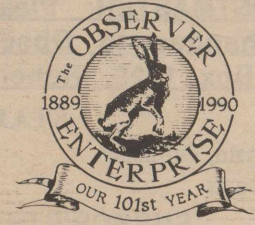

## Horns are state basketball runners-up!

The Bronte Longhorns were named the Class A State Runners-Up last Saturday in Austin after losing a hard game to Moulton, 53-44, in the Championship Finals.

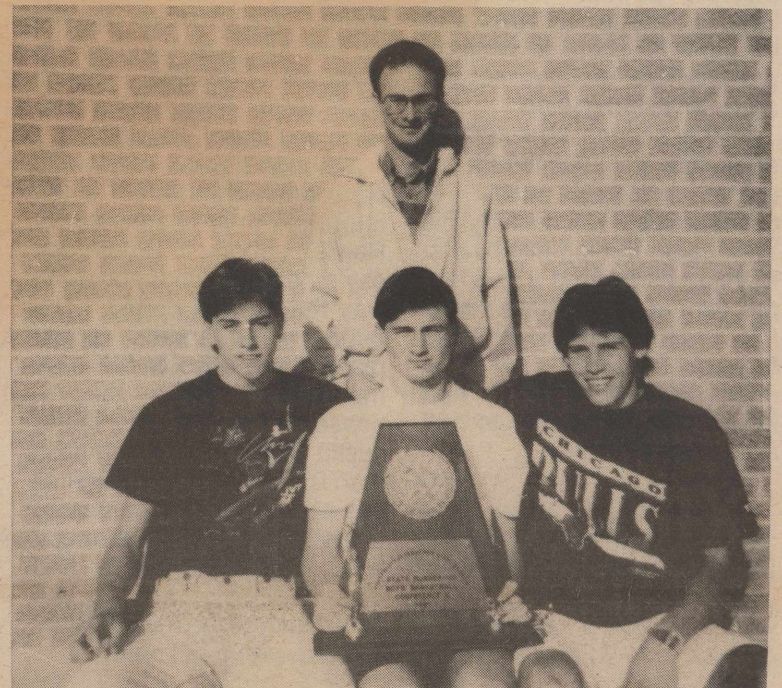
Their first game in Austin was the State Semi-Final Thursday morning, March 7,

against Paducah, the team they lost to in the 1987 State Championship Final. This time, however, the Longhorns started on top and never looked back. The final score of the game was Bronte 72 - Paducah 65. In true winning form, five Longhorns

scored in double figures. Justin Phillips led in scoring and rebounds with 19 points, 11 rebounds, and 8 assists. He was followed by Sean Conway with 13 points and 8 rebounds, Brandon Marshall with 16 points and 4 rebounds, Bill Windham with 11 points, 5 rebounds, and 5 assists, and Jason Pierce with 11 points and 5 rebounds. Also scoring in the Semi-Final was Darrell Lucas with 2 points.

The win against Paducah entitled them to a spot in the Championship Final on Saturday morning against a team that had played in the State Final for the past two years and lost each time. This was Moulton's third year in a row to come to the State Tournament and make it to the Finals and they came ready to play. The officials let the teams play aggressive ball which seemed to put Bronte at a disadvan-

## Lions plan fundraiser

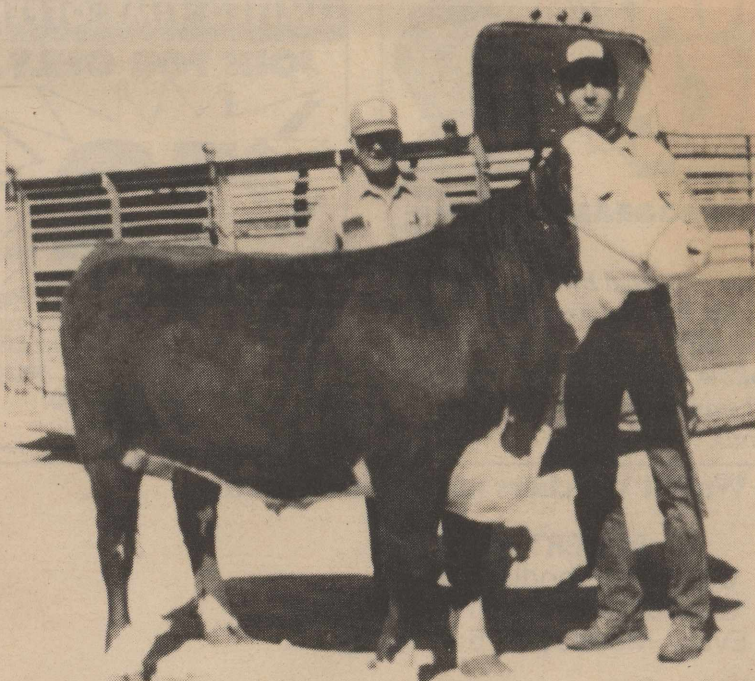

tage as they relied more on finesse than force.

In the first half, Moulton jumped out to a 13 point lead before Bronte put in any answering points. However, Bronte made a run and brought the score to within a point before Moulton surged again to a strong lead.

In the second half, Bronte again had a chance to turn the game around after 3 consecutive 3-pointers by Bill Windham. Behind two points, Moulton committed a foul that put Bronte on the free throw line with the possibility of tying the game. It was just not to be as the ball went astray and Moulton again started to pull away from the Horns.

Scoring in the Final were Sean Conway with 12 points, Bill Windham with 11 points and 6 assists, Justin Phillips with 9 points, 7 rebounds, 5 assists, and 3 steals, Jason

Pierce with 8 points, and Brandon Marshall and Darrell Lucas with 2 points apiece.

The Longhorns finished their season with an impressive 29-5 record. Ironically, Bronte placed more players on the All-State Tournament team than Moulton. These were Justin Phillips, Bill Windham, and Sean Conway.

Although a State Title would have been wonderful for the team and their coach, Rocky Rawls, nobody in Bronte can say a negative word about the way the season ended. The team played against bigger players and schools and won many times. They faced illnesses in their leading scorer Justin Phillips and in the sixth man Darrell Lucas. Against all this and more, they continued to show pride and determination. The Longhorns and Coach Rawls are to be commended for their efforts. "We are proud of you!!!"

**Robert Lee elections set**

A board of trustees election has been called for the Robert Lee Independent School District and set for May 4, 1991. The elected terms of three trustees will conclude; the seats of Edwin (Butch) Davis, Gaylon Pitcock, and Jim Clendennen will be up for grabs. Trustees who will remain on the panel are Ray Aldridge, Bill Burns, Mary Grim, and Darrel Pitcock.

Applications for those wishing to be a candidate can be filed at the Superintendent's Office Monday through Friday, 8 am until 4 pm, from February 18, 1991 until March 20, 1991. Anyone wanting to run as a write-in candidate must file an application with the school also. The deadline for filing this application is April 4, 1991.

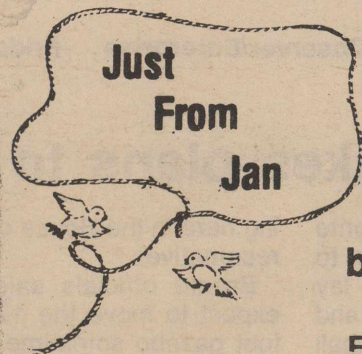

Adding a little chocolate may be the ticket for getting children to drink milk, one of the best sources of bone-building calcium. Well-meaning parents who keep their kids from drinking chocolate-flavored milk may actually be keeping them from drinking milk altogether.

New York University researchers found that when offered whole milk, 1% milk or 1% chocolate-flavored milk, sixth grade students always choose more of the chocolate milk. One cup of milk contributes almost 1/4 the recommended dietary allowances of calcium for school age children and adolescents. This concern for calcium intake is important.

Osteoporosis has become a well-recognized word to most people. It is a disease caused in part by the lack of adequate calcium to strengthen the bones. During their developmental years children need lots of calcium during the critical developmental period can cause the bones to be less dense, more fragile, and more susceptible to breaks and fractures. This brittle bone disease is called osteoporosis.

Dairy products are the primary source of dietary calcium. By consuming four servings of milk daily children can be assured they are getting the calcium they need to build strong bones for a healthy future.

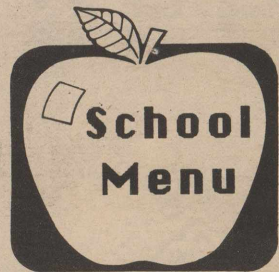
A common misconception about milk is that if it is flavored, chocolate for instance, it is less nutritious than unflavored milk. Not true. The nutrient content of chocolate-flavored milk is similar to that of unflavored milk, with the exception of higher carbohydrates and calories. These extra calories in chocolate milk are easily burned off by children who are active. Also, available is lowfat chocolate milk, which has all the nutrients of unflavored milk.

Research shows that by offering children chocolate milk they are more likely to choose and drink the flavored milk there by getting the valuable nutrients milk provides, including calcium. Research has also shown that the availability of chocolate milk does not affect the amount of food kids eat, and, when chocolate milk is available, the percentages of students selecting some form of milk is increased.

Milk, both flavored and unflavored, provides significant amounts of several nutrients including protein, fat, carbohydrates and several vitamins and minerals. And the addition of chocolate to milk may be the ticket for getting finicky children to drink milk.

### State Board approves UIL rule changes

The State Board of Education on February 16 in Austin approved the following University Interscholastic League rule changes involving athletics.

UIL rule changes are:

1. Require coaches to notify opposing schools when there is a known possible conflict of interest with an assigned sports official.

2. Require that a coach ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct, or a football coach who receives three unsportsmanlike penalties in one game, be given a public reprimand and placed on probation for one calendar year.

3. Allow seniors to try out at a neutral site and be observed by representatives from more than one college at a time.

4. Remove the restriction, except in football contact activities from practicing with or against college athletes at a

college tryout.

5. Permit seniors to take financed recruiting trips for swimming before January 1.

6. Prohibit more than one year's participation in UIL athletic activities by a foreign exchange student.

7. Evaluate and approve live telecasts of the 5A championship football and Big School football championship games.

8. Recommend appointing PGA professionals as regional

golf tournament directors.

9. Recommend using neutral announcers at contests.

10. Adopt National Federation swimming rule changes and add the 200-yard meter freestyle relay to swimming events.

11. Allow the education commissioner to appoint members to the UIL State Executive Committee without representation from each UIL region.

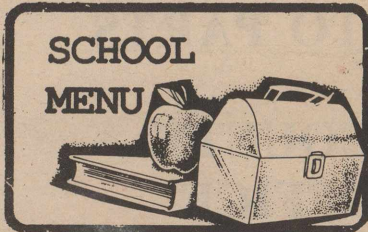

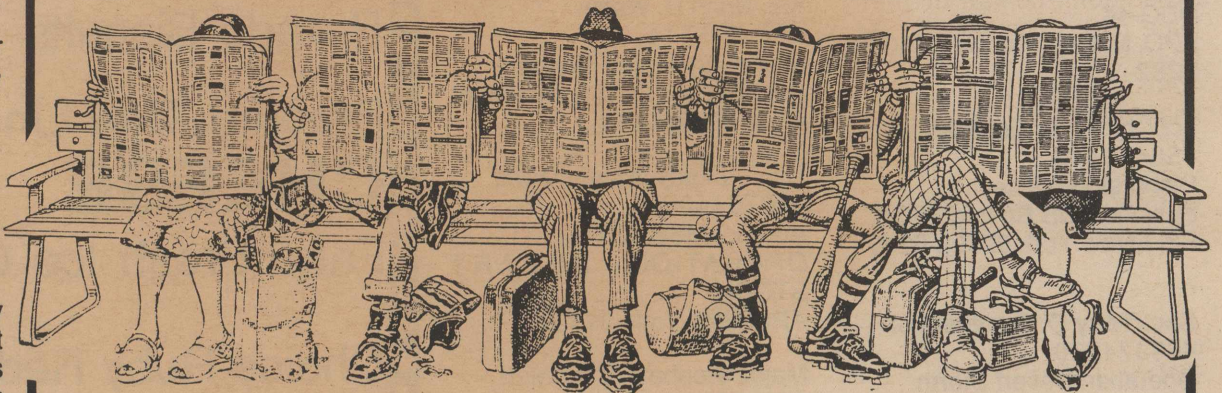

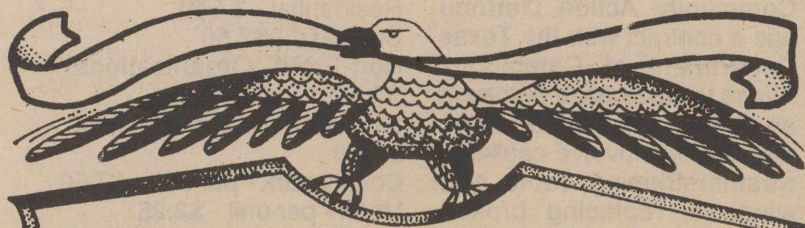
