Silver Haired Legislature

Senior Texans will be going to polling places at senior centers throughout the state on May 24th, to elect their choice of candidates for the Fifth Silver Haired Legislature, Absentee ballots may be cast through May 20th.

On August 2, 1994 the 116 newly elected members will meet in Jester Hall on the Texas University campus to be sworn in, elect a new Speaker, Speaker Pro-Tem, Secretary and make committee assignments.

In the general session beginning September 12th. Representatives will meet in the State capitol, discuss issues concerning the senior citizens of Texas, form resolutions, debate them and submit them to State legislators for consideration at their regular session in 1995.

To be eligible to vote a person must be sixty years old or older, be a registered voter, and be a resident of the area in which the vote is cast. The northern region of the Concho Valley consists of Mason, McCulloch, Concho, Coke, and Sterling Counties. Incumbent Leo Kilmer now represents the northern region and is seeking re-election to a third term.



MADD Meeting


