On Saturday, May 2, Coke Colinty voters voiced their preferences for several taxing entity governing panels.
In the Robert Lee ISD election, three candidates were on the ballot for two positions on the board of trustees. Newcomer Billy Hill received the bulk of the votes at 174 Mary Grim, incumbent, gained 105, and John Carver ran a close 103. According to the Superintendent's office at presstime on Wednesday, election judges will do a recount on Wednesday night for an official enumeration, due to the narrow margin of votes.
Jackie Walker was re-elected to the City of Robert Lee mayor's position for a 2-year term with 102 votes. Incum bent council member A.L Braswell was also re-elected at an 83 total; J.A. Dunklin joined the council with 92 votes for the 2 -year terms. Manuel B. Abalos received a 38 vote total. Beth Prather gained 92 votes for the city's unexpired term.
West Coke County Hospital District added one new board member Saturday when Winton Milliff received 147 votes, followed by incumbents Ruth Robertson and Linda Arledge, receiving 133 and 130 respectively. Thomas C. Lee garnered a 57 vote count.

In the Coke County Under ground Conservation District election, Wayne McCabe, Pct.1; Otis Smith, Pct. 2; and Joe Ash, Director at large, were elected to the board. No totals were available at presstime.
Martin Lee gained the mayor's seat in the city of Bronte with the top voting total of 60 , Edward Hart, 53 votes; Bill Edward Hart, 53 votes; Bill
Thomas, 51 vote count; and Paul McGuire with a 56 total will serve on the city council.

Kendall Gibbs, 79 votes, and Steve Kelton, with 76 will fill the two slots on the Bronte School Board of Trustees. No other names appeared on that ballot.
Three incumbent candidates were returned by voters to their previous positions on the Board of Directors for the East Coke County Hospital District. LeDrew Arrott had 74 votes, Pat Oglesby got 75; Eddie Alexander also gained 75 votes.
