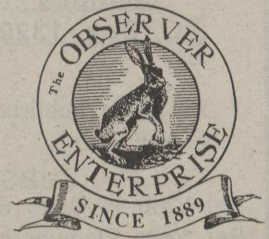

Millican

Funeral services were held at 3 pm Sunday, June 20, in the Silver Baptist Church for Francis Clifton "Son" Millican. Burial followed in the Robert Lee Cemetery, directed by Shaffer Funeral Home. The Rev. R. W. Blackmon, pastor of the church, officiated the services. Pallbearers for the services included Dub Metcalf, Don Sparks, Larry Millican, Homer Millican, A. B. Jennings, and Rocky Reynolds.

Mr. Millican, 76, died of an apparent heart attack Friday, June 18, suffered en route to Colorado City from his home at Silver. He was alone and was found in his pickup just inside a nearby pasture.

He was born January 3, 1917 in the Cedar Hill community, south of Silver in Coke County. The families of both his parents, David Monroe Millican and Mary Ann Tubb, came to West Coke County near the turn of the century. Son was a lifelong resident of the county except for a short time spent in Arkansas and his service in the Army Air Corp during World War II.

He was married to Lorene Johnson in San Angelo August 15, 1938 and they spent their married life at Silver. He was a member of the Silver Baptist Church and a retired rancher and oilfield pumper.

Michael, Brandi, and Matthew Reynolds, Shanna Demere, and Deesa Hood; and three brothers, Dalton Millican and Bunyon Millican of Silver, and Gerald Millican of Hobbs, New Mexico.

He was preceded in death by one son, James Millican.

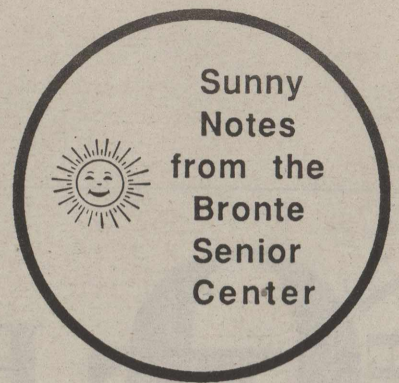

Free Health Screening for Low Income Men

Our Area Agency on Aging has given Coke County funds for health screenings. Arrangements have been made for low income men to have the PSA test, which is a blood test which measures a substance in the blood called Prostrate Specific Antigens. PSA blood levels increase in cases of prostate cancer and other prostate diseases. The test is used to confirm a diagnosis of prostate cancer, to monitor response to therapy and screen for recurrence. If you are over 65 and think you might qualify call Mary Percifull at the Bronte Senior Center and get more details. This blood test will be taken at Shamrock Clinic in Robert Lee

at no cost to you. This service will be provided in both Bronte and Robert Lee.

HEALTH NOTES

AGONY OF DA FEET

Nine out of ten people who come to see orthopedic surgeons at Northwestern Memorial Hospital in Chicago are women. Dr. Armen Kelikian said that fits with recent estimates that three out of four women have foot pain, and studies showing that a similar percentage of women between ages of twenty and sixty were wearing the wrong size shoe - too small or too narrow.

He says many women with larger feet try to squeeze into smaller shoes to make their feet look smaller. Dr. Kelikian offers tips to minimize foot problems. Always have your foot measured when you buy a new pair of shoes. Feet get larger as you get older. Don't buy shoes that you hope will stretch. Shoes should feel comfortable when you buy them. Shop for shoes at the end of the day when your feet are largest.

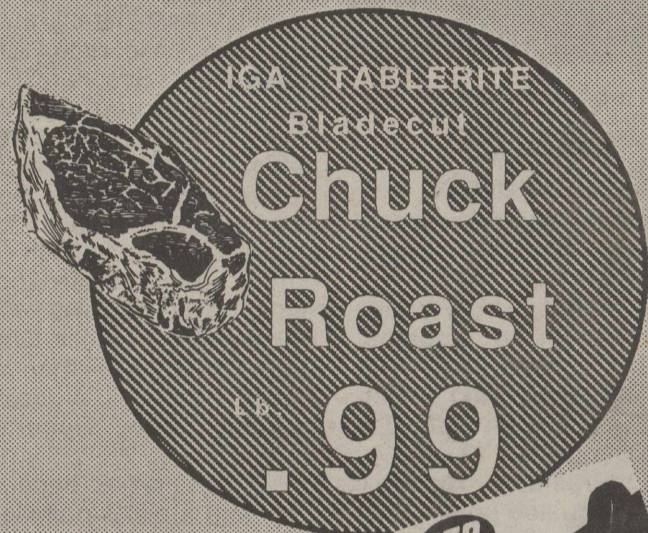

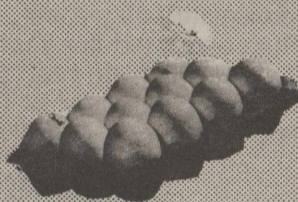

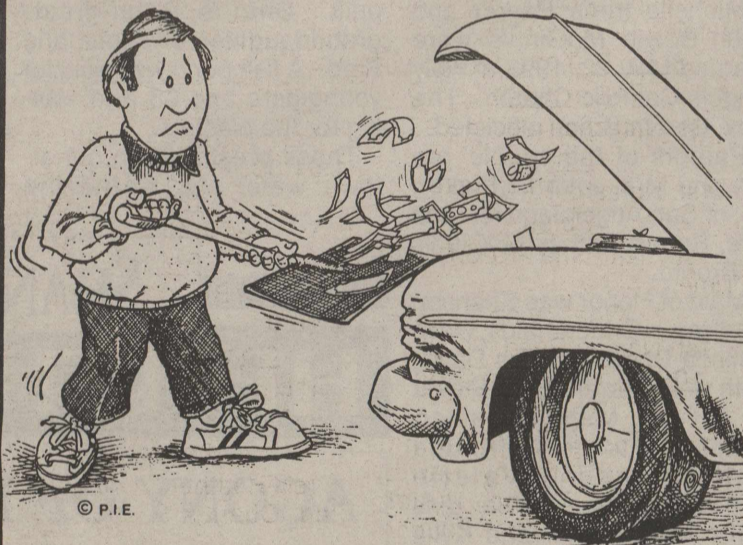
