Landmark water tower comes down in RL

Biggest local news in Robert Lee this week has been the dismantling of the downtown city water tower. Actual work began Tuesday when the chain link fence was removed and city workers moved the historical marker nearby, and took down the warning siren.

Employees of Pittsburg Tank and Tower Company of Henderson, Kentucky began cutting on the tank after lunch Tuesday. An old line company in business 73 years, they are very experienced as was witnessed about 4:45 when they dropped the tank only a few feet from the target area. Since the company was working in this region of the state, city officials said the company gave them a good price on the dismantling job.

According to information supplied by city secretary Edna Havins, records show bonds were sold in the 1930's for the water system, which probably included the tower storage.

It had been unused for municipal water for several years. Water from the sewer plant had been stored in it to water the golf course, but the tower

had begun to leak and the city felt repairs to the old storage were not feasible. It will not be replaced. The fire department siren will be relocated.

Mrs. Havins said the company agreed to leave the corner clean of debris since the salvage will belong to them and be hauled away.

Spring turkey opening slated

The spring season for Rio Grande turkeys will open in Coke County on Saturday, April 4. A valid Texas hunting license is required, plus the \$5.00 turkey stamp now required. If you did not turkey hunt in the fall and do not have the stamp attached to your license, you must have it now for the spring season. A hunter may take 2 gobblers (no hens with or without beards), depending on how many turkey tags were used in the fall season. Shooting hours are one-half before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. The spring season will remain open until May 3. Consult the current, free Texas Hunting Guide for further information.

Blood drive set for 4th

United Blood Services will conduct a blood drive in Bronte at the City Hall from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, Saturday, April 4, 1992. Many of you might be wondering, who needs blood or blood donors? "People do!" says Paula Kennemer, Community Relations Director of United Blood Services, San Angelo. "As many as 90 percent of all people who live to age 72 will need blood or blood products during their lives."

Blood is needed for many major surgeries, for patients being treated for leukemia or other cancers, or for a mother experiencing a difficult delivery.

While most of us will receive blood, only a few donate it. Approximately three percent of this area's population donates blood.

According to Kennemer, more people would donate if only they knew the importance of blood. Doctors need blood for only one reason: to sustain life. Without blood, the life of the patient would be endangered. Giving blood is one of the most importance acts of service you can ever do.

Some people believe they can wait until they know

someone needs blood before they donate. Years ago, this was true. Blood was collected only as it was needed, but it was often transfused before some very important tests could be run. United Blood Services collects blood every day so that it is available every day to meet patients' needs. Before your donation is usable for a patient, it must be fully tested, which takes more than six hours.

Kennemer thinks the main reason people don't donate blood is because no one has asked them. "Please, consider yourself asked," she says, extending a personal invitation to all Bronte residents to donate at the April 4 blood drive. The goal for the drive is 20 blood donations.

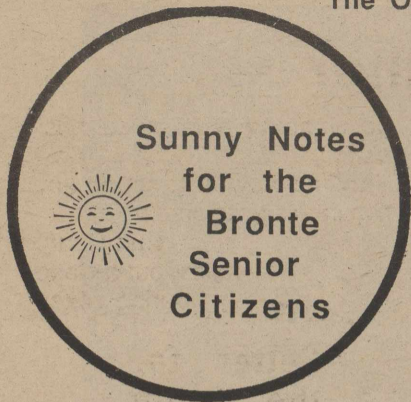

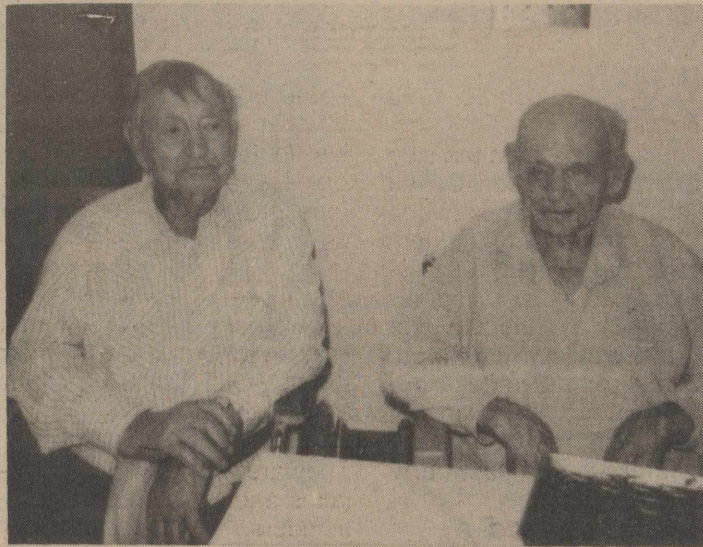

BRONTE SCHOOL NEWS

NAPT scheduled for April 6-10 at BISD

During the week of April 6-10, the new Norm-referenced Assessment Program for Texas (NAPT) will be administered to grades 3-11.

NAPT consists of new, secure forms of portions of the Riverside Student Assessment Program, which includes the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills, the Iowa Tests of Educational Development, and the Tests of Achievement and Proficiency. Students in grades K-12 will also be given the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills which is not required by the state.

The NAPT can be defined as "can be used to compare the achievement of Texas students with that of students across the nation. It measures a range of skills, from basic knowledge to the use of higher-order thinking skills."

In order for the students to be best prepared to take the test, plenty of rest each night before the test and a healthy breakfast should be top priority. All students need to be present all days during the week of April 6-10. If a student is absent, that portion of the test that was missed will require a make-up as soon as the student returns during the week of April 6.

The tests will cover Reading, Language, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science. There will be subtests in the Reading, Language, and Mathematics sections only. The format of the test will be multiple choice.

Scores from NAPT will be used to describe a student's relative achievement level when compared with that of his or her grade-level peers throughout the nation. In addition, the tests in the NAPT battery provide educators with additional information for monitoring student growth and identifying a student's relative strengths and weaknesses among subject areas.

Tests are aids to better instruction. As with other such aids, the usefulness of tests depends upon the extent to which the test results are interpreted with wisdom and caution. NAPT test results will be used to supplement, not to replace, teacher judgment. They will be used in conjunction with other information available to the teacher in making instructional decisions.

NAPT Test

All students in grades K-12 in the Bronte ISD will be taking the Norm Referenced Assessment Program Test for Texas on April 7, 8, and 9. It is very important that all students be present during these tests.

Tests will be given during the morning hours, and all doctor or dentist appointment need to be made for the afternoon on these days, if possible.

Pre-K Reg.

Prospective kindergarten students for the 1992-93 school year at Bronte Elementary will pre-register May 7. Students must be five years old on or before September 1, 1992. Students will need to bring their birth certificate, social security number, updated immunization records, and one dollar for lunch.

The day will start for these children at 8:30 am and end at 11:20 am. Please pass the word around to parents of eligible children.

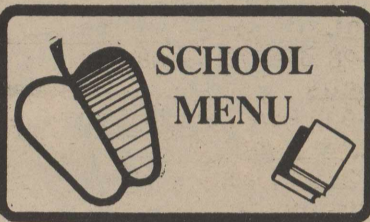
Ladies compete at ACU Classic

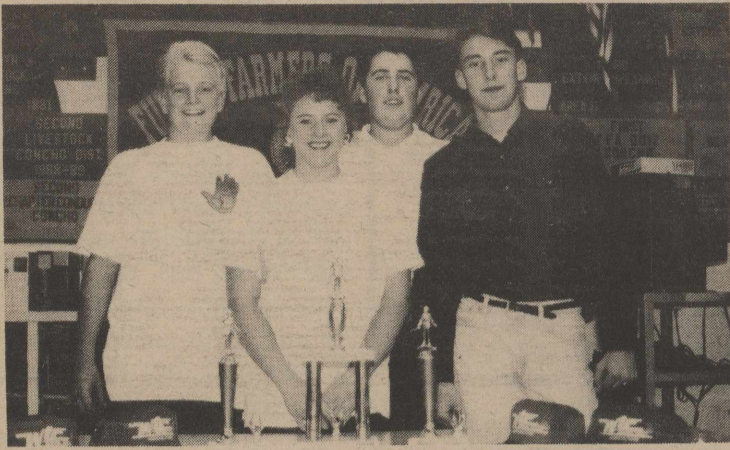

The team as a whole took 10 first place honors and numerous second and third places in different events. Individual results and events follow.

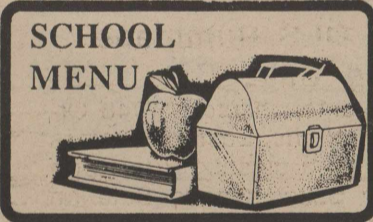

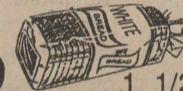
