# Newest Cowboy Mike Quinn ready for backup role, one step away from starting QB

IRVING (AP)—If you watched the Pittsburgh Steelers demolish the Baltimore Ravens 37-0 Nov. 9, 1997, you might remember Mike Quinn. And if you didn't blink during the two passes he threw, you'd have seen the entire breadth of his NFL experi-

ence. One completion for 10 yards. Now, Quinn is one injury away from quarterbacking the Dallas Cowboys. The Troy Aikman void—the heart of Dallas' offense will miss at least

four games with a broken collarbone — has made the former Stephen F. Austin and Houston prep standout next in line behind Jason Garrett. "I've been in this situation before, but the stakes are higher now," Quinn said Thursday.

Quinn has one advantage: the new Cowboys offense installed by coach Chan Gailey is old news for him. Quinn learned it in Pittsburgh while Gailey was the Steelers' offensive coordinator. "It's very similar and I feel very

confident," Quinn said. "I've been with the system for two years now." And Gailey shows absolute confidence in Quinn's familiarity with the offensive scheme. "Does he know the system? I know

he does," Gailey said. But Quinn hasn't had much practice with his new team. Consider that when Aikman was healthy, Carrett had taken only about 15 snaps in practice since training camp, Gailey said.

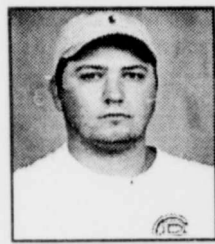

## Big 12 continues to take lumps in 1998

Welcome to year three of the Big 12 Conference. Ain't nothing changed but the rent.

There's Texas, still getting run roughshod because they house the worst defense in the history of college football. Yes, the history of college football. Texas trailed UCLA 35-3 last week. At the half.

More than likely, though, Nebraska will again run through the pack with reckless abandon, and claim another Big 12 crown.

Just for prediction's sake, I believe the Red Raiders will be playing Nebraska in the Big 12 Championship game. The Red Raiders' spectacular defense will carry them that far.

## Tech ready to crush Bulldogs

Like the grapes in a fine Fresno wine, the Texas Tech Red Raider football squad will look to squash the Fresno State Bulldogs when the two foes butt heads at 6 p.m. Saturday at Jones Stadium.

"This team has tremendous speed," said senior linebacker Ty Ardoin. "With them being from California, that is most definitely a speed state. With the recruits that USC and UCLA do not get, Fresno will most definitely get."

In fact, of the 102 Bulldog players, only six reside from states outside the Sunshine State.

Saturday's game is the first-ever meeting for the two schools but the eighth trip to Texas for Fresno State. The Bulldogs are 1-5-1 in their first seven Lone Star state appearances, with the last being a 30-30 tie with Texas-El Paso in 1994.

As for the Red Raiders (2-0 overall), they enter the third week of collegiate action as one of the hottest teams in the Big 12.

Despite tackling non-conference opponents Texas El-Paso and North Texas, the Red Raider defense has surrendered a conference-low three points in eight quarters of play.

The Red Raider defense, currently ranked No. 11 in the nation, will look to stifle an offensive attack featuring one of college football's most explosive running backs in the person of Fresno State's Jaime Kimbrough.

In last week's 29-21 loss to then-No. 16-ranked Colorado, Kimbrough accounted for 60 percent of the Bulldog offensive output as he finished the day with 107 yards rushing on 22 carries while catching six passes out of the backfield for an additional 91 yards.

"Our first priority is to stop the run every week," said senior defensive end Montae Reager of the task of stopping Kimbrough. "From that, we really can force them to pass the ball down the field."

On the other side of the ball, the Red Raider offense, which is currently the top-ranked offense in the Big 12, will look to gain over 500 yards of offense for the third consecutive week.

Led once-again by senior super-sub Matt Tittle, Tech will hope to have a balanced attack that has produced 524.5 yards per contest, including 299 yards rushing per game.

"I think mixing it up early will be the main thing for our offense," Tittle

said. "I think we'll look to pass and run, both, and then try to get it to Ricky (Williams) late in the game to run a lot."

Williams has run for an average of 210.5 yards per game with an average of 6.1 yards-per-carry. He will be looked upon to carry the offensive load against a speedy and aggressive Fresno State defense.

"It helps us a lot when Ricky does well," Tittle said of his teammate. "It keeps the defense off-balance, and

late in the game it just makes my job that much easier."

For the Bulldogs (0-1 overall), the defense gave up 378 yards to Colorado last week and forced two fumbles while recording a sack.

"They're going to be pretty tough," Williams said of the Bulldog defense.

"They have a lot of speed and experience on defense. They're probably the best team we've faced this year. It's going to be good competition."

For the first time since 1989, Tech

has started the season with two consecutive wins. During that season, the Red Raiders finished with a 9-3 record and an All-American Bowl appearance.

Despite the optimism surrounding the Red Raider program, the focus still remains on game No. 3.

"We're just going to keep doing what we've been doing each game," Williams said. "All the work we did this summer as a team is paying off in these first few weeks."
