"Save the Theatre" meeting set for Bronte

A Bronte landmark, the Texas Theatre, has been placed for sale on the real estate market.

As one of the remaining landmark buildings left in Bronte, the Theatre has special significance for local residents, and its loss would be irreplaceable.

A town meeting has been

called for Monday, January 28, at 7 pm in the Bronte School Cafeteria. All local citizens are urged to attend this meeting to explore ideas to keep the Theatre a part of the community.

Ed Allcorn, Regional Director of the National Historic Theatre Association will present his recommendations for uses and funding of the building. After a brief discussion, the meeting will adjourn to tour the Theatre.

The effort is being sponsored by the Bronte Chamber of Commerce, whose directors encourage each and every area resident to come and explore efforts to "Save the Theatre."

Stock Show features strong competition

As is the norm for the Coke County Junior Livestock Show, strong competition in all classes highlighted last weekend's show. Although total animal numbers were down slightly, Coke County Extension Agent Tommy Antilley said that more exhibitors participated than normally do. Quality animals were abundant and Antilley expects that county youths will do well in upcoming larger shows, especially in sheep classes.

Increased interest in goats over the past few years had led to new classes in area livestock shows, known as meat goats. Antilley spoke favorably of the goat classes, saying he believes the new categories afford a wider range of exhibitors who might not otherwise participate. He also declared that worries about premium sales being off were unfounded and the sale went well.




Mike Pentecost of Mrs. Mauldin's Robert Lee 6th grade was the district runnerup and the recipient of a \$50 U. S. savings bond.






Eboni Taylor and Amie Parker led the team in rebounds with 10 and 7, while Teresa Vaughn led the team with 9 assists and 5 steals.

The Bronte Longhorns have moved back into the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches poll in the latest rankings.


The Longhorns have a 16-3 season record. After their win over Robert Lee last Thursday, their district record stands at a spotless 4-0.




