#### RL resident dies in accident

Longtime Robert Lee resident Faustino Gloria died in a grinding accident between the car he was driving and a Mertzon-based cattle truck Monday night at 11:45 pm. The wreck occurred 9.3 miles south of Robert Lee on Texas 208 when the empty cattle truck veered across the center stripe and struck the car broadside.

Gloria, 81, apparently was killed instantly while his passenger, Lilly Reese, 30, also of Robert Lee, was taken to Shannon Medical Center where she was treated and released. Driver of the truck, Jerry D. Martin, 28, of San Angelo, was uninjured. A San Angelo ambulance and the Quail Valley volunteer fire department responded to the accident.

Wyatt earlier had received approval from the county commissioners to expand his office by shifting his allotted budget funds, and did not increase the cost to the county, Judge Walker told the Observer/Enterprise.

"We are excited about being here and having the opportunity for our children to have the same types of great experiences I had as a child growing up in a rural atmosphere, rather than in the city," Arthur said of his family's impending move from Lubbock. Until their house is built, he will be commuting weekly from Lubbock.

"For me, the decision to return to Coke County was easy," Arthur said. "After being away for a long time, I'm coming home."

Arthur and his wife of 26 years, Nancy, who also is an attorney, have two sons, Lauren, 17, and Frank, 9, and a daughter, Emily Ruth, 5.

Arthur lived in Bronte in the early 1950s, and later attended school for several years in Silver during its oil boom days of the 1950s. His brother, Danny, also attended high school in Robert Lee and played football for the Steers.

"I keep bumping into people that I grew up with, and I'm really looking forward to renewing old acquaintances," Arthur said.

Arthur and his wife are active in the scouting and campfire programs in Lubbock. Arthur has served for the last two years as a den leader in the cub scouts, and is committee president of the only all High Adventure scout team in Lubbock, supervising scouts who are actively involved in survival training, deep snow backpacking, cave exploration, and scuba diving. Lane and Nancy earned their bachelor's degrees together in journalism and their master's degrees together in mass communications, then went on to become the first man and wife team to complete law school together - at the same time - at Texas Tech. Students were also honored for their achievements in certain areas. These foundation awards are among the highest awards given by the chapter and the recipients should be commended for their accomplishments.





The latest information comes from the University of Wisconsin and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. A review of police and hospital reports in Wisconsin for one year focused on head injuries of motorcyclists. The study showed sixty-three percent of motorcyclists injured were not wearing helmets and they were more than twice as likely to be hospitalized for a head injury than were riders wearing helmets.

The cost for initial hospital treatment was eight times as much for those not wearing helmets, in part because more of the riders not wearing helmets were the ones injured. However, even the individual hospital costs for unhelmeted riders averaged five thousand dollars more than for riders wearing helmets, because injuries tended to be more serious.

#### Pecan Nut Casebearer Control

With the crazy weather and variations in temperature this spring, precise prediction for control of the pecan nut casebearer will be difficult. Unless there is a tremendous load of casebearer eggs present on the nutlets, it is suggested not to spray for control of casebearers for several reasons. One, with the possible heavy crop of nuts that it looks like we may have, some

thinning will have to take place or your nuts will not fill out completely. It is better to have fewer nuts that are filled out completely than a tremendous load that is only half filled. Also, if you spray when there are little or no casebearer eggs present, besides wasting money and time you will damage the beneficial population of insects that will help us down the road on aphids, etc. Yellow pecan aphid is a much larger pest for our area than the pecan nut casebearer.

Only spray if you can find numerous eggs. These will be on the ends of the small nutlets and will be white in color and about the size of a pin head. Unless there are around 20 percent of the nutlets infested with eggs, I would suggest not spraying.


As you can tell, our class has different interests. Our inconsistency has somehow brought us extremely close together. The high school will be lost without us to look upon.

#### 1. CHECK IT OUT.

When your power goes out, check all fuses and breakers. If they're O.K., check with your neighbors. If power is out around you, CALL WTU You'll find our number in your local phone book, or on your WIU bill!

**2. KEEP WTU PHONE** LINES OPEN.

> From the moment you call WTU, help is on the way so a second call isn't necessary. Please leave our lines open for other callers.

**3. REPORT FALLEN** UTILITY LINES. If you see a fallen power

line, don't even go near it! And, keep others away, too! Call WIU, the police, or the fire department immediately.

#### 4. UNPLUG APPLIANCES. It's a good idea to turn off your air conditioner and unplug televisions, major appliances, and computers during storms. If you experience an outage, you may want to leave them

unplugged until power is

do not plug it directly into your circuit breaker box. It's unsafe — especially for repair crews. Plug appliances and lamps directly into the generator.

6. PLEASE BE PATIENT.

You may see a WTU truck in your neighborhood leaving before your power comes back on. This is not unusual. We send people out to assess the extent and cause of an outage. The source of your outage might be several blocks away.

#### 7. CHECK ON YOUR NEIGHBORS.

Be mindful of neighbors who may have special needs.

8. TURN YOUR FRONT PORCH LIGHT ON.

Turning on your porch light lets WTU crews know your electricity is back on.

9. FOLLOW LOCAL NEWS MEDIA.
