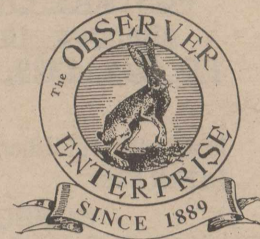

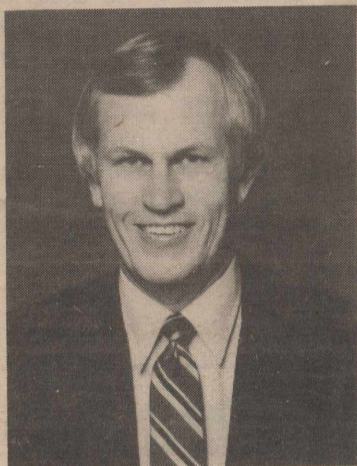

Stenholm campaign schedules local stops



**Congressman
Charles Stenholm**

Congressman Charles Stenholm will be travelling to Coke County campaigning for re-election on Thursday, October 15th.

The day-long trip will start

from Sweetwater and travel throughout the western part of the 17th district stopping in 17 towns including Snyder, Lamesa, Stanton, and Big Spring and ending with a rally in San Angelo.

Congressman Stenholm, joined by a group of friends and supporters, will stop in more than 60 towns on four separate bus tours in the 17th district over a period of two weeks. The 17th district, about the size of the state of Maine, has thirty-two counties and stretches from Wise county (north of Fort Worth) to Dawson county (south of Lubbock) to Tom Green County (San Angelo).

Stenholm, a Conservative Democrat from Stamford, believes we need a balanced

budget and has vowed to continue his fight for fiscal responsibility by the government.

He will be at the county courthouse at 3 pm for a brief visit in Robert Lee before travelling to the Bronte Post Office where he will visit with supporters for a short time at approximately 3:25 pm.

Grand Jury indicts eight

On September 26, 1992 Deputy Barnes and Deputy Styles of the Coke County Sheriff's Department and assisted by agents of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission ran a search warrant in the 700 Block of Chadbourne Street in Robert Lee. Information had been received that a subject at this address had been selling alcoholic beverages without a license. After two undercover buys, a search warrant was issued at 10:30 pm by Peace Justice Joan Davis and a white male was taken into custody and charged with one count of possession of an alcoholic beverage with intent to sell in a dry county and two counts of selling alcoholic beverage in a dry county.

On September 22, 1992 Deputy Barnes and Deputy McCutchen were assisted by the Texas Department of Public Safety Narcotics Unit in executing a search warrant in the 200 block of East Howard in Bronte. Information was received that an individual at this residence was in possession of an illegal substance. At approximately 1:00 pm Peace Justice Gary Shaffer issued a search and arrest warrant. During the course of the search of the residence a

quantity of suspected marijuana was found. One white female was arrested for possession of marijuana.

In an earlier case on September 14, 1992 the Sheriff's Department received information that an individual was to purchase illegal narcotics and return to Bronte with them. At approximately 9:00 pm Deputy Barnes and Deputy McCutchen stopped this vehicle approximately 4 miles south of Bronte on US 277. After stopping the vehicle a consent to search was given by the driver of the vehicle. A quantity of marijuana was found in the vehicle. The driver was arrested for possession of marijuana.

The Grand Jury for the August term convened on October 1, 1992 at the Coke County Courthouse. A total of nine indictments were returned on eight defendants. Four of the indictments were for felony criminal mischief, two were for burglary of a habitation, one for possession of a forged instrument, and one for possession of a controlled substance. In addition, one indictment was returned with one count of aggravated sexual assault of a child and one count of indecency with a child by contact.



Hunting lease licensing

Coke County Game Warden Sparks Burdett of Robert Lee reminds land owners or managers of hunting acreage of the Hunting Lease License required by the Texas Parks and Wildlife. Below is the complete explanation of the regulation as it appears in the current Texas Hunting guide.

Hunting Lease License is required of anyone who leases hunting rights or charges a fee for hunting on property they own or property they control. The manager of a Hunting Lease must maintain a record book provided by the Department with each hunter's name, address, license number, dates hunted, and number of species of birds or animals hunted and killed. Hunters are responsi-

ble for providing the required information to the manager. License fee: \$25 for 1 through 499 acres; \$50 for 500 through 999 acres; or \$75 for 1,000 acres or more. Note: Landowners in a county may pool their acreage licensed as a hunting lease to form a "hunting cooperative" in which the leasing profits are distributed to the landowners according to the landowners' participation. The fee for a Hunting Cooperative License is \$60 plus \$5 per participating landowner if the area is less than 10,000 acres; \$120 plus \$5 per participating landowner if the area is between 10,000 and 50,000 acres; and \$240 plus \$5 per participating landowner if the area is over 50,000 acres.

SHANNON HEALTH NOTES

Supressed Anger

Conventional advice is to avoid suppressing anger. A study at the University of Michigan shows why. In a study of one hundred ninety-two married couples, researchers found that in marriages where both the wife and husband held in their anger, the wife was four times more likely to die of heart or circulatory disease than wives in marriages where one or both spouses vented their anger.

Husbands were less affected by their wife's anger than by their own. Men high on the suppressed anger scale were more than twice as likely to die of cardiovascular disease than husbands with low suppressed anger scores.

Michigan researcher Dr. Mara Julius reported to the Society of Behavioral Medicine that their findings suggest the shared emotional environment of a marriage can affect health in the truest sense of the vow "for better or for worse".

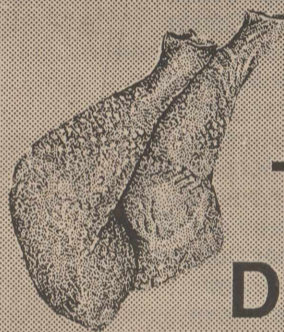

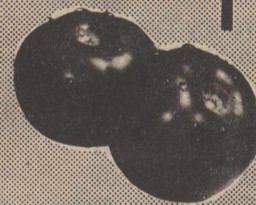

The first quarter ended with a score of 7-0, Menard's favor, with a 15 yard run by Kuykendall, and PAT.

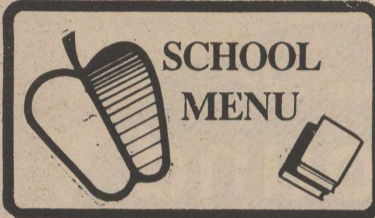

Stenholm receives award

Congressman Charles Stenholm received the 1992 National Security Leadership Award during a ceremony held September 30, in the US Capitol. The award was made in recognition of his 100 percent score on the American Security Council's National Security Voting Index (NSVI) for the 102nd Congress, and acknowledges his leadership "in promoting collective security, international economic growth, and an international role for the United States."

Among the ten key votes selected for the NSVI were the use of military force in Iraq during Operation Desert Storm; the North American Free Trade Agreement, the Balanced Budget Amendment, the Line-Item Veto, the American Technology Pre-eminence Act, and humanitarian assistance to Russia and the former Yugoslavia. The American Security Council was formed in 1955 and works on behalf of a national strategy designed to safeguard US interests while promoting a world of free nations at peace.

"This Leadership Award is just a small token of our appreciation of Congressman Stenholm's efforts," said Dr. Harvey Sicherman, the President of both the American Security Council and ASC Foundation, who also participated in the presentation. "Congressman Stenholm realizes that military power and sound diplomacy will always have an important role in assuring our national security. But he also realizes that in an increasingly interdependent world there are other dimensions to our strength and security that cannot be ignored. For example, the Congressman has emphasized the need to reduce the federal budget deficit because it threatens both the long term economic health of the country and our international leadership on many issues," said Dr. Sicherman.

In accepting the award, Stenholm cautioned those who advocate isolationist and protectionist policies. "The United States is now the

world's lone superpower and must not abandon its international role and commitments; to do so will not enrich us -- it will merely diminish us," said Stenholm. "I intend to continue working hard to promote US economic strength and international leadership which, after the end of the Cold War, are key to winning the peace," concluded Stenholm.
