Copter assembly group scouts RL location

A Canadian group of investors, Rotary-Air Force, Incorporated, was in Robert Lee Tuesday and Wednesday to examine the possibility of locating an assembly facility for gyrocopters. The down-sized helicopters are now being manufactured in Canada and owners are seeking a Texas site for production. Criteria includes a small acreage for a warehouse-type building and an uncontrolled airport with limited traffic to allow for testing and general use. Scouts have already looked at sites

near Paris, Texas.

Todd Blair of San Angelo, assisted by Craig Demere of Water Valley, have recently put together a gyrocopter from a kit purchased from the Canadian company. According to Demere, they have encouraged the company to look over the Robert Lee area for manufacture of the kits. He said a complete kit sells for \$19,000 to \$23,000.

The compact gyrocopter is a 2-seater and can cruise up to 90 mph. Several passengers were treated to rides and reported thrilling trips.

Demere said Tuesday that at this point, the 'copters currently have mainly recreational use but have a promising future for ag use, oil companies. border patrol or police work, or emergency transportation to or from inaccessible, rough terrain.

Apparently no decision has been made by the group and the West Coke County Community Development, as well as city and county officials, will try to visit with project leaders in the near future.


Herring inducted at ASU



Tennyson Sunrise Service


