

# Valdez's records given at luncheon

Last week, a luncheon was held by local businessmen to discuss plans for a recognition campaign for Texas Tech basketball. Confidential student information regarding former Red Raider Nick Valdez was distributed to those in attendance, along with other materials.

The Buckley Amendment protects all information, both personal and educational, that could potentially identify a student under penalty of federal law.

If the information about Valdez was distributed without his consent, it would be a violation of federal law. Senior Associate Athletics director Pat Britz said he does not know the details of the situation, but if the university wanted to release such information, it would require the consent of the student.

"The student would have to give the university permission to release the information to the general public," he said.

It is not known what kind of comment Tuesday. information the records contained.

### Friends, family mourn Tech student who died Friday in car crash

Hundreds of mourners filled the Matador Room of the Student Union building Tuesday afternoon in memory of Julie Kathleen Kyle, a graduate student studying psychology and a graduate assistant, who died in a car accident Friday.

Deborah Jean Harding, a teaching assistant and friend of Kyle's, began the ceremony.

"We've come here together today to remember Julie, who many of us called student, teacher and most of all, friend," she said.

Glistening eyes were seen throughout the crowd as teachers, friends and family shared their stories about Kyle and her impact on their lives.

Robert Baker, a biology professor and Kyle's uncle, spoke on behalf of the family.

"She's been a great daughter and a true friend," he said. "She was (the family's) hero. They all thought they were a better person for having

known her. If you had known Julie, you knew how much her smile could convey. ... The world needs more Julies. She provided a unique perspective to our universe. Thank you, Julie, for all you have given us."

Some of Kyle's instructors and advisers spoke at the event. Chairwoman of the Psychology Department Ruth Maki shared the course evaluations from classes that Kyle had taught in, reading the warm and positive things Kyle's former students said in the evaluations.

"Because her life was cut short, the Psychology Department has lost a very good teacher," she said in closing.

Susan Hendrick, a professor of psychology, reflected on the positive impact Kyle had on the research group Kyle and Hendrick participated in.

"She was an integral and humorous part of our research group," she said. "She was a source of light."

Nancy Bell, Kyle's minor adviser and professor of human development and family studies, said she will miss Kyle.

"She emanated warmth," she said. "She had the ability to make instant connections with people, which is a great ability to have."

Friends of Klye spoke at the memorial as well, including senior Stacy Bridges, a technical communications major from Lubbock, and Garland Peterson, both local musicians who played "Fire and Rain" by James Taylor and "Live Forever" by Billy Joe Shaver in remembrance of Kyle. She was their biggest fan and always cheered the loudest even when their songs were a "dud," Peterson said.

Fellow classmates of Kyle spoke about how much she had enriched their lives during the time they had known her and how she encouraged everyone around her to enjoy life.

Sporting an apron decorated with watermelon slices and humming 'America the Beautiful," one Lubbock woman protested the Iraq situation

Elsa Sabath mirrored Martin Luther King Jr.'s belief in nonviolent civil disobedience when she refused to leave the George H. Mahon Federal Building after it closed. She was arrested and charged with trespassing just after 5:30 p.m.

Sabath, figuring she would be arrested, said it was worth the added hardship on her, given what American soldiers in the Middle East are sacrificing.

"That's all I have to give," she said. "If we over here can't sacrifice a little bit, then we're a lost cause. Nothing's





BRYAN (AP) — A former Texas A&M student who videotaped a sexual encounter with his girlfriend without her knowledge and showed the footage to his fraternity brothers must apologize to her in a half-page ad in the campus newspaper.

Brennan Bice, 21, was sentenced Monday to five years probation and a month in jail. He also was ordered to did not know whether it was considtake out a half-page ad in the Texas A&M student newspaper, apologizing to his former girlfriend.

Bice was charged under a littleknown law that makes it a felony to videotape or photograph someone without consent if the images are intended for arousal or sexual gratification.

Police said he videotaped consensual sex with his unsuspecting girlfriend, a freshman at Texas A&M, on Oct. 8 and showed the footage to as many as 15 members of his fraternity. When the woman found out, she notified authorities.

Bice was arrested and pleaded guilty to a fourth-degree felony charge, which is punishable by up to two years in jail and a \$10,000 fine.

The former girlfriend addressed him Monday during an emotional sentencing hearing at the Brazos County Courthouse, the Bryan-College Station Eagle reported in its Tuesday editions.

You violated me in ways I don't think you'll ever understand," she said.

She was afraid to be on campus the past five months because she did not know who had seen the tape, she said.

"My freshman year of college has been a relentless nightmare," she said.

Bice, who was suspended from A&M and now attends Blinn College in Brenham, was taken into custody after the hearing Monday, the first day of Spring Break. He will remain at the Brazos County Jail until Sunday. Then, he will serve the rest of his 30day jail sentence on weekday nights, said his attorney, Travis Bryan III.

Under a plea agreement, Bice also must pay a \$1,000 fine and perform 250 hours of community service.

### Ex-A&M student Air force tested U.S. Facing veto, U.S. and must buy apology ad arsenal's biggest bomb Britain extend deadline

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Air Force on Tuesday tested for the first time the biggest conventional bomb in the U.S. military's arsenal, a 21,000pound munition that could play a dramatic role in an attack on Iraq.

Chervl Irwin, a Pentagon spokeswoman, said the test was completed at Eglin Air Force Base, Fla., but she ered successful.

The bomb, known as the Massive Ordnance Air Blast, or MOAB, is guided to its target by satellite signals. It was dropped out the rear of a C-130 transport plane, officials said.

The bomb is so powerful that it's detonation was expected to create a mushroom cloud visible for miles.

Asked about the test at a Pentagon news conference. Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld would not say whether it would be used in an Iraq war and he declined to discuss its capabilities.

"This is not small," he said.

Separately, the Pentagon's No. 2 official said in a speech to the Veterans of Foreign Wars that if President Bush decides to invade Iraq, it will be a "war of liberation" as well as an effort to rid Iraq of weapons banned by the United Nations.

"Those very weapons are the source of our concern," said Deputy Secretary of Defense Paul Wolfowitz. "The issue is not about Iraqi oil. If the United States had wanted access to Iraqi oil, we could have dropped our whole policy 12 years ago, lifted the sanctions and let Saddam Hussein have his weapons of mass destruction.

"No, if there's going to be a war, it will be a war to disarm Saddam's weapons of mass terror," he said. "But it will also be, like wars that you fought in, a war of liberation, a war to secure peace and freedom."

The U.S. military is putting the final pieces of combat power in place in anticipation of an order by Bush to attack Iraq and depose Hussein. More than 200,000 U.S. forces are now within striking range.



UNITED NATIONS (AP) -Facing almost certain defeat, the United States and Britain signaled Tuesday they would agree to a short extension of a deadline for Saddam Hussein to disarm or face war - but a 45-day delay proposed by six swing council nations appeared out of the question.

The Bush administration had talked of a vote as early as Tuesday, but with France and Russia threatening to veto the current draft resolution, and without the minimum nine "yes" votes, it held up action in the council.

The U.S. campaign for votes suffered another blow when a spokesman for Pakistan's ruling party said the country will abstain on the resolution. Azeem Chaudhry made the announcement as Pakistani Prime Minister Zafarullah Khan Jamali appealed for Baghdad to be given more time to disarm, saying: "We do not want to see the destruction of the Iraqi people, the destruction of the country.

But Iraq's U.N. ambassador Mohammed Al-Douri, speaking to Security Council on Tuesday afternoon, insisted that his country has made "the strategic decision to rid itself of its weapons of mass destruction." Iraq, Al-Douri said, "reiterates its readiness to cooperate," under the Resolution 1441, authorizing weapons inspections of Iraq. "We will convincingly respond to anyone who has any doubts about Iraq's cooperation."

White House spokesman Ari Fleischer said the resolution would be put to a vote this week. He indicated a readiness to compromise, but said a proposal being floated to push back the March 17 deadline by a month-was "a non-starter."

"There is room for diplomacy here," Fleischer said. "Not much room and not much time."

Both the United States and Britain, which is under intense pressure at home to get U.N. backing for any military action, said they were willing to negotiate the deadline and other changes to the resolution.

# Students can call Tech parents for help while on road

Beaches, bikinis and beer often characterize the week-long party referred to as Spring Break. For thousands of college students, long trips will end at resorts and hotels for relief from studying to going wild.

But for many students, safety is the last thought on their minds.

Robert Byers, administrator of Texas Tech Health Sciences Center department of forensic pathology and chief investigator of the Lubbock County Medical Examiner, has seen dangers of roads during Spring Break.

"This time of year, the roads become congested, and drivers need to be aware of what is in front, back and on the sides of them," he said.

Byers said he has witnessed the problems with ignorant drivers. He said speed and being in a hurry often can be causes for accidents.

"We have seen many people lose their lives because of stupidity," he said. "Drivers, as well as passengers, need to be smart and wear their seat belts."

Accidents happen every day, but during any holiday, the chance increases. Distractions can occur during

road trips and cause problems for the driver, Byers said.

"Eating, the radio and other things can hinder a driver's ability to react," he said. "People should expect other people on the road to do everything wrong, and you have to know your options."

The Tech Department of Parent Relations offers a Road Raiders Safe Travel Network for all students who plan to travel throughout the year. The organization enables Tech students to call a list of parents at any time for roadside assistance, help on a road trip or a place to sleep for the night.

Trudy Putteet, director of Parent Relations, explained the origin and reason behind it.

"It was started by a group of Tech parents, who wanted to treat students the way they want their children treated while on the road," she said. "It is designed to help students in any way possible whether it deals with accidents, a student needing a break or anything."

Driving alone can cause fatigue, which can cause collisions, Byers said .. "It is best if you can find a person

to keep you occupied but that doesn't

distract you," he said. "And this program is great because it gives any student a chance to get out of their tiredness.'

The program now consists of 2,400 parents stretching from Atlanta, Ga., to Baltimore, Md., covering several part of

United Road States. The most concentrated Safety area lies within the state of Texas and the surrounding states. Many stu-

dents have used the program

"It is up to the student to make the call, and the parents encourage it," Putteet said. "We often hear about stories from parents and students about how they helped each other.'



In my house, the apocalypse was coming every day. Say your prayers because at any moment, Jesus could come and sweep you away. Do your chores because at any moment, fire could rain down from Heaven and destroy everything you love.

I remember the uproar last year when India and Pakistan were "on the nuclear brink."


I interviewed a pair of students from India and Pakistan and got the same answer both times. They said, "We've been doing this for a long time, and you guys really need to calm down."

Turns out, the American press was more worried about war in Kashmir than the people who actually come from there. The world is not a playground, and these nations are not run by children.





dents," he said. "A single passing statement about life may make them think, 'I've never thought about it that way.' It takes time. They have to do it themselves.'

Catherine Prose, interim director of the Buddy Holly Center, is a former student of Kreneck.

After completing her undergraduate work at Cameron University in Lawton, Kan., Prose said she began searching for a university for her graduate studies.

"I would visit schools that were seven hours away, and when I would get there, the art professors would meet with me for only 15 minutes," she said. "When I visited Tech, I thought Kreneck was very kind and very knowledgeable. He talked with me for an hour and showed me the Art building and the facilities. His personal touch is what really got me to come here."

When a professor has an impact on his students as Kreneck has, former students will look for a way to pay respect, he said.

"Across the university, you'll be able to find people willing to do something like this for the people who have been very powerful and had an influence on their lives," Arredondo said. Kreneck said he was moved by the tribute and has no immediate plans to

stop teaching.

"Well now, when I first found out about this wonderful surprise, the first thing I said was 'no matter how many times you hint at it, I'm not going to retire," he said, laughingly.

"Impressions of Llano Estacado" will be showcased through April 19 in the Landmark Gallery. Kreneck's retrospective exhibit will be displayed until Aug. 17 at the Tech Museum.

### HBO files counterclaim against ex-Sopranos star

LOS ANGELES (AP) - HBO fired back Tuesday at "The Sopranos" star lames Gandolfini in court, saying the actor must settle his contract dispute or risk being liable for more than \$100 million in damages.

In a counterclaim filed in Superior Court, HBO is "seeking the damages that will result from his failure and refusal to perform his contract," said Bert Fields, the attorney for the cable channel.

"Those damages are staggering. It would mean the loss of two years of 'The Sopranos' that is probably in excess of \$100 million," Fields said Tuesday.

Gandolfini, who plays New Jersey mob boss Tony Soprano in the hit HBO drama, had filed a Superior Court complaint claiming HBO breached his contract.

HBO missed a deadline for advising him that his services would be needed for a fifth season, scheduled to begin filming March 24, the actor alleged.

Fields called Gandolfini's claims "frivolous" and "demonstrably false."

The complaint did not mean Gandolfini would fail to report for filming, Gandolfini's attorney, Martin Singer, said last week. A call to Singer seeking comment Tuesday was not immediately returned.

Fields said Gandolfini must do more than come to work.

"We can't proceed if he doesn't affirm his contract," the lawyer for HBO said. "If he sticks with the position he's taking now, we won't have another season of 'The Sopranos.'"

The dispute is linked to Gandolfini's salary demands, Fields said. Although HBO offered him a "very generous increase, he asked for a massive one," he said.

Gandolfini earns about \$400,00 an episode and is seeking \$1 million an episode.

On Sunday, Gandolfini received a Screen Actors Guild award for his role in "The Sopranos." In his acceptance speech, he called HBO "a great place



Muse agreed the concert was a good way to promote women composers.


"The concert is a good celebration of women in music and their accomplishments," she said.







# Tech defeats TCU to gain series lead

The No. 21 ranked Texas Tech baseball team finished off its nonconference schedule in style Tuesday night.

Tech (16-5) defeated the Horned Frogs of TCU (11-9) 6-3. The win gives the Red Raiders a 3-2 advantage over TCU on the season.

The game began with the makings of a high scoring duel. TCU put up two runs on two hits in the top of the first and added one more run in the second.

Tech responded with single runs in the first and second innings as well.

Junior starting pitcher Tanner McElroy then pitched four scoreless innings, struck out six and notched his first career win in his longest career start. He said he calmed down and just let his team help him.

"I just had the same approach," he said. "I knew that if I went out there and threw strikes, and we had a great defense, I knew they could play behind me."

In the top of the seventh inning, junior Aaron Jones took over for McElroy, but he struggled and only threw 1/3 of an inning. Junior Jeff Karstens then stepped in and finished out the remaining 2 2/3 innings, fanning three to get his third save of the season.

The Raiders tacked on a pair of two-run innings in the third and sixth to seal the deal at 6-3.

McElroy said the 6-3 win was a change of pace in the Tech versus TCU series.

"It's been a slugfest with TCU all year," he said. "So it feels good

to come in here and only give up three runs as a staff."

Tech head coach Larry Hays said he was pleased with the way his team stayed focused and fought.

"We just kept battling," he said. "That's the one thing this team has done is battle. We gave up a couple of runs early with our defense, but then Tanner shut them down."

Hays also said he was pleased to see Tech win 6-3, rather than in a high-scoring shootout.

"We didn't need one of those 15-10 deals," he said. "I think it helped."

Junior shortstop T.J. Bruce, who went 1-2 with two RBIs, said he expected another high scoring game as well, but instead it turned into a classic defensive battle.

"Statistics have usually found that these games are high scoring on the weekdays," he said. "But both pitchers, today, for both teams just came out here and competed. Tanner and Jeff doing what they had to do, letting our defense work, and we came out on top."

Bruce said another bright spot for the Raiders on Tuesday was their combination of all aspects of the game.

'We played well as a team," he said. "I think we did all aspects pretty good (Tuesday). We pitched well, we played defense well, and we hit when we had to."

Senior leftfielder Scooter Jordan went 2-2, including an RBI double in the sixth, walked three times and knocked in a run against TCU. He said the Raiders hit well in the right situations.

Tech golf teams both finish fourth

The Texas Tech men's golf team moved up five spots in the final round of the Louisiana Classics tournament to finish in a tie for fourth place.

Tech entered the final day of the tournament held in Lafayette, La., in a tie for ninth place but made a move to step up in the field.

Andrew Dresser shot a 70 in the final round to finish with a 214 for the 54-hole tournament, which is his best of the season. The player's individual totals landed him in a ninthplace tie.

Mark Hull shot a 74 to finish the tournament with a 220, which put him in 25th place. Erik Stenman joined Dresser with a low round of

70, which put him in 40th place, and final round 316 after leading the tour-Brooks Kelly finished in 61st place with a 228.

Tech finished ahead of conference foes Missouri, Kansas State, Kansas and Colorado in the tournament, but finished behind conference rival Texas A&M, which finished third.

The Red Raiders will take to the course again in the Cleveland Golf Championships on March 18 and 19 in Aiken, S.C.




