
Reception held for RL grads



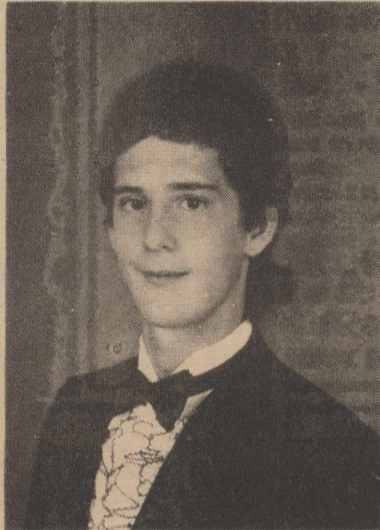
A reading "Smell the Roses" was read for the opening of the program. Each person present named a helpful thing in the kitchen during roll call.

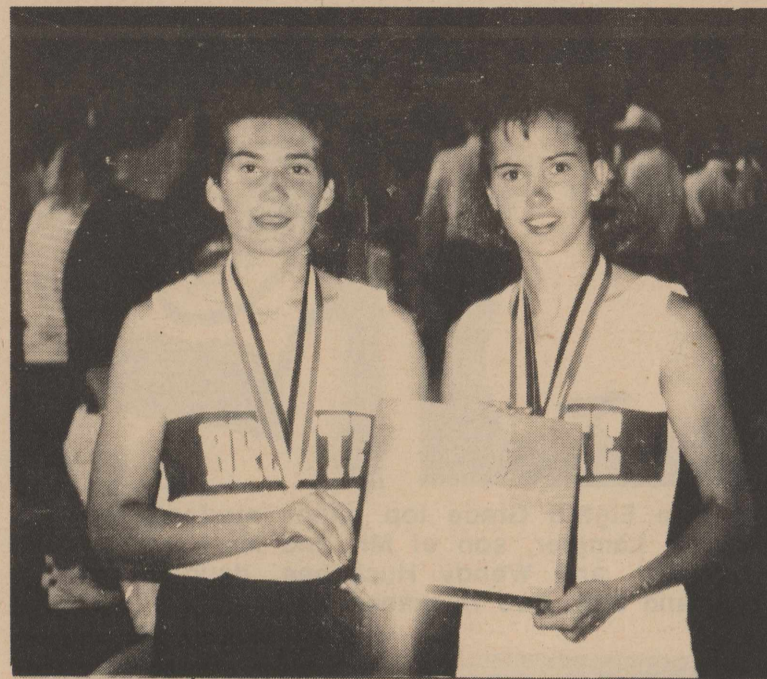
Newspapers should have inserts left inside them and should be in paper bags or boxes for ease of handling.
