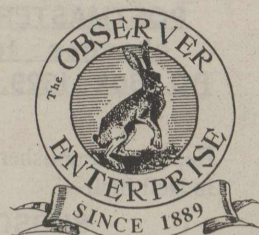

Saluting the Bronte ISD Class of 1994

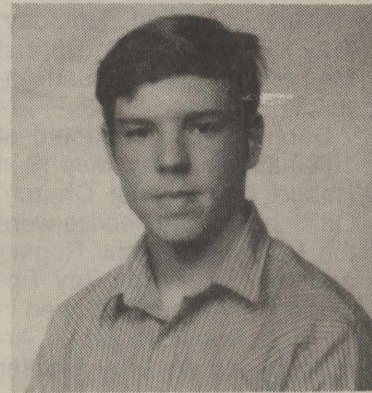
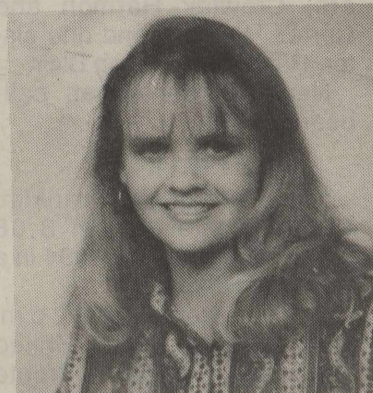

Silver Haired Legislature

Senior Texans will be going to polling places at senior centers throughout the state on May 24th, to elect their choice of candidates for the Fifth Silver Haired Legislature. Absentee ballots may be cast through May 20th.

On August 2, 1994 the 116 newly elected members will meet in Jester Hall on the Texas University campus to be sworn in, elect a new Speaker, Speaker Pro-Tem, Secretary and make committee assignments.

In the general session beginning September 12th. Representatives will meet in the State capitol, discuss issues concerning the senior citizens of Texas, form resolutions, debate them and submit them to State legislators for consideration at their regular session in 1995.

To be eligible to vote a person must be sixty years old or older, be a registered voter, and be a resident of the area in which the vote is cast. The northern region of the Concho Valley consists of Mason, McCulloch, Concho, Coke, and Sterling Counties. Incumbent Leo Kilmer now represents the northern region and is seeking re-election to a third term.

Jr./Sr. Dance

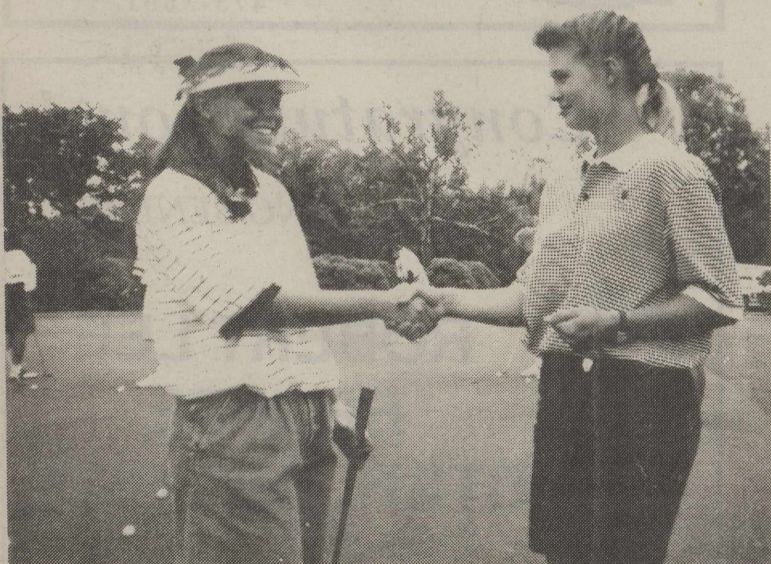

 As a social worker in many of the area nursing homes I am familiar with the reputation and services of our county based facilities. At this time the nursing home in Bronte is seeking to build on through a

bond election. I would like to express my support. Most nursing homes that are below 60 beds find it very difficult to be profitable. The economies of scale simply don't work out. From a financial standpoint it would be beneficial but even more advantageous is the issue of needs to the community.

We are obligated to serve the needs of our county residents. We are also obligated to set the standard of care that will be followed by other nursing homes. In our community we have always had a significant waiting list for these services. I don't foresee this situation changing. We have a very well run nursing home that deserves the support of this community through passage of the bond issue. As a county taxpayer I would be more than willing to pay an increase for the services for the elderly that are at a benchmark.

A Tomato A Day

At the risk of sounding like Andy Rooney, have you ever noticed that when people talk about tomatoes, it is almost always in a good context? Well, here is another good tomato story. It comes from Cornell University where new studies show that tomato juice extracts contain substances that inhibit formation of cancer-causing nitrosamines.

Previously, vitamin C was thought to be the only compound to have this effect, but when Cornell scientists removed the vitamin C from tomato juice, the juice still showed a strong ability to prevent formation of the cancer-causing chemical.

Cornell professor Joseph Hotchkiss says the whole tomato is more effective than just the vitamin C component. The study is further evidence that many fresh fruits and vegetables have natural cancer-preventing qualities that cannot be duplicated by vitamin supplements alone. In other words, he means you cannot have a lousy diet, then take a few vitamins to get the same benefit.

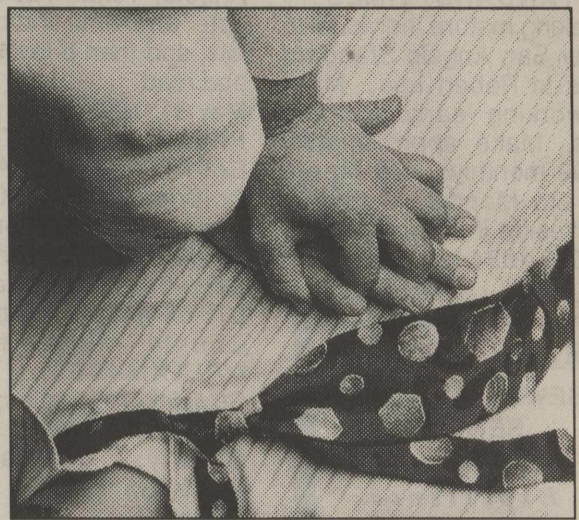

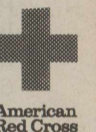

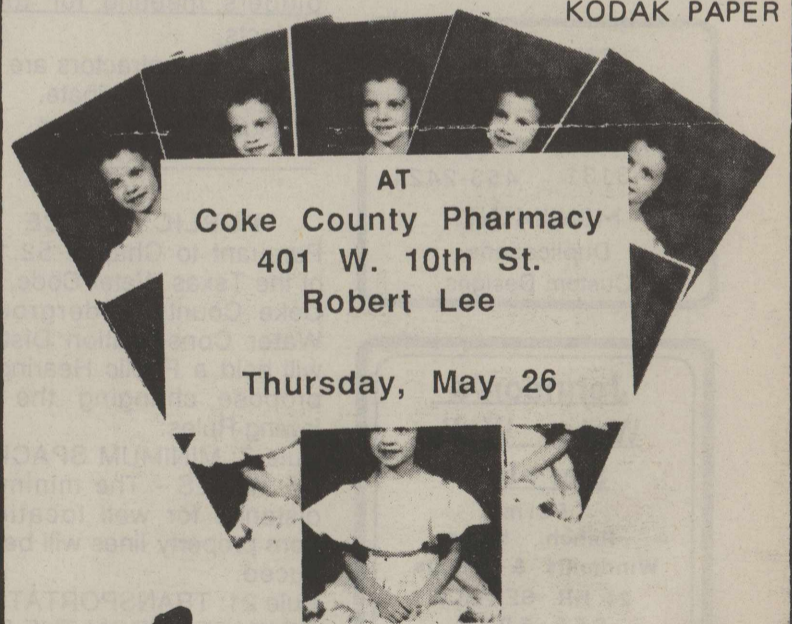
