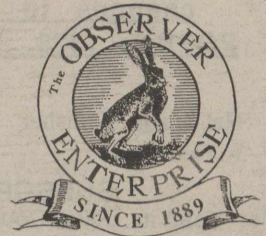

## Steers dominate Irion County meet

The Robert Lee Steers far out-distanced thirteen teams with 219 points and came away victors from the Hornet Relays at Irion County last weekend. Jason Dickey paced the locals with wins in three events, taking the long jump at 22 feet, equaling the record held by Kirby Rasco, the 100m dash with 11:35 seconds, and the 400 in 50.8. The big win was shored up by John Williams shot put throw of 51 feet 11 inches, establishing a record for the Hornet meet.

Bronte School Band Boosters will meet on Wednesday night, April 7, at 8 pm in the Band Hall.

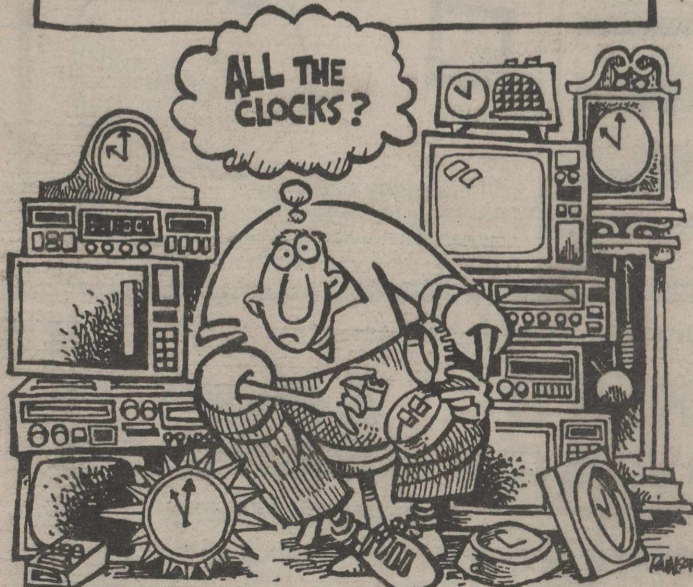
Spring activities for the band will be the chief topic for discussion.

Pallbearers were Jesse Ray Gaines, Garland Gaines, Jim King, Jesse Eads, Carl Blair and David Key.

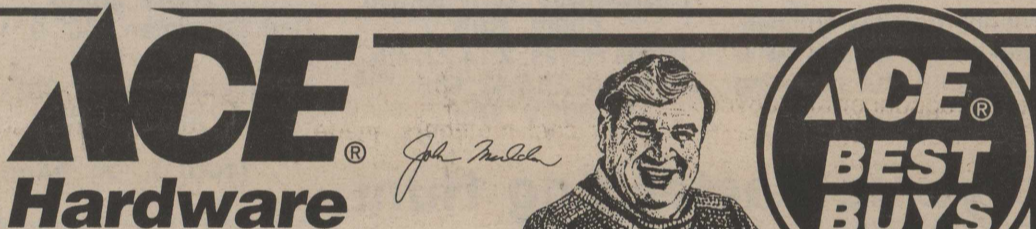

Four cast members made the Honorable Mention All-Star Cast. These students are Jennifer Sparks, Walter King, Amy Bailey, and Casey Thorn.

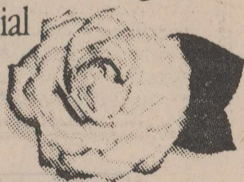

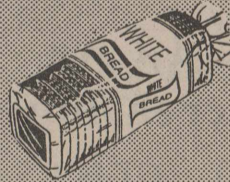

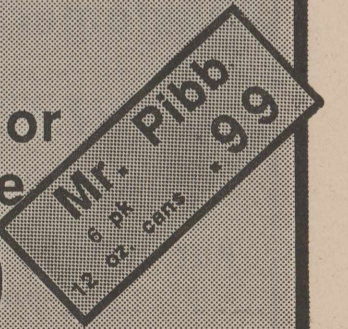

## Ballinger, Sonora papers purchased

Two area newspapers, with over one hundred years of publication history each, have been acquired by a Winters publishing company. Boles Publishing, Inc. has purchased The Ballinger Ledger and The Devil's River News (Sonora) from Thomson Newspapers Corporation of Chicago and Toronto.

Reggie Boles and Randall Boles are the majority stockholders in Boles Publishing, a

closely-held, family publishing company based in Winters, Texas. The brothers also have ownership in the company that publishes The Winters Enterprise in Winters.

The new owners are hoping that local ownership will "make the publications that much more responsive to the communities they serve."

"A weekly or semi-weekly newspaper is a special breed in the news market, and it takes a certain type of management and nurturing to make it a profitable operation that also provides a real service to the community," says Reggie Boles.

The transaction was effective

March 15, with informal ceremonies marking the changeover in both locations. Representatives from Boles Publishing, Thomson, and local officials were on hand to recognize the new ownership.

"We hope that local ownership helps bring a homegrown flavor to the newspapers that successful weeklies and semi-weeklies need to prosper. We are excited about the opportunities this brings to the communities involved," says Randall Boles.

The newspapers will honor all subscriptions and other ongoing business commitments, and they will be continuing operations with an eye toward improving the readability and appearance of the publications. Publication deadlines and dates will not change.

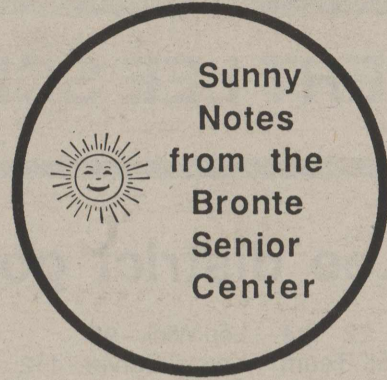

**Green Up Your Lawn**

by Tommy Antilley

About this time of the year home lawns need a boost to get them in shape for the upcoming spring season.

There are three basic operations that can get a lawn off to a good start; scalping, fertilizing and applying a weed killer.

Scalping a lawn in early spring serves to revitalize it and promote early spring green-up.

Begin the operation by lowering the blade of your lawnmower 1/2 to 1 inch below the normal setting. Then mow the lawn in two directions that are at right angles to each other. Remove the clippings after each mowing. They are excellent to add to a compost or to use as mulch for garden and landscape plants.

The lawnmower blade should be kept at this lower setting until early summer.

After scalping the lawn, apply a complete fertilizer (one containing nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium) to promote leaf and root growth. Use 1.5 pounds of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet of lawn area. This is equal to 18 pounds of an 8-8-8 fertilizer or 12 pounds of a 12-4-8 fertilizer. Repeat the application in the early summer and fall.

For a dark green lawn, apply nitrogen every 50 days at the

rate of one pound to 1,000 square feet, but this will also require a significantly larger amount of water to maintain

the green color and will require more frequent mowings. Monthly applications of iron chelate or iron sulphate during the spring and summer promote a healthy color to St. Augustine lawns.

To keep crabgrass or other unsightly weeds from becoming a problem, apply a preemergence herbicide (weed killer) in early spring, after the grass has recovered from winter. Applying a pre-emergence herbicide too early can further weaken turfgrass injured by winter conditions. Combination of herbicides with fertilizers are available and convenient to use but, as with all herbicides, should only be used according to instructions on the label. Also, many of these combination herbicides-fertilizers can be extremely toxic to pecan and fruit trees, so always read the label to avoid injury to other plants.

Proper maintenance is essential for a healthy lawn, and these practices will give new life to a dormant, weedy lawn.

**Jackson is heroism winner**

A McLennan County man has been named recipient of the 1992 Rural Heroism Award for his quick action that saved a China Spring cattleman from being crushed in a hay baler.

David Jackson was awarded the prestigious honor during the annual Texas and Southwestern Safety Conference and Exposition for rescuing Dennis Provasek on June 16, 1992.

Provasek was operating his baler and attempting to unplug the implement's compression roller after wet hay clogged the machinery when his right arm got caught.

The rollers started pulling Provasek's jammed arm and his whole body upward into the machinery. The reel teeth began tearing away at his chest. Provasek withstood the tortuous experience for 30 minutes before help could arrive.

Provasek screamed out and Chris Muns, a small youngster who lived nearby, heard his cries. Muns made a futile at-

tempt to pull the injured farmer from the haybaler. Muns ran to his home and told his grandmother to "call 911".

Meanwhile, the youngster's mother saw Jackson driving a tractor down a rural road and hailed him down. She informed Jackson of Provasek's dilemma and instantly the man drove to where Provasek was continuing to fight for his life.

Familiar with the equipment, Jackson switched the haybaler's movement in reverse and pulled the injured cattleman from the machinery.

Jackson recalls that Provasek had remained very alert despite the intense pain and bleeding that he had endured.

Provasek was taken by ambulance to a Waco hospital where orthopedic surgeons worked to save his arm. Unfortunately, the damage was too severe and doctors were forced to amputate the arm.

The experience was sobering for Jackson whose father was killed in a farming accident when Jackson was still a youngster.

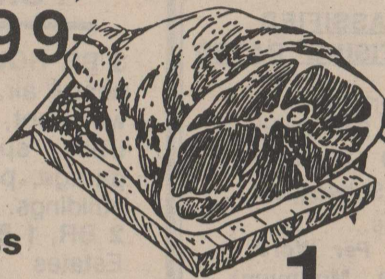

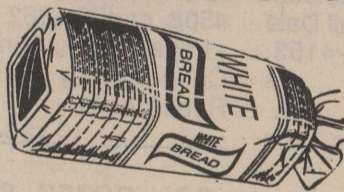

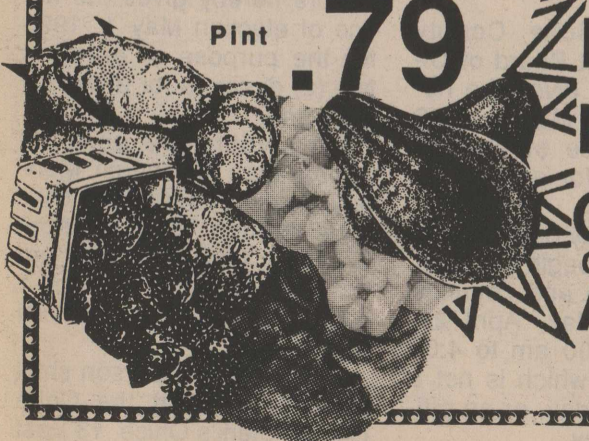

## H. C. Varnadore honored

[Editor's Note: Lt. Col. H. C. Varnadore, III was recently honored by a civic group in Ft. Smith, Arkansas. The story of the recognition appeared in the Ft. Smith Times Record, March 21. He is a native of Robert Lee and a grandson of the late Henry and Grace Varnadore. A number of other relatives still reside in Robert Lee, including great-aunts Effie Campbell, Essie Childress, and Edna Adkins.]

Lt. Col. H. C. Varnadore thought he was just there to give a speech. However, the members of the Downtown Sertoma Club had an ulterior motive for inviting the deputy commander of the 188th Fighter Group to their meeting.

At noon Friday the Sertoma Club presented Varnadore its 1993 Service to Mankind Award. Citing a long and distinguished military career, as well as a variety of volunteer civil involvements, club secretary Jim Griffith said, "This is beyond words. Gee Whiz, I just do what I do. I appreciate it, really."

But the Sertoma Club wasn't finished with Varnadore yet. After Griffith presented the Fort Smith Chapter's award, Charles Looper presented Varnadore the Service to Mankind award for the entire Western Arkansas District, explaining that Varnadore's name would also be entered for regional consideration.

Born in West Texas, Varnadore moved to Mena and later to Fort Smith, where his father was a pilot for the Air National Guard. After graduating from the University of Arkansas in 1966, Varnadore obtained a commission in the U. S. Air Force and went to Mather Air Force Base in California for training.

In 1969, Varnadore volunteered for assignment to Southeast Asia and was sent

to Thailand, where he engaged in more than 100 combat missions for 484.2 hours of combat flying time.

After returning to the states, Varnadore took extensive training as an instructor and took over as chief of academics for navigator training of student F-4 crews at Homestead AFB in Florida.

Currently, as deputy commander for support of the 188th, Varnadore manages all unit mission support functions and supervises 22 offices and 286 airmen.

"It's not often that a person who has devoted so much of his life to his country through a distinguished military career has time to help members of the community by volunteer work," said Griffith, pointing out that Varnadore is an elder and chairman of the board of First Christian Church of Fort Smith. He is a long-time volunteer and member of the board of directors of Fulfill A Dream, an organization that provides the means for catastrophically ill children to realize a special desire. He is a member of the Civil Air Patrol, an organization which helps locate downed aircraft. He works with the local chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. He is vice-chairman of the board of directors of the Sebastian County Chapter of the American Red Cross. And he frequently speaks to local civic organizations such as the Downtown Sertoma Club.

# HEALTH NOTES

## KIDS CALCIUM

We're frequently reminded about the importance of calcium for strong bones. Researchers from Indiana University confirm that young children may bank against osteoporosis later in life by getting more than the recommended amount of calcium now. The study appears in the *New England Journal of Medicine* (7-8). There's another benefit from calcium. Dr. Matthew Gillman and his colleagues from Boston University School of Medicine reported in the *Journal of the American Medical Association* (5-5) that the more calcium children got the more their systolic blood pressure was reduced.

While the major source of calcium for children in the U.S. is dairy products, parents should be aware that low-fat and non-fat dairy products contain approximately the same amount of calcium as those with higher amounts of fat. Children over the age of two or three should be encouraged to use lower-fat products.

## Striped bass action is "hot" on Spence

[Editor's Note: The following article appeared recently in the Texas Hunting & Fishing News, a weekly publication.]

### Spence will yield topwater strippers

Robert Lee - Striped bass action is hot on E. V. Spence Reservoir, reports Marsha Blair of Paint Creek Marina (915-453-2982). Though most of the linesiders are in the 4 to 6 pound range, she says some big ones up to 28 pounds have also been caught.

"They're catching limits daily," Blair comments. "The bait of choice is a slab. Most of the action is happening under the birds. The best areas to catch them are **Yellow Wolf Creek, Smokey Draw** and in the Ranch House area," she tips, reporting that area angler Darrell Sorrey recently caught a 27-pounder on live bait by the Ranch House. Ricky Robinson of Robert Lee is also catching nice-sized strippers up to 14 pounds.

Blair warns striped fishermen to get ready for topwater activity. "Before April," she explains, "the upper end of the lake will host the initial topwater action. The fish will be hitting where the water is warmest, early in the morning and late in the evening," she explains. "So get your **big poppers** ready."

"They're also going to be catching a lot of nice white bass mixed in with the strippers," she says. "The best baits for whites should be chartreuse or silver slabs."

Spence black bass action is also good, with the spawn in full swing, Blair reports. "In the warmest part of the lake, up in Smokey Draw," she says, "fishermen are catching them pretty shallow during the mid-day on black buzzbaits and chartreuse and white spinnerbaits. They're averaging 3 pounds and running up to 4 1/2."

To get to Paint Creek Marina, take Hwy. 158 west 8 miles out of Robert Lee. Turn

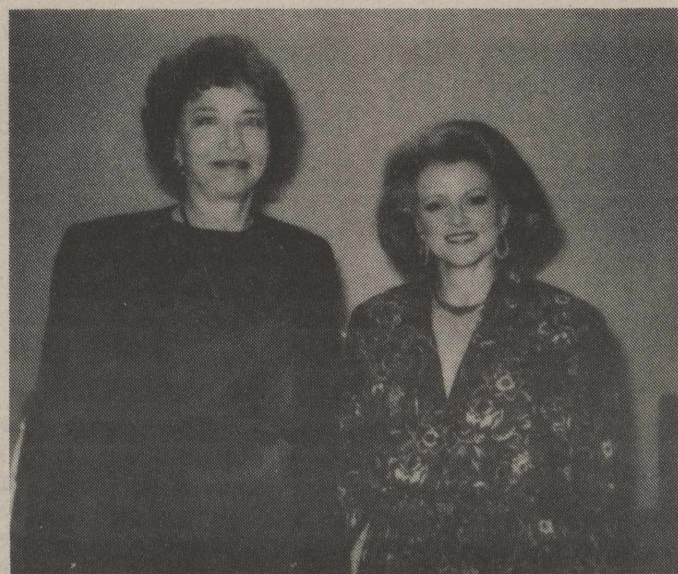
