Rainfall totals reported

The Bronte area experienced various kinds of weather this past Sunday night and Monday night.

On Sunday night, damaging winds tore the roof off a portion of Mr. and Mrs. Ron Thorn's mobile home north of town. No one was injured.

Also, Paul Sublett, WTU Manager, reported a tornado on the Humlong Ranch south of town that damaged seven 55' transmission poles with electricity lines. The poles held feeder lines for Bronte's electric power. The city had no power for about 35 minutes until some repairs were made.

The tornado hit about 1/2 mile south of the Jerry Landers home and only 1/5 of an inch of rain fell.

The Bronte WTU crew and crews from San Angelo worked that night and until 3 pm Monday repairing the damage.

Also in the vicinity, a large ladder attached to an oilfield tank battery was lifted and dropped ten feet from its stationary position.

Rainfall reports ranged from 1/2 inch in southwest parts of town to 1.8" south and up to 2.2" in northern Bronte.

Jerry T. Parker, north of town reported 3.4 inches with small hail lasting about 30 minutes.

Six miles east reports were 2 1/2 inches.

Monday night, rainfall measured an average of 1.6 to 2 inches in Bronte.

Tennyson reported 1 to 2 inches around.

Average total rainfall for the two nights in Bronte ranged from 3 1/2 to 4 inches.

Robert Lee didn't receive as much rainfall as the east side of the county, but on the other hand, no damage has been reported. West Coke County generally measured from 1 1/2 to 3 1/2 inches with the Paint Creek area falling short in the 2-day totals. Small, soft hail fell during both thunderstorms along with high winds but apparently neither resulted in serious damage.



Coke to remain in 66th

Representative Robert Junell (D-San Angelo) announced that Coke County will remain in the 66th District under the plan released Friday by the House Redistricting Committee. The plan leaves Coke, Mitchell, Sterling and Tom Green counties in the district and adds Irion and Reagan counties to the dis-

Junell stated "I am very pleased with the new district. My main concern was keeping my present district intact, which this plan does. I am also glad to be getting Reagan and Irion counties, two West Texas counties that fit with my current districts needs.'

This plan will now be debated in the House Redistricting Committee. If it passes the committee, it would go before the full House for a vote.

The plan currently being discussed in the Senate on State Senatorial Districts will change Coke County. Coke and Mitchell counties would move into the 24th Senatorial District which is represented by Senator Temple Dickson of Sweetwater. This plan will be discussed before the full Senate during the week of May 13th.

Both houses must agree on a plan by May 27th, the last day of session, or a plan will be devised by a committee comprised of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, Land Commissioner and Comptroller.
