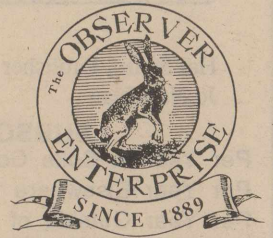

The 4-H Club will have two booths - their Ring Toss for drinks and a new Duck game.

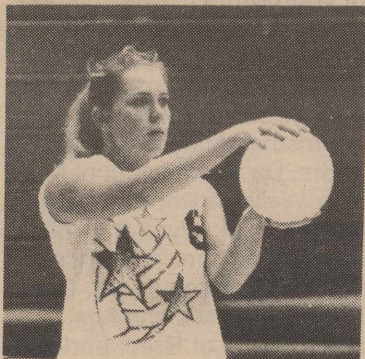
A longtime favorite - a Dunkin' Booth - will be sponsored by WCCCD with local celebrities as the "dunkees".

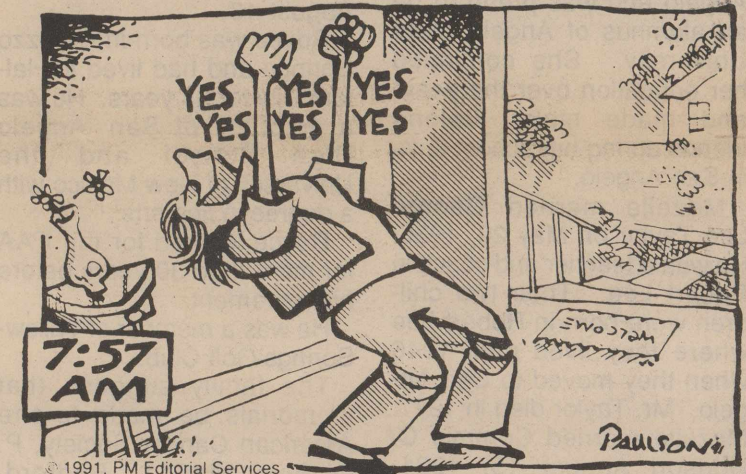
around us to do it."

**Letter to the Editor**

Dear Editor,

This is my statement and resignation from the board of directors of East Coke County Hospital District, (Bronte Nursing Home, on August 9, 1994.

To the Board of Directors of East Coke County Hospital District, August 9, 1994.

Lest I be misquoted, I have typed this statement, and I will read it aloud where all of you may hear.

I am in my third or fourth term as director, and have been Vice-President of this board for most of the time.

I have tried to be faithful in attendance to board meetings, and have tried to be available in case of any emergency.

I have tried to fulfill my responsibility to the tax payers who elected me to represent them on this board. I have tried to be faithful to their trust. In ignorance, I have made many mistakes, but it was through ignorance and not intentionally.

From the time this board voted to place Candy as Assistant Administrator, (with opposition, and the minutes of a prior meeting of this board will show, and by whom the opposition came) I have been taking flack from many people who ask, "WHY DO WE NEED AN ASSISTANT ADMINISTRATOR?" and, "HOW MUCH ARE YOU PAYING HER?" On each occasion, I have asked them, "WHY DON'T YOU GO TO THE OTHER BOARD MEMBERS?" and their response has been, "YOU ARE THE ONLY ONE WHO WILL LISTEN."

Since Sondra has been hired, I have had much, much, flack from many of the taxpayers. Some have said, "I WISH I HAD VOTED AGAINST THE BOND ISSUE." These complaints are coming from those who support the nursing home with their prayers and their presence when needed.

Some four or five years ago, I made a motion that nothing be purchased, (WITH THE EXCEPTIONS OF NECESSITIES WITHOUT THE BOARD'S APPROVAL, AND THE PROPOSAL TO PURCHASE BE IN THE HANDS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FIVE DAYS PRIOR TO THE MEETING. This Motion died without a second. Now

we find ourselves in debt well over one-hundred thousand dollars, when at that time we were operating in the black with a good cushion so we could do what was needed to be done without being cramped financially.

I serve all of you notice that I will do all within my power outside this board to bring about some changes here in this institution.

It is the policy of this institution that all those who resign so state in a written letter. I therefore give you my resignation from this board as of now.

I pray God will open your eyes to what is going on here. May God bless you all.

I am happy you are my friends.

**City officials attend three day meeting**

Mayor Jackie Walker, Mayor Pro-tem Beth Prather, Council-member John Conley, and Council-member Kelly Nichols, were in Amarillo July 28 - July 31 to attend the 29th Annual Institute for Mayors, Council-members, and Commissioners. The three-day meeting provided an opportunity for municipal officials to attend workshops addressing current municipal issues. In addition, the Institute offered a chance to visit with elected officials from across Texas to learn how other cities are coping with the challenges facing municipal government today.

During the meeting, Institute attendees were offered a number of sessions on economic development strategies, law enforcement, infrastructure planning and improvements, and financial forecasting. In addition, roundtable discussion groups were held to allow for an informal exchange of information among municipal officials from cities of a similar size.

John Sharp, Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, addressed the Institute delegates at the Friday Opening General Session.

Mr. Sharp provided delegates with an overview of the "Forces of Change" report prepared by the Comptroller's office.

U. S. Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison spoke at Saturday's delegate luncheon. Senator Hutchison gave the Institute delegates insight into some of the issues facing Congress this year.

Jackie Walker, Mayor of Robert Lee, moderated a round table breakfast for small cities.

More than 600 elected officials attended the meeting. The meeting was sponsored by the Association of Mayors, Council-members, and Commissioners, an affiliate of the Texas Municipal League. The League is a voluntary association of over 1000 Texas cities. The city of Robert Lee is a member of the Texas Municipal League.

# HEALTH NOTES

## White-Coat Hypertension

The jump in blood pressure that seems to occur only at a doctor's office is called white-coat hypertension, and is usually not treated because of its apparent temporary nature. However, researchers in Switzerland reported in the American Heart Association journal *Hypertension* (4-94) that white-coat hypertension might be an early warning sign of high blood pressure instead of just stress over having to visit a doctor.

They studied how salt is handled by the kidneys in people with normal blood pressure, high blood pressure and white-coat hypertension. The results suggest that patients with white-coat hypertension have kidney function very much like those with untreated high blood pressure. The Swiss researchers say the results may lead doctors to view white-coat hypertension as something other than an innocuous condition.

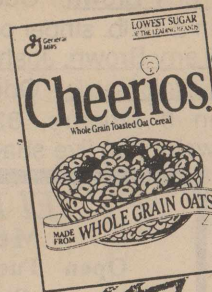
