Election filings listed

A number of politicians and would-be politicians have only a short time left to file for various state and county seats in Texas. The official filing period is December 3, 1991, to January 2, 1992, to enter their names on the March 10, 1992, Primary Election ballot, said Ettie Hubbard, Coke County clerk. Actual filing must be done through county party chairmen.

Of local interest is the filing for re-election of United Representative States Charles Stenholm, State Senator Bill Sims and State Representative Robert Junell.

Coke County terms which will end December 31, 1992, are the county sheriff; the 10.

county attorney; county tax assessor/collector; county commissioners, Precinct 1 and 3; and county constable positions, 1 and 2.

Sheriff Marshall Millican has announced his candidacy for re-election to that office and Commissioner Paul Burns has also filed his bid to be elected to his first full term since he was elected for a 2 year period before.

The death of Coke County Constable Bob Fields of Precinct 1 on December 13 leaves that position open and two candidates filed this week for a place on the ballot. David Rawlings and Kenneth Rasco have entered campaigns for the Democratic Primary March

Albert N. "Bob" Fields, a lifelong resident of Coke County, died Friday, December 13, 1991, in Shannon Medical Center following complications of surgery December 10.

Services for Mr. Fields, 75, were held Saturday, December 14, in the Robert Lee Baptist Church followed by burial in the Robert Lee Cemetery, directed by Shaffer Funeral Home. The Rev. Roy Epperson of Robert Lee Baptist Church was the officiant, assisted by Greg Fleming, minister of Southside Church of Christ.

He was born November 10, 1916, near Edith, southwest of Robert Lee, to Hubert and Kellie Fields. He attended community schools. He was married to Dale Cowley Stephenson December 5, 1947, in Robert Lee.

A veteran of WWII, he was owner and operator of a butane business locally for 17 years. He was involved in ranching and was an avid horseman and horse trader, well known in the horse trading circles. He had also served two terms as Coke County Commissioner and was a Coke County Constable at the time of his death, serving eleven years.

He is survived by his wife, Dale Fields, of Robert Lee; two sons and daughters-inlaw, Albert Dale "Tooter" and Lois Fields of LaPorte and James Cowley and Peggy Fields of Abilene; three grandchildren, Kelly Jo and Casey Fields of Abilene and Brad Fields of LaPorte; one sister, Louella Davidson of Robert Lee; three brothers and sisters-in-law, Dick and Jewel Fields of Mertzon, Carlton and Maxine Fields of Robert Lee, and Hawley and Lora Fields of San Angelo; one sister-in-law, Zera Fields, of Robert Lee; numerous nieces and nephews; and a community full of valued friends. He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Alfred "Buster" Fields.

ASCS lists appointees

Jerry D. Harris, a cotton and grain sorghum producer in Dawson and Gaines counties, has been appointed to a seventh term as Chairman of the Texas State Committee of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, according to U. S. Senator Phil Gramm.

Secretary of Agriculture Ed Madigan named Mrs. Hope Huffman of McGregor to a third term on the Committee and reappointed veteran Texas State ASC Committee members Dale Hunt of Garwood and D. V. Guerra, Jr. of Edinburg. Joining the Committee for the first time will be Scott McGarraugh of Perryton.

U. S. Senator Phil Gramm stated, "These leaders bring a wealth of farming and ranching experience to ASCS. Jerry Harris has established an impressive record, combining years of experience as both a family farmer and a federal program administrator. Hope Huffman, Dale Hunt, and D. V. Guerra all have done splendid work on behalf of Texas farmers and ranchers."

Jerry D. Harris is a member of the National Cotton Council, the Lamesa Cotton Growers, the Texas Food and Fiber Protein Commission, and the Texas Cotton Ginners. He is active in cotton ginning, warehousing, and marketing, as well as operating a 7,000 acre family farm and serving

on the Board of Trustees of Lubbock Christian University.

Scott McGarraugh operates 11,000 acres spread over Ochiltree, Lipscomb, Hansford, Gray, and Roberts Counties in Texas, as well as Texas and Beaver counties in Oklahoma. He is active in the Texas Wheat Producers Association, the Texas Wheat Producers Board, and the Texas & Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association.

Hope Huffman raises row crops, grain, and cattle in McLennan and Coryell Counties. She is an active member in the McLennan County Farm Bureau and the Waco Chamber of Commerce's Agricultural Committee.

Dale Hunt is a recognized leader in the rice industry and has served as president of the Texas Rice Research Foundation.

D. V. Guerra is active in soil and water conservation. He served on the Governor's Task Force on Rural Development and was named "Man of the Year in Agriculture" by the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association.

The State ASC Committee oversees farm program activities of the ASCS throughout Texas. ASCS employs a staff of 1,400 in Texas and supervises the distribution of more than \$1.5 billion in federal farm program benefits to the farmers and ranchers of Texas


Longbotham, who plays several instruments and who has recorded several albums has appeared at singles conferences, on cruise ships, at state fairs, churches and youth gatherings.



Hand-crafted gift items detailed

For some of you, making your own gifts and decorations is the most satisfying part of celebrating the holidays.

Even things made from standard patterns and instructions take on unique characteristics with your choice of materials and details. "There's just something inherently special about an item made by one's own hands," says Pamela Hastings, director of consumer education for Singer Sewing Company.

Some possible projects:

• There's a Father Christmas figure pattern you could sew using scraps taken from old clothing or other sources. This McCall's pattern (5580) includes the 21-inch figure and four variations of hooded coats and gowns. Patchwork velvet, tapestry, or brocade with faux fur trim are some of the different ways to interpret the pattern, which includes a gift sack to fill with miniature candies and toys.

 McCall's also has a quick decorating package (5512) that includes a stuffed Santa star, three-dimensional tree, and a country heart wreath. Another pattern (5511) includes country Christmas decorations and mop-cap dolls done up in calico patchwork; ornaments include a cinnamon stick holder, fabric ball, heart applique square and miniature stocking on a hanger.

 Or you could deliver a gift in a personalized gift bag made of fabric with holiday greetings stitched in machine block letters or decorative stitches -- a suggestion from Singer. This can be reused as a tote or lingerie bag later, depending on


Instructions: Cut a rectangle or square of fabric to desired size. Stitch on greeting first, when the piece is flat and easy to work with. Then fold in half lengthwise, right sides together, and serge or stitch two open sides. Turn bag right-side out, then fold raw edge 1/2 inch around opening and press. Turn under another 2 inches, press and stitch along lower edge, leaving an opening for a drawstring of satin or velvet ribbon. Make Victorian-style lace potpourri ornaments, another Singer suggestion. Instructions: Cut an 8 inch square of lace and finish edges either with a narrow zigzag stitch or rolled hem, using a decorative thread. Place potpourri in the center, then draw up knapsack-style, using velvet or satin ribbon. Hang on the tree with ornament hook.

 If you're not a seamstress, try glue. A suggestion from Loctite, which makes Creatively Yours craft glues, is to decorate a whole tree with teddy bears and ribbon, or make a wreath with bears, ribbons, and ornaments.

Instructions for the wreath, using a 14-inch pine wreath: Make a four-inch gold bow (four yards) and wire to bottom of wreath. Wire two 8-inch bears to either side of the wreath (assymetrically balanced), then loop three yards each of silver and gold ribbons (1 and 1 1/2 inches wide) around and through the pine, pinching and gluing every six to eight inches. Wind six yards of star garland around the other elements, wiring into place. Finish by gluing on six 2-inch holiday boxes, 12 1-inch gold Christmas balls, six 4-inch snowflakes, and six 4-inch poinsettia picks.

Scandinavian yuletide history detailed

When Scandinavians first saw pictures of Santa Claus more than a century ago, it didn't dawn on them that St. Nick might be a big, jolly old

Most assumed he was tiny, like their own gnome, the tomte, who seems to have been around since the Vinkings' pagan midwinter celebration. It was called Jul, which is now the word for Christmas.

Families often leave a bowl of rice pudding on their doorsteps Christmas Eve. Tradition has it that a tomte deprived of his expected Yuletide treat will punish the household.

Midwinter daylight is so scarce that modern Scandinavians, like the Vikings, look forward to a break in "the dark time," says Olav Boe, a Norwegian folklore expert.

"In essence, a modern Nordic Yule is the same as the Jul celebrated by the Vikings: A family event with food, beer and good companionship," says Boe, a professor emeritus of the University of Oslo.

Nordic countries abound in snow, reindeer, and evergreen trees, symbols the world associates with Christ-

Reindeer have long been a favorite wintertime feast dish among Lapp herders. But as Christmas trappings, the tiny deer, decorated trees, Santa and greeting cards are relative newcomers to Norway, Sweden, Finland, Denmark and

Some Nordic customs, like gift-giving, stem from the Vikings' Jul and have endured a millennium of Christianity.

The Vikings brewed a strong Jul beer to toast their god Odin. The brew, still called Jul beer, remains popular at Christmas, partly because the Catholic Church seeking converts 1,000 years ago - encouraged its use in toasting Jesus, Boe says.

Wheat sheaves - called Julenek - left outside for the birds at Christmas may be a leftover from the Viking custom of making Jul offerings to the gods, according to some history texts.

Norway's first German-inspired Christmas tree arrived around 1820. After townspeople carried it through Oslo, then called Christiania, they weren't sure what to do with it. So they set it on fire, says Boe.

Christmas dinner, served December 24 before families open presents, is based on strong regional traditions, some from Viking times. Outside Lapland, favorites include lamb, ham, and fish, including lutefisk - cod turned gelatinous with lye.

Santa Claus figures often share tables with traditional Candles, decorations: wreaths, and the tomte.

"St. Nick is the one you see in the street, but you still see more (decorations) of the old Christmas gnome," Boe says.

The traditional tomte, in rough work clothes, a red hat

and demanding Christmas gifts, has little in common with the amiable white-bearded man who hands out presents to children, says Agneta Lilja, a folklore researcher at Sweden's Uppsala University.

The tomte supposedly has an old man's face, a child's body, and watches over the farm.

When Scandinavians claim to see tomte, it is usually at dawn or dusk. "They say they see him pottering around in the stable, or just moving about in buildings," says Lilja.

Santa came to be accepted as a strange tomte.


But until the early 20th century, most Lapp herders preferred their ancient winter beliefs, often involving witches and supernatural reindeer.

Lapps now embrace Santa. The old fellow attracts around 400,000 tourists a year to Rovaniemi, the capital of Finnish Lapland, where he

and his reindeer are on duty year-round.

All the countries get letters to Santa, but most - about 500,000 a year - are mailed to Finland.

Edison presents lights mass-manufacturing miniature It all began in 1882.

The first electrically lit Christmas tree was unveiled in the New York City home of a colleague of Thomas Alva Edison.

It featured 80 hand-wired and hand-blown colored bulbs in red, white, and blue. Turning slowing on a pedestal, the tree created a 'superb exhibition" of "starry fruit" as reported by a Detroit newspaper.

Out, out brief candle

The first electrically lit trees cost the equivalent of thousands of dollars today, but the public quickly realized the benefits of electric light.

bulbs and, by 1901, they were advertising that "the danger ever present with candle-lit trees is entirely removed, as well as the inconvenience of grease, smoke and dirt."

Hired help

Turn-of-the-century "wiremen" or electricians would handwire each bulb together in a time-consuming process, then wire the contraption into an overhead light fixture to provide electricity.

It wasn't until 1903 that readymade strings of wiring were sold alongside packages





5. The proposed weather modification operation is to be carried out in both an "operational area" and a "target area" to cause the intended effects to occur only in the target area. The operational area is that area de-






Santa got his familiar beard, red suit, eight tiny reindeer and jolly appearance from a 19th century


