

Service was held at 11 am Wednesday, Dec. 22, at the Stevens Funeral Home chapel with burial in Silver Valley Cemetery.


He was born January 21, 1899 in Coleman County. He was a veteran of World War I and a retired service station owner. He was a Baptist.



RL adjusts fluoride levels

On December 20, Robert Lee joined with over 200 other cities in Texas that adjusted the level of naturally-occurring fluoride in their drinking water to the level that is ideal for prevention of tooth decay.

This is accomplished using special equipment designed to inject precisely controlled amounts of fluoride into the water supply near the point where it is chlorinated.

The ideal level of fluoride in drinking water is seven to eight tenths of one part per million, or slightly less than one gallon of fluoride in one million gallons of water.

By comparison, this fluoride to water ratio is about the same one inch in sixteen miles, or one minute in two years!

Yet, according to the U. S. Surgeon General, the American and Texas Dental Associations, the Texas Department of Health, this tiny addition of fluoride to our water will have a major influence on our dental health.

The flouridation director of

the Flouridation Project for the Texas Department of Health, Don Crow D. D. S., stated that numerous carefully controlled scientific studies and over 40 years of nationwide community water fluoridation history demonstrate the benefits of fluoridation. He said that children who grow up drinking water which contains the ideal amount of fluoride have far fewer cavities than children with fluoridedeficient drinking water, and the teeth of adults who drink fluoridated water also become more decay resistant.

According to Mayor Jackie Walker, Water Superintendent James Royall was instrumental in Robert Lee securing a federal grant through the Texas Department of Health to purchase the fluoridation equipment. The Dental Society points out that there is no longer any need for dentists or pediatricians to prescribe fluoride supplements for children who routinely drink fluoridated Robert Lee water.



Relieving holiday stress

Holidays, although filled with joy, can be hectic, chaotic and stressful if families don't take the time to plan for them. According to Dr. Lillian Chenoweth, professor of family sciences at Texas Woman's University, one way to alleviate some holiday anxieties is planning -- no matter what the date.

"It's never too late to start planning," says Chenowth.

Previous holiday pitfalls often can be avoided with preplanning. A good way to start is by scheduling a family meeting where goals and timetables are discussed, she says. Decisions can be made based on the type of holiday events that are acceptable to For example: everyone. would it be better to plan a family vacation or to visit family members? Is Christmas caroling an option, or is there a favorite play for the family to attend? Family members may also choose to avoid commercialization and, instead, make gifts for loved ones or plan an outing where everyone can contribute to the shopping.

Fixed activities need to be considered when special events are planned -- for example, piano lessons that cannot be missed or company

parties that must be attended. "Many people overcommit for the holidays," says Chenoweth. They have to practice saying 'no'". People naturally want to do everything, but when they plan too much and experience extra stress, the events tend to become more of a chore than a celebration.

Chenoweth offers several suggestions to alleviate holiday stress:

*Special types of parties can help complete some holiday chores. Cookie exchange parties can help with baking needs. Guests are asked to bring large amounts of one kind of cookie, and those attending can then exchange cookies so that they have a variety to enjoy. Baking during the party can also add to the festivities.

*Parties scheduled close together (on consecutive nights) take less time since only one housecleaning session is necessary. Menu planning and grocery shopping can also be combined to save time.

*Activities as simple as getting the Christmas tree can become a problem when all aspects are not considered. People should look at options, such as having a tree shipped to the family every year, finding a Christmas tree farm that allows them to pick and chop down their own tree or visiting the corner tree lot.

*Gift giving is also a source of extra anxiety but, with a little planning and preparation, it can become a joyous occasion. Family gifts are always a possibility for large or hard-tobuy-for groups. Games such as croquet or "Pictionary" are good choices. Food items, such as a selection of cheeses or cookies, can be placed in holiday containers. for the entire family to enjoy. Gift certificates can be purchased almost anywhere for meals or entertainment parks.





Any resident of Coke County who thinks they may qualify for the Emergency Food Assistance Program should go by the Bronte or Robert Lee Senior Citizens Buildings from 8 am to 5 pm, Monday - Wednesday - Friday, Jan. 3-13, 1994, and make application. In Robert Lee, see Kelly Millican or Zola Hatley. In Bronte see Mary Percifull, Geneva Minnick, or Lois Wallace. Stover Taylor is also available in the courthouse. If you are handicapped, shut-in, or do not have transportation, arrangements will be made to help you by calling the following numbers: Bronte 473-6471; Robert Lee 453-2314 or 453-2922. If you do not speak English, a Spanish speaking person will be made available for you. If you are already receiving commodities, you must recertify if you want to receive commodities in 1994.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program was established by Public Law 98-8 and was amended by Public Law 98-92. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) administrates the program on the federal level. The Department of Human Services Resources (DHR) administers the program in Through the Texas. **Emergency Food Assistance** Program, DHR provides needy people including low income and unemployed people with USDA food (commodities) to relieve situations of emergency stress.

If eligible and commodities are available, all people have the right to apply for and receive emergency food assistance without regard to race, religion, sex, political beliefs, age, national origin, or handicap. You also have the right to appeal the eligibility decision. All commodities are distributed on a first come - first serve basis.

sions can be disastrous. A producer may not be able to control price, but can control how and when to price. Market information and price risk management tools can provide valuable assistance in the timing of pricing decisions and in marketing, production and financial planning. With potential for increased returns to improved marketing decisions, farmers and ranchers should consider more time and financial investment toward obtaining the analyzing short-term and long-term market trends.

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service is offering an introductory level, Price Risk Management Workshop for grain, cotton and cattle producers. The 12-hour workshop will provide market updates as well as basic training in the various pricing alternatives available to farmers and ranchers with emphasis on the use of commodity futures and options.

The instructors will use regionalized data, and the participants will work through hedging examples to help them better understand the mechanics of pricing with futures and options.

This workshop will be held at Texas A & M University February 9-10, 1994. For more information and preregistration contact the Coke County Extension office. Cost of the workshop will be \$75.00 (\$100.00 with spouse).

In the wake of the fast-food hamburger illnessess in several western states, the federal government stepped up food inspection actions to reduce such tragic consequences in the future. An industry group, the National Live Stock and Meat Board, has issued reminders about safe and proper handling of foods, including hamburgers. They include cooking beef burgers to at least medium doneness, with an internal temperature of 160 degrees farenheit, or until the center is light grey and the juices run clear.

The Live Stock and Meat Board says the bacteria involved in the fast-food illnesses is completely destroyed by thorough cooking. Do not eat raw ground beef. Never refreeze defrosted ground beef and cook ground beef as soon as possible after thawing. The reminders also include washing hands thoroughly with hot, soapy water before and after handling fresh meat, vegetables, and fruit, and avoid cross-contamination of raw foods with cooked foods. Another very simple reminder is to keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold, to minimize the opportunities for bacteria to grow. ©1992, Lyle Dean, Inc.

To Eat or Not to Eat? ...That Is the Holiday Season

Dilemma Christmas, New Year's, Office parties, Family gatherings...While the holidays brings pleasure to the soul, the season also brings 6 to 7 extra pounds of weight to each person who faces plate after plate of rich desserts, delicious feasts and special alcoholic concoctions. However, most people can run the gauntlet of traditional foods and drink without gaining additional weight if they follow some common-sense rules for eating, says Dr. Betty Alford, professor of nutrition and food sciences at Texas Woman's University.

"No one single food is good or bad -- it's food *habits* that are good and bad," explains Alford, who has many tips for holiday eating.

*Don't begin a new diet (except for medical reasons); try to maintain your weight.

*Don't deprive yourself before a party or arrive hungry. Before you go, drink a half a cup of skim milk or eat a few crackers or some fresh fruit to stem hunger.

*Don't let anyone push food on you; say "No, thank you."

*Don't be a member of the "clean plate club"; leave food when you are full.

*Don't focus on food at parties or receptions; focus on people instead.

*Don't forget to eat regularly and to choose wholesome foods every day.

*Do look over the entire food table before making your selections; get an idea of what the low-fat, healthy calorie choices are. Your first choices should be fruits and vegetables with light dressings, party sandwiches, slices of lean meats and light breads. If you taste a particular food and get a "feel" in your mouth that is fatty, eat one bite and leave the rest.

*Don't let stress dictate your eating habits.

*Do avoid whipped toppings, nuts, pecan pie, shortbread cookies and similar foods that are high in fat.

*Do exercise and remember your daily food requirements.

*Do remember that alcoholic beverages have no nutritional value; they are "liquid calories" and often cause weight gain during the holiday season.





Dual inspections combined

A new law that goes into effect January 1, 1994, will eliminate the need for commercial vehicle operators to have their commercial vehicles undergo dual inspections. The new inspection program, to be overseen by the Texas Department of Public Safety, will combine the U.S. Department of Transportation inspection with the State of Texas Safety inspection.

Beginning January 1. inspections obtained at other than an official commercial Texas State Inspection Station will not be accepted.

Commerical motor vehicle means any self-propelled or towed vehicle except a farm vehicle with a gross weight, registered weight or gross weight rating of less than

48,000 pounds used on a public highway to transport passengers or property when: the vehicle or combination of vehicle has a gross weight, registered or gross weight rating in excess of 26,000 pounds; or the vehicle is designed to transport more than 15 people including the driver; or the vehicle is used to transport an amount of hazardous materials requiring placarding under the federal Hazardous Materials Transportation Act.

those childhood visits to Santa Claus. The jolly man with the beard and red suit held you in his lap and listened intently to your toy-filled wish list. Photograph taken, you left a happy child, secure in the knowledge that Santa knew what you most wanted to find under the Christmas tree.

You're a parent now, standing in line at the mall, waiting for your son or daughter to enjoy one of your fondest memories. As the line moves forward, however, your child grows less eager to come face-to-face with the bearded stranger in the red suit. Reluctance eventually becomes outright refusal.

What's a disappointed parent to do? Chill out, says Dr. Linda Sluder, assistant professor of early childhood education at Texas Woman's University, and remember it's more important to do what's best for your child than to try to recreate your childhood experience.

"Parents have to remember that what children see is not always what we see as adults," Sluder says. "We have to step outside our ideal and ask ourselves what is really best for the child."

If your child doesn't want to visit Santa, don't force the issue. And be supportive, never critical, of his or her decision, Sluder says. "It's important to tell them, 'It's your decision and whatever you decide is OK."

Sluder offers the following tips on handling the Santa Claus predicament:

*Be accepting if your child initially says no to a visit with Santa, but also leave room for a change of heart. Say something such as "It's okay if you don't want to see Santa, but I'll be going to the mall later if you change your mind."

*Talk to your child about

You remember them well, what to expect, that Santa may seem large or that his beard may be scratchy, but he's a nice person. If your child enjoys reading about or watching videos of Santa, make the comparison to the "live" version.

When kids say "No No" to Mr. Ho Ho

*Schedule the visit to coincide with your child's peak time -- if he or she is a morning person, don't plan the trip for the evening. Also avoid times when your child is hungry, tired or just seems out of sorts.

*If possible, avoid week-

ends when the lines are long, the crowds are noisy and confusion reigns. It may be that your child is more frightened of all the commotion than of Santa himself.

*Say hello and talk briefly to Santa before putting your child in his lap.

*If you child is adamant about not visiting Santa, suggest other activities. Children who dread a personal encounter still can enjoy writing a letter to Santa or leaving milk and cookies out for him on Christmas Eve.

Tree needs plenty of water

A fresh-cut tree is a holiday tradition that links Christmases past with the present for many families.

It's also a big business in Michigan, where Christmas trees are a \$100 million-a-year industry.

This year, Michigan growers will harvest about 6 million Christmas trees. One million trees will stay in state; the rest will be shipped all over North America. Michigan has 150,000 acres in Christmas tree plantations.

Demand used to start after Thanksgiving, but the season keeps growing. Now people are asking for trees as early as mid-November, says Laurie Dornbush, executive director of the Michigan Christmas Tree Association in Okemos.

She puts up her Fraser fir -Dornbush calls it the "tree of the future" for its esthetic appeal and needle retention - at Thanksgiving and leaves it up through New Year's Day. In Washington, the Clinton family's main tree in the White House is a Fraser fir.

At Michigan State Universi-

ty, researchers are breeding Scotch pine to increase its desirable traits. Other work in progress is to document fertility and other growing requirements of Fraser, balsam and con-color firs, which are favored for fragrance and needle retention. This information will help growers meet increasing demand for these trees.

Here are some tips for keeping a fresh cut tree in good condition:

When you buy it, the outer foliage of fresh-cut trees should be green.

At home cut off 1/4 inch of the base before taking the tree indoors. That opens the trunk to water.

Check the water every day. Use plain water; no studies show an advantage to adding sugar or other additives, Dornbush says. Large trees can absorb as much as several quarts of water a day. Never let the tree dry out. If it does, a seal will form over the trunk and the only recourse is to take it down and make a new cut.

Keep Christmas trees as well as evergreen decorations away from heat, sunlight, candles and fireplaces.

Generally, Scotch pine trees are lowest priced, then spruce and firs with the trendy Fraser firs the most expensive.




