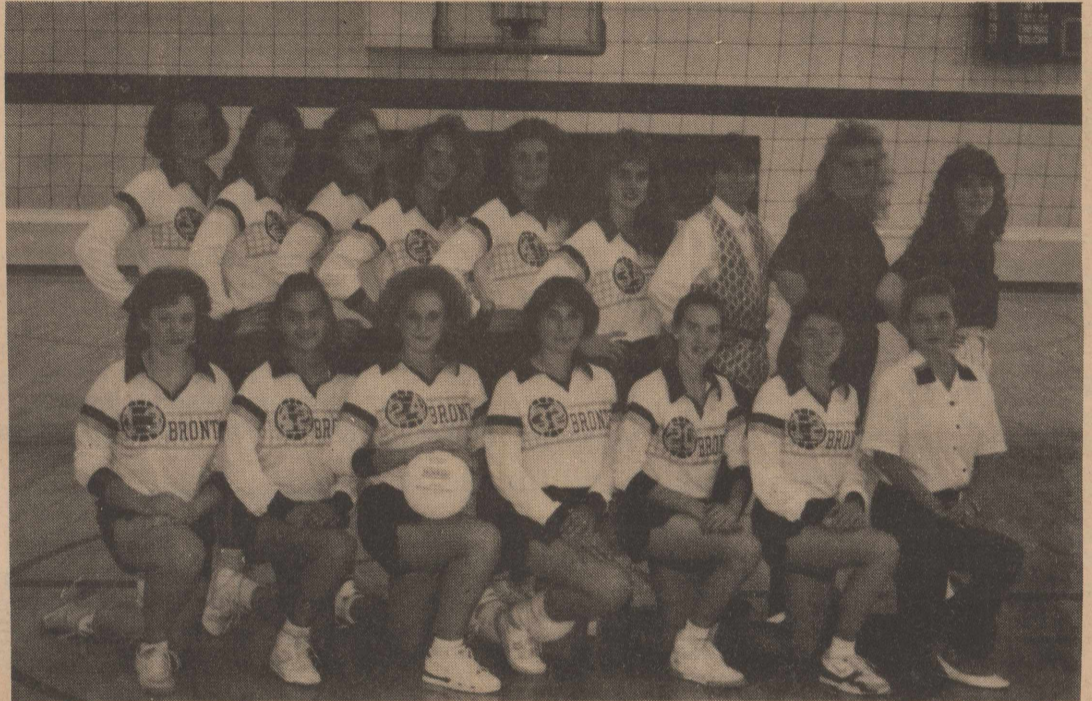

Coke Comment

It seems pretty ironic to me that the only times in the last year or so that I have written anything for the paper is to announce some type of increase.

I consider myself very conservative on most issues (especially those dealing with money). That's why it kind'a hurts to think that the only time I write anything, it has to do with another increase of some kind.

Last year, we supported the city garbage pickup issue, which was an increase of sorts for most folks. From all accounts, the city trash pickup has been implemented with a very minimum of complaints,

and the service has been well-received in both communities.

This time, I'm writing to try to solicit your support for the passage of a bond issue which will pay for seal coating all the paved roads in the county, which are not controlled by the state. Those which are under state jurisdiction are Hwys. 158, 277, 208, and maybe parts of some more that I can't think of off-hand.

With the exception of those state roads, every other paved surface in Coke County would receive new seal coat. The last time this was done

was in 1979. It's been twelve years since they've been resurfaced, and as the commercial says, "well, that's too long!". I don't think there's anyone who drives in Coke County that can dispute the need for the resurfacing.

As to cost, you're right, it's gonna be expensive. The bond will be in the amount of \$970,000. What that means to you and me is that our tax rate, which is approximately .42/\$100 valuation, will increase .07 to a total of about .49/\$100 valuation for the next ten years. At that time, we'll have it paid off, and probably be pretty close to needing to do it again.

I've lived in small communities all my life, some of which didn't have any paved roads other than those maintained by the state. We have an investment in these surfaces that I feel we need to maintain. The commissioners' court, as well as both city councils, are very much in support of this bond issue. That's not why I am in favor of it. After examining the figures, the .07 tax increase, and the approximate 7 1/2% anticipated bond interest rate, the figures look like they're as good as we're gonna get.

The bond election has been set for November 27th. If you have any questions, please submit them by our deadline for next week's is-

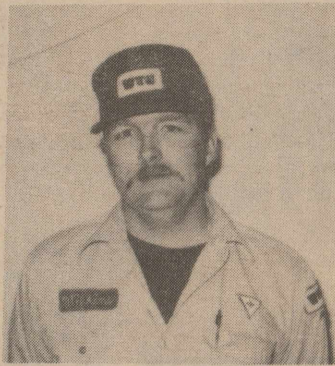

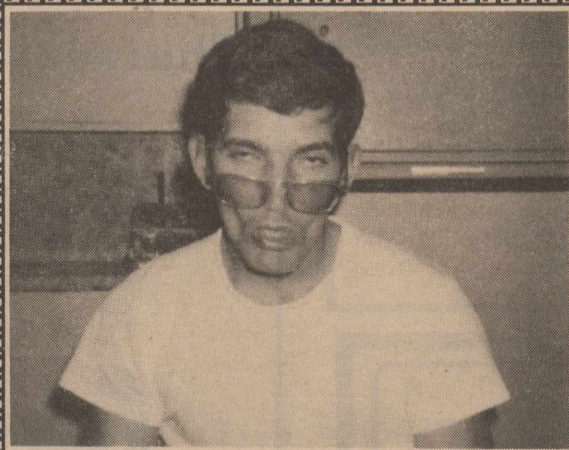

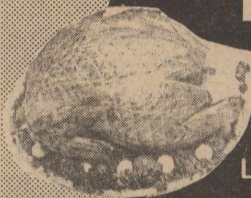

Horns win back county football title

The Bronte Longhorns travelled to Robert Lee this past week for the Coke County Championship. The Horns played flawless football to earn the victory. Those of you who were there, could feel the determination and charisma the Longhorns had as the offense scored five touchdowns and the defense held the Steers scoreless. As we all know, you need to have coaches who can reach and teach the athletes effectively and you have to have the players to execute what they have been taught. BHS is the BEST!

This week's captains were Brian Hall, Jamie Flores, Larry Franklin, and Randy Bilbrey. Again, the offensive line provided the blocking to allow Brandon Marshall to gain over 100+ yards in his 9th consecutive game.

The Longhorns won the toss and elected to receive. It took eleven plays to score their first touchdown on a well-executed sweep to the left side with Marshall on a 9 yard run. Darrell Lucas kicked the PAT. The Horns kicked to Robert Lee and held them to only four downs on good defense by Bill Windham, Jason Pierce, and Justin Phillips.

The Horns started from their own 48 yard line and pushed the ground game to score on a 2 yard Marshall touchdown

in seven plays on their second possession. The PAT failed with 1:46 remaining in the first quarter.

On the Longhorns' fourth possession, it took seven plays before Quarterback Phillips passed to Lucas for a 39 yard touchdown pass. Phillips ran for the extra 2 points. 4:55 remained in the half.

On the sixth defensive play, Billy Magness intercepted to give the Horns the ball on their own 41 yard line with 1:26 remaining in the half. Robert Lee intercepted to end the drive and run the half out.

The Longhorns kicked to Robert Lee to start the second half. The Horns' defense held them to seven plays for minus 3 yards on good defensive stops from Tim Sims and Pierce. With 3:18 gone in the fourth, Marshall broke for a 41 yard touchdown run. The PAT failed. The score stood at Robert Lee 0 - Bronte 27.

On the next defensive series, Sean Conway made a couple of tackles and Pierce recovered a fumble on the Horn 37 yard line. The front line of the Horns' offensive unit consisting of Conway, Rudy Sanchez, Magness, Pierce, and Sims provided the blocking for Windham to score on a 2 yard run on 9 plays to end the third quarter. The PAT kick was good. Robert Lee 0 - Bronte 34.

On the next series, Robert Lee moved the ball down to the 1 yard line. Sims came up with a big fourth down tackle on the one to help the defense hold the Steers out of the endzone with 7:51 left in the game.

On the last offensive series, Jacob Golson had three carries for 31 yards.

This week's game is at the Bronte field against a large Roby team at 7:30 pm. The Horns have a 7-2 season record this year. Come out

Absentee voting shall be conducted at the County Clerk's Office in the Courthouse, Robert Lee, Texas, in accordance with the provisions of V. T. C. A., Election Code.

For purposes of processing absentee voting results, the following persons are appointed to the Absentee Ballot Board for this election: Kenneth Lackey, Presiding Judge, and Noel Percifull, Jerry M. Parker and Minnie Waldrop, Clerks.

SECTION 4: All resident qualified electors of the County shall be permitted to vote at said election, and on the day of the election, such electors shall vote at the polling place designated for the County Election Precinct in which they reside. This election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the V. T. C. A., Election Code and Chapter 1 of Title 22, V. A. T. C. S., and as may be required by law, all election materials and proceedings shall be printed in both English and Spanish.

SECTION 5: A substantial copy of this order shall serve as proper notice of said election. Said notice, including a Spanish translation thereof, shall be (i) posted not later than the twenty-first (21st) day before the day of the election on the bulletin board used for posting notices of the meetings of the Court and (ii) published at least one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the County and the publication of said notice of election shall occur in said newspaper not earlier than thirty (30) days and not later than ten (10) days before the day of the election.
