Voter turnout termed "poor" for elections

The lines have been drawn in the Texas Senate race. Republican Kay Bailey Hutchison surprised lots of folks by coming in ahead of interim Democratic Senator Bob Krueger, 593,479 to 592, 982. Many expected a hands-down win by Krueger who was appointed by Governor Ann Richards to finish the unexpired term of Lloyd Bentson when he stepped up to United States Treasury Secretary.

Krueger and Hutchison received roughly 29% each of the total vote over 22 other candidates in Saturday's election. The pair will now go head to head in a runoff election at a date not yet set, said to be projected for June 5. Winner of the runoff election would serve out Bentsen's original term and would then have to run for his or her own full term.

The three proposed constitutional amendments dealing with Texas school finance were trashed by voters in the Special Election.

In Coke County, only 764 voters cast ballots, for a poor showing in Saturday's Special Robert (Bob) Election. Krueger received 275 votes while the overall leader, Kay Bailey Hutchison, gained 126 ballots. Jack Fields was in 2nd

168 votes.

Following the state trend. Coke County turned down the school finance proposals by large margins - Prop. #1, 493-219; Prop. #2, 413-272; Prop. #3, 487-210.
In Robert Lee's taxing enti-

ties' elections, the West Coke County Hospital District seated two new directors on its board. Mary Bessent and Elaine Lee were elected to the panel with 297 and 212 votes respectively. Olene Sims gained 160 votes.

Robert Lee city council members elected by voters are Garland Davis, 148; Jeffrey Eubanks, 148, and Beth Prather, 138. Manuel Abalos garnered 35 votes.

Elected to the Robert Lee ISD board of trustees in Saturday's election were William Burns (174) and Mark Riley (130). Kim Hodge received 83 votes and Steve Whiteker gained a total of 121

Fred H. McCabe, Jr. was reelected to the board of directors in Pct. 3 with 68 votes while R. S. (Bud) Johnson was returned to the governing panel in Pct. 4 with 104 votes in the Coke County Under-ground Water Conservation District election.

Voter turnout was light in Bronte for the special election held Saturday, May 8. A total place in county ballots with of 188 persons in Bronte cast ballots for local candidates.

Four candidates ran for the two 2-year term Alderman positions; Pete Percifull and Gerald Sandusky were elected to serve in those positions. Pete Percifull received 155 votes; Gerald Sandusky, 147 votes; Donald O'Banon, 16 votes; and Loy Wrinkle, 8 votes.

Sheri Jordan was unopposed in the bid for the 1 year term Alderman seat. She received a total of 93 votes.

Ray Barnett and Wayne Coalson were re-elected to serve on the Bronte ISD board of trustees for three year terms. Barnett received 152 votes, Coalson, 170, and Harold Dunn 135. Elected for the one year unexpired term was Martin DeLaGarza with 155 votes. Linda Tampke received 74 votes in that race.

Bowen Named Conservationist of the Year

Don Bowen was recently named Conservationist of the Year for 1992 by the directors of the Coke County Soil and

Water Conservation District. Don operates 8,000 acres on two ranches in the Coke County hill country. On both ranches the country is diverse, ranging from shallow rocky divides to steep rocky slopes to deep draws and outwash flats.

The diversity presents quite a management challenge to Don and his manager, Kent Nehring. Their livestock mix and short-duration grazing system are specifically designed to best use available forage while protecting their range resource. In order to make it work, they have built miles of fences, and are building more. They have updated watering facilities and improved water distribution to better manage grazing pres-

Despite past control measures, brush enroachment, particularly cedar and prickly pear, is an ever-present problem. Don and Kent use a tractor-mounted hydraulic grubber to control regrowth cedar and small mesquite, and maintain his pasture in good shape. Other practices such as prescribed burning are

RL burglaries investigated

According to the Coke County Sheriff's office, personnel answered 24 reports in April alone. A rash of breakins has accounted for much of their time, Sheriff Marshall Millican reported. The first of a series of burglaries occurred during the nighttime hours March 31 at Ranchland Restaurant on Commerce in Robert Lee. Entry was gained to the building through the ceiling. A cash loss of approximately \$338.00 was suffered by the owners in addition to the damage to the building.

The night of April 16 a break-in occurred at the Cracker Barrel Restaurant; entry was gained by prying open a rear door. \$300.00 was taken from the office. The same evening West Texas Utilities was burglarized by forcing open the side door. Loss there was \$8.00 cash plus damage.

Coin-operated machines were burglarized at Super H on April 23 with a loss of \$35 change and an unkown amount from the changer with damage to the units. The drink machines at Bronte's Super Save had a loss of \$70.00 the same night with no forced entry.

A burglary of a building was reported at Bronte recently at the landfill office. Loss of a portable refrigerator, a 12" TV. and two electric heaters were taken with a loss of \$105.00.

A number of thefts have also occurred, involving habitations, cars, a boat, and property on premises.

ness reported a battery stolen from the rear of the bldg; one resident lost \$20 and \$200 in food stamps; another residence lost \$40 in property. Criminal mischief accounted for property loss to owners; \$50 in damage 9 miles west of Robert Lee on April 19; April 21 \$75 in damages 3 miles south of Robert Lee; extensive loss April 4 at Robert Lee High School (no estimate available).

These reports are in addition to DWI arrests, accidents, criminal trespass, family violence reports, and assaults during the month.

Oak Creek Lake has had its share of crime - Oak Creek Lodge reported the loss of fishing tackle, and misc. items valued at \$480.00. On March 27, a boat was burglarized, losing loose property; on April 3 burglary of a habitation loss amounted to about \$1,500, including damage; criminal mischief to a cabin on the

northside of Oak Creek April 17 resulted in \$50 in damages.

A theft at Tennyson April 19 was reported with \$250 in property lost.

A criminal mischief offense one mile north of Bronte April 1 resulted in unknown damage; April 2 a car was burglarized; April 12 a residence lost approximately \$130; Turner's Mini-Mart lost \$20; an assault was reported on April 6; a terroristic threat the last of March; and a number of fender benders, family violence, and other cases.

The Sheriff's Department urges county residents to be aware of unusual traffic, persons on foot, or neighborhood problems. Reports to the office will be kept confidential. They advise owners to lock up cars, other property, and their homes. Crime can be cut by taking precau-
