The public is encouraged to participate, whether or not you are planning to be involved in the EMS. Knowledge gained in these classes could save the life of a loved one or neighbor.




C'house Closings

Rate increase revealed

Back in 1985, which was not too long after I arrived in Coke County, annual subscriptions to the Observer/Enterprise were selling for \$8 per year incounty, and it was costing about \$50 per week to mail all the papers. As of January 1, 1991, the cost of mailing the papers each week will exceed \$100, and the cost of a subscription at the current level is

As one can readily see, the cost of subscriptions has not come close to keeping up with cost of mailing, which has doubled in five years. In order to offset some of this in-

by O/E Publisher crease, the cost of in-county subscriptions on January 1, 1991 will be increased to \$12 per year, with out-of-county (in state) subscriptions to be raised to \$13, and out-of-state subscriptions at \$15.

The new subscription rate will remain one of the best bargains around at approximately 24 cents per issue, nearly \$5 per year cheaper than the over-the-counter single copy price of 35 cents.

At the same time, some advertisers will see a small increase in display and classified rates, in accordance with increases in costs of composition and printing.





COUNTRY AGENTS

A majority of meat goat producers in Texas have invested in goats for brush management purposes.

The hardy, versatile animals have demonstrated their prowess in brush management many times. Yet the effectiveness of goats in this biological management/control effort depends on a number of factors.

Their effectiveness in brush management depends on plant size and specie composition, the goat stocking rates and the frequency of goat browsing opportunities. A producer needs to match the intensity of browsing with the intensity of the problem.

In addition, a producer should use six guidelines to determine the frequency of defoliation, timing, stocking rates and grazing pressure. These include the species of brush present, height of the brush, its density, the degree of brush control or management desired, abundance of other forage species present and the physiological requirements of brush.

The degree of brush control desired is a fundamental consideration of a producer. High stocking rates, frequency of brush defoliation and timing are other major factors in the degree of brush control desired.

Use of goats in combination with other brush management treatments can increase the effectiveness of the treatment, extend the life of the measure and increase net re-

Research has shown that goats can be an excellent follow-up to such brush control measures as mechanical and chemical treatments or fire brush management.



The Spanish-type meat goats tend to select browse over other dietary components. They will, however, graze on a wide variety of plant species in other vegetation classes.

The Spanish-type meat goat has the potential to diversify agricultural enterprises. Not only will they use browse on brush that would not generally be consumed, they also can extend the length and benefits of other brush management techniques.

Brush suppression and use by goats is best realized as a maintenance technique following initial brush management practices.

warmest, most efficient fire possible.

· Reduce heated air loss -Lower the thermostat setting on your central heating system to 50° or 55° F when the fireplace is in use. By doing this, the furnace will not use as much fuel while the fireplace is in use.

 Provide a fresh air source -Close all doors and warm-air supply ducts into the room where the fireplace is located, but open a window near the fireplace about 1/2 to 1 inch high. This will allow combustion air to be drawn from the partially open window instead of from the rest of the house.

· Adjust the damper as the fire burns - Dampers help control the combustion process in wood by limiting the amount of air to the fire. To facilitate the burning process, the damper should be fully open at the start of the fire, and about half open after the fire is burning well. When a fire is not burning, the damper should be closed so heated air will not be lost up the chimney.

· Build the fire directly on the firebox floor - Building the fire directly on the firebox floor prevents excess air from burning the fire too quickly. Grates allow continued air circulation underneath the fire, which cools the fire temperature and makes the fire burn quickly. Other devices, such as air circulating grates, usually do not increase efficiency because they also decrease combustion temperatures.

Although fireplaces are not efficient heating sources, their aesthetic appeal keeps their popularity high. For more information on efficient use of fireplaces, call the Texas Energy Hotline at 1-800-643-SAVE. Ask for your free copy of the Texas Energy Extension Service factsheet "Fireplaces."

Holiday fire prevention tips listed

Christmas is supposed to be a time of fun, but it can also be a time when your family is exposed to hazards related to fire. The largest number of fires and fire-related deaths generally occur in the cold months, according to figures from the Texas Fire Reporting System, which includes statistics from 330 fire departments. In January 1989, 8,691 fires and 21 deaths were reported statewide. In December of the same year, there were 13,594 fires and 49 deaths. This compared with June 1989, when 6,232 fires and 9 deaths occured. Blame for the increased incidence of fire-related death and loss of property is most often traced to space heaters, children and Christmas deco-

There are a number of precautions to take if space heaters must be used in heating a home. Be sure to keep them away from walls and curtains and out of hightraffic areas. Leave 36 inches of open space in all directions

around space heaters if at all possible. Also, fire is a natural fascination for small children. They like to stick paper and anything they can get their hands on inside the heater. Keep matches, lighters, and other hazardous materials out of reach -- when parents are busy and visitors are in the house, it is easy for children to start fires.

The following are safety tips for avoiding problems with Christmas decorations:

· Christmas trees: Choose a fresh tree. Trim its trunk at an angle, then put it in a non-tip stand. Keep it watered constantly and away from heat. Artificial trees should be labeled as fire-retardant. Use only lights that are marked for

inside use.

· Candles: Keep candles away from curtains or other combustible materials. Never put them in windows or near exits if they are to be lit.

· Lights: Lights and other decorations using electricity should be checked not only before use, but periodically as they are used for damage. This is especially true of outdoor lights. Indoor lights on trees should never be left on all night or when no one is

Finally, have a working smoke detector. Fire is not the cause of fatalities in the majority of cases -- it is smoke. Smoke detectors make perfect Christmas gifts for loved

Potpourri - nice touch for the holidays

potpourri come before you drop the first leaf into a bowl or add one drop of oil, according to some who have mastered

Pick the flowers you plan to use at the peak of their bloom, said Nikki Bond, a Memphis gardener and craftsmaker. Pluck roses, for example, when they are buds or just as they're opening because

The secrets of making great overblown flowers will never match the color of fresh ones.

Josie Sides, a past president of the Memphis Herb Society, feels the most important step is drying the ingredients. It must take place in a cool, dark, ventilated place because heat and light will cause colors to fade.

Be daring with your potpourri, she adds, and take your ingredients where you

find them -- even if it's in the back of your refrigerator.

Once she was struck by the beauty of a cantaloupe rind. She cut it in strips, dried it and found that it twisted into pretty corkscrews. The smell of the dried rind was heavenly -fruity and very sweet, she said.

Potpourri may be made of flowers, leaves, herbs, fruits, berries, and cones, but purists shun the wood chips, dyed and doused with oil, used in many commercial products.

"That is filler," said Mrs. Sides. "You can buy a trash bag worth of wood chips for about \$3."

Roses, of course, are some of the most popular flowers for potpourri. Among the most fragrant are Sutters Gold, Don Juan, Chrysler Imperial, and Crimson Glory.

More than 50 varieties of scented geraniums, grown for their perfumed leaves, duplicate the scent of rose, lemon, apple, orange, pine and mint. Lavender is both fragrant and decorative.

Some popular garden herbs for potpourri are basil, lemon verbena, thyme, marjoram and rosemary.

"I use about anything that has a scent I like," said Mrs. Sides, who mines her garden and the country homes of her friends, or trades ingredients with friends.

That includes flowers from her garden such as peonies, zinnias, marigolds, forsythia, sunflowers, daisies, day lillies, and irises, and blossoms from shrubs such as bridal wreath, star magnolia, pearl bush, mock orange, and chaste tree (vitex). (Use the petals, or the whole flower if it is small.)

She uses berries from nandinas, the elderberry bush, beauty bush, and hollies, as well as hemlock cones and pine cones.

Ingredients may be dried several ways. Ms. Sides takes the cardboard trays used to hold six packs of canned soft drinks, simply drops the flowers in, and lets them dry in a bedroom.

Before doing this, she says, you should soak the ingredients in a sink filled with cold, salty water for 15 minutes to kill any bugs that may be on them. Drain them, pat with a paper towel. Line the cardboard trays with newspaper during the first day of drying to catch the extra moisture. Then remove the paper.

Mrs. Bond dries some flowers by poking them through a screen nailed to a wooden frame and placing them in her ventilated pantry. With others, she strips the leaves, binds them with a rubber band and hangs them.

Taking stress out of the holidays

We have incorporated the expression "holiday blues" into our language in order to refer to a feeling, tone or mood that some people experience around Thanksgiving and especially Christmas. The holiday season can be stressful and less than jolly for many people but it need not be. The Scott & White Department of Psychiatry offers several suggestions to help people make the most of the holidays.

First of all, we should think about what aspect the holidays is important to us. Is it getting together with family members, exchanging gifts or spiritual experiences and contemplation? A person who values spiritual reflection may want to turn down a few social engagements in order to leave time for their first priority, while a person who values holiday get-togethers with family and friends may want to make sure that these activities are scheduled during the holidays. We may find that our priorities change from year to year or that life has rearranged them for us because, for example, of the loss of a loved one.

Handling a recent loss whether due to death, divorce or break-up can make holidays especially difficult, but they can be dealt with by remembering the loved one in some special way, such as giving a donation to a favorite charity in the person's name, or by scheduling time with other family members or friends.

HOLIDAY STRESS Holidays can be especially stressful. They often include extra work, such as gift buying, shopping, cooking, decorating, baking, wrapping, and card sending, in addition to one's usual job and/or household duties. Practicing sound management skills in the home, such as delegating tasks to other family members and allowing adequate time, as well as eating wisely and scheduling time for exercise during the holidays can help us feel more relaxed and in control of things that we want to do during this busy season.

Again, we may need to set priorities according to what we value and want to do. We can assign food to be brought by other family members instead of doing it all ourselves. We can have bakery cookies or share the task with children



instead of having them all "homemade" by mom. Cards can be printed instead of signed. Our gift or card list may need to be pared down. Most families and friends would settle for a less than picture perfect holiday in order to have everyone relaxed.

Holidays can also mean stress which results from negative encounters with "difficult" relatives or friends. Staying in the present (not reviving old rivalries or hurts) and remembering that we can only be responsible for our own thoughts and behavior, not that of others, can help

make interactions with others smoother. It also helps to remember that the holiday time, when expectations and emotions may be at peak levels, last only a short time and that a peaceful holiday season can be a reality.

Finding out what aspect of the holiday season we value most, setting priorities, using good time management skills, practicing "diplomacy" in difficult relationships and continuing wise health practices are all ways to ensure that our holidays are more peaceful and relaxing.





"Dear Editor: I am 8 years old. Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus. Papa says, "If you see it in The Sun it's so." Please tell me the truth, is there a Santa Claus?

Virginia Hanlon 115 West 95th Street" "Virginia.

Your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except what they see. They think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours, man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world around him, as measured by the intelligence capable of

grasping the whole of truth

and knowledge.

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. There would no childlike faith then, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and sight. The eternal light with

Tale of Christmas rose

The tale of the Christmas rose is said to have begun in Sweden, where Christmas Eve the trees suddenly sprouted leaves, fruits and flowers appeared, and birds sang. Bells sounded and the heavens were filled with "Gloria in Excelsis Deo."

One abbot brought a doubting monk to see the "Magic Garden." Even after seeing for himself the miraculous appearance of all this bounty in the middle of winter, the monk was convinced that it was the work of the devil. His doubt caused the garden to disappear, save for one plant - the Christmas rose, which reportedly continues to appear every Christmas Eve.

Then there is the Glastonbury thorn. According to legend, Jesus was once protected from arrest by Roman soldiers when magpies covered him with the fruit of the hawthorn while he rested in a woods. Once the soldiers had passed by, the magpies removed the fruit.

To honor the hawthorn, Joseph of Arimathaea chose a thorn staff for his journeys. When he reached England,

he stopped at Glastonbury and thrust his staff into the soil. There it flourished and produced flowers every Christmas eve.

In 1900, the Right Reverend Henry Gates Satterlee received a cutting from that original hawthorn, and planted it near Saint Albans School in Washington, D. C. The cutting grew and flowered for the first time on Christmas of 1918; it is said to have blossomed every Christmas Eve

Holly is, of course, a traditional plant. The Crown of Thorns was supposed to have been woven from holly, and the yellow berries it produced were turned red by the blood of Jesus.
