## VITAMIN E vs. CANCER

A number of research projects are underway to determine whether vitamin E can help prevent colon, lung, oral and other cancers. One of those is reported on by researchers from the National Cancer Institute in the *American Journal of Epidemiology* (7-92) They found new evidence that people who regularly take vitamin E supplements have only about half the risk of oral and pharyngeal cancer compared to non-vitamin users.

Most of the people who took vitamin E took other vitamins as well, but while individual effects of other vitamins were ruled out, the researchers, led by Gloria Gridley, say they haven't ruled out whether the combination of vitamins produced the protective effect. Vitamin E is found primarily in vegetable oils, nuts, seeds and whole grains, but not in amounts sufficient for a protective effect. They say that probably takes ten times the recommended daily allowance of vitamin E.

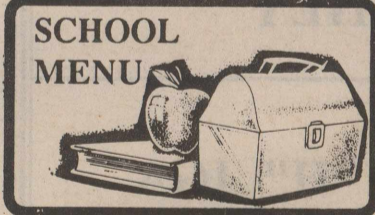
### Class of 1938 Reunion

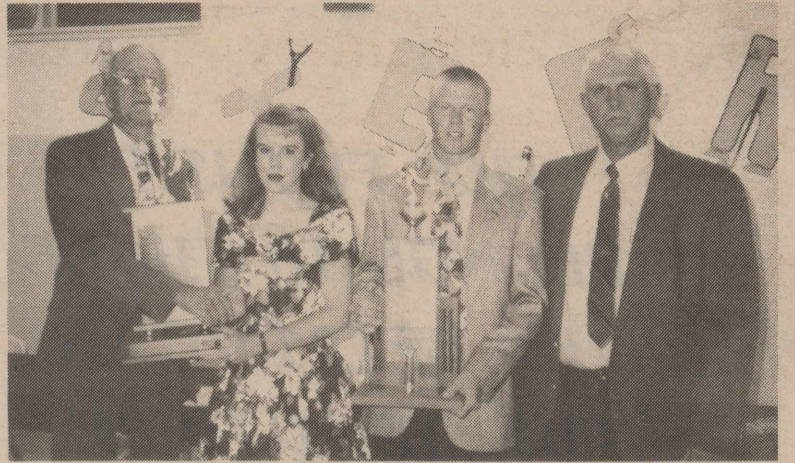

**ORDINANCE #272 THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:**

The City of Bronte shall furnish garbage and trash collection service pursuant to the understated rules, regulations, and stipulations as specified in this ordinance and as may be amended, to wit:

**G. COLLECTION CHARGES**  
The following monthly rates and charges shall be, to-wit:

(a) Premises used for private residences, single or double unit apartment houses, single mobile home sites and/or locations, shall be charged \$8.75 per family unit as to occupied residences, apartments, and units.

(b) premises used for commercial, business, and/or public services not receiving sanitation container service as described herein shall be charged \$9.75 per month for 1 through 7 containers per week. The charge for 8 through 14 containers per week shall be \$12.75 per month.

**I. CONTAINERIZED SANITATION SYSTEM**

Pursuant to the sanitation container system services, BFI, Inc. will furnish a container or containers to be used in the collection and/or removal of garbage and trash. The following formula shall be used as to the fees charged

for garbage and/or trash hauling, to-wit:

Charges for one pick-up per week shall be effective

2 yd. - \$40.00

3 yd. - \$54.00

4 yd. - \$63.00

6 yd. - \$84.00

Charges for two pick-ups per week shall be effective

2 yd. - \$64.00

3 yd. - \$90.00

4 yd. - \$112.00

6 yd. - \$150.00

**PUBLIC NOTICE**

Colorado River Municipal Water District, Rules and Regulations for C.R.M.W.D. Lakes and Reservoirs, adopted by Board of Directors, Colorado River Municipal Water District, December 7, 1989. The rules have been amended by action of the District's Board of Directors in a meeting of May 13, 1993. The amended sections are printed below:

Section I

**SANITATION AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL**

Paragraph G. (page 6) states -

The doing of any act forbidden to be done by this Ordinance, or the failure to do any act required by the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed to be a misdemeanor, which in case of a lawful conviction thereof, shall be punishable by the infliction of a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, together with the costs of court provided the fine and costs of court may not exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars. Paragraph G. is hereby amended to read as follows -

The doing of any act forbidden to be done by this Ordinance, or the failure to do any act required by the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed to be a misdemeanor, which in case of a lawful conviction thereof, shall be punishable by the assessment of a fine of not more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, together with the costs of court.

Section XXVIII

**PENALTIES**

Page 28 state -

The breach of any rule or regulation contained herein, by the doing of any act forbidden by this Ordinance or the failure to do any act required by this Ordinance may in the case of conviction thereof be punished by the infliction of a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars or by imprisonment for not to exceed thirty (30) days or by both such fine and imprisonment. The penalty hereby authorized shall be in addition to any other penalty provided by the laws of the State of Texas, or by the laws of the United States of America, and may be enforced or imposed under

complaints filed by the District, or any other interested person, in an appropriate court of jurisdiction.

Any person, persons, firm or corporation found guilty of violation of any section or sections of this Ordinance shall upon request of the District surrender his permit or lease for suspension or cancellation by the District. Any fees which may have been paid by the Permittee for such permit shall automatically be forfeited, and the District shall not, in any event, be liable for the return or refund of any part thereof.

Page 28 is hereby amended to read as follows -

The breach of any District rule or regulation contained herein, by the doing of any act forbidden by this Ordinance or the failure to do any act required by this Ordinance, shall be considered a misdemeanor and may in the case of conviction thereof be punished by the assessment of a fine not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars. The penalty for an offense that violates laws of the State of Texas or the United States of America shall be as established and ordered by the appropriate court of jurisdiction.

Any person, persons, firm or corporation found guilty of violation of any section or sections of this Ordinance shall upon request of the District surrender his permit or lease for suspension or cancellation by the District. Any fees which may have been paid by the Permittee for such permit shall automatically be forfeited, and the District shall not, in any event, be liable for the return or refund of any part thereof.

The above amended rules shall become effective five (5) days after the second date of publication.

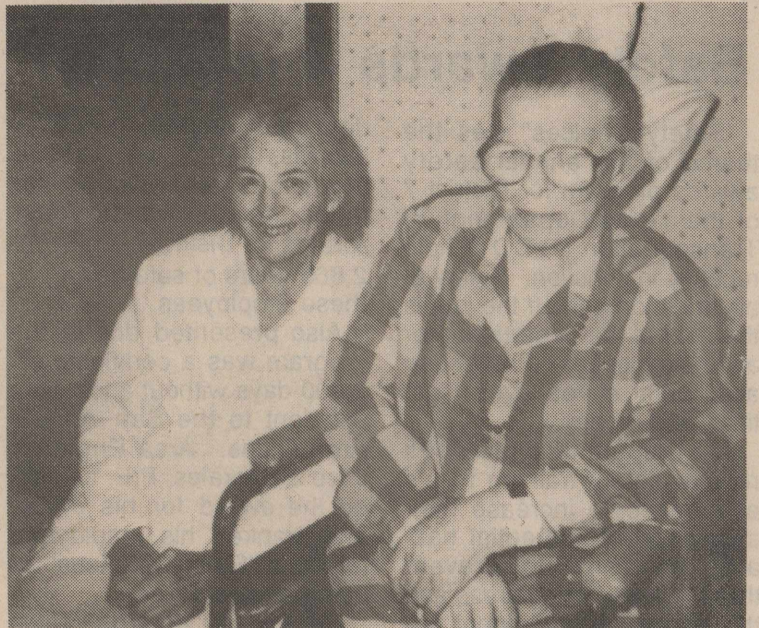
**BNH celebrates Open House**

### Pecan Nut Casebearer Control

With the crazy weather and variations in temperatures this spring, precise prediction for control of pecan nut casebearers will be difficult. Unless there is a tremendous load of casebearer eggs present on the nutlets, it is suggested to not spray for control of the casebearers. A light infestation of casebearers can actually assist in thinning the pecan load resulting in larger more completely filled out nuts this fall. Also, any insecticide application for casebearer control will in all probability result in a much larger infestation of yellow aphids which cause the honeydew to fall from the trees. Yellow aphids are generally a much larger pest problem for our area than the casebearer.

The estimated dates for pecan nut casebearer control are predicted between May 24 and May 31. This is only a prediction and control measures should not be applied unless eggs of the casebearer are present on the nutlets. For more information, contact the Coke County Extension office.
