Fewer MV notices received

Incidents of people not receiving a renewal notice from the State to register their vehicles and trailers are becoming more and more frequent. Initially, the problem could be traced to the conversion of motor vehicle records to a new computer system in February of this year. However, most of the lost records have been re-built and still, registrants report daily of not receiving renewal notices.

The Texas Department of Transportation is giving this situation top priority. Their records indicate 535,000 fewer renewal notices mailed for the first quarter of this year than for the same time period

last year. Even though the renewal is a courtesy, and not required to be sent, TxDOT recognizes the importance of the renewals and the dependence of the driving public on receiving the notices.

Until this problem is resolved, the Coke County Tax Office urges residents to check your registration expiration dates and mark them on your calendar. If you are one of those unfortunate enough not to receive a renewal notice, this may save you from, at least, a penalty for late renewal, and at most, a ticket for driving with expired registration, plus the penalty for late renewal.

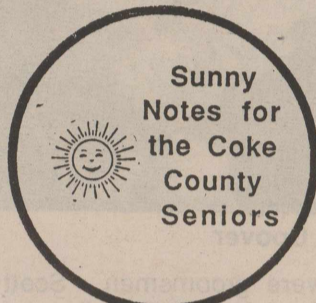

Optimists vs Pessimists

Optimists are likely to live longer than pessimists. The *Journal of Houston's Methodist Hospital* reviews a series of studies suggesting that a positive attitude is sometimes the difference between getting well and not getting well.

A University of Minnesota study found state of mind to be a better predictor of death than damage to the heart, cholesterol levels or blood pressure. Of the twenty-five most pessimistic men in the study, twenty-one died within eight years. Of the twenty-five most optimistic, only six died.

Studies at Duke University and Montreal Heart Institute also showed that optimists are more likely to survive after the diagnosis of heart disease compared to pessimists.

Another study found the more pessimistic graduates of Harvard were more likely to have had a serious chronic disease such as arteriosclerosis by age forty-five. However, clinical psychologist Lois Friedman says sometimes you have to deal with negative emotions before you can get a more optimistic outlook.

sure you have lots of cold, healthful beverages on hand. Avoid sugary drinks and sodas, they tend to increase thirst. Ice cold water is your best bet, but try the following ideas for something refreshingly different.

*In a blender puree four pieces of peeled and sliced fresh fruit, like peaches, pears, or nectarines with one tablespoon of lemon juice. Pour into ice cube trays and freeze until firm. Serve cubes in iced tea or chilled soda water. *Cut the sweetness of fruit juices with chilled soda water. Or prepare lemonade from concentrate, adding an extra can of water; then blend in two cups cranraspberry juice and chill thoroughly. *Cool off by snacking on frozen strawberries, grapes, bananas or peach slices. Or simply cut the top off a kiwi fruit and eat the juicy flesh with a spoon.

By playing it safe you should take precautions when transporting picnic foods.

*Make sure cooked foods are fully chilled before packing. *Pack perishable foods in coolers with ice or frozen ice packs. Place the most perishable items closest to the ice. *Leftovers should go back into the cooler immediately. Meat, dairy products, and other perishable foods will spoil in one to two hours. Discard any foods that are questionable.

Remember to pack a safe picnic and have fun this summer!

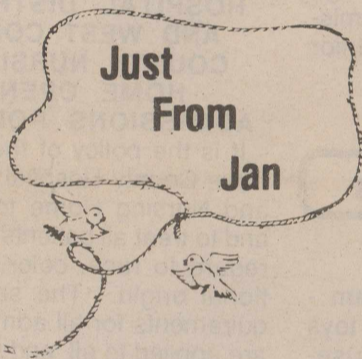
Nichols completes required course

Tips for healthy picnic fare

It's time to indulge in one of the season's favorite traditions gathering family and friends and setting out on a picnic. So pack your basket or cooler with nutritious foods and head for the park, backyard, or wherever the sun beckons. The following ideas will help get your next picnic off to a healthful start.

Banish boredom by letting your personal style set the tone for outdoor enjoyment. Experiment with nutritious food combinations, or give old favorites a healthy boost.


*Add new life to salads and such by substituting brown rice, bulgur (cracked wheat) or couscous for pasta. Toss in chickpeas or other beans for a fiber rich boost. *Savor seasonal ingredients by tossing potato or pasta salads with plenty of chopped red, green and yellow peppers. Cherry tomatoes, sliced zucchini or

yellow squash make colorful additions. *Fold fresh apricot and peach chunks into chicken or turkey salads. Or go for the exotic - try slice papaya and mango with assorted greens and a fruit flavored dressing. *Use a light touch when preparing mayonnaise based salads. Reduce the amount called for, or substitute half the mayonnaise with a lowfat variety and half with nonfat plain yogurt. *Go beyond ordinary bread and tuck sandwich fillings into crisp french loaves or whole grain pita bread slice horizontally; line with sandwich ingredients and cut into wedges. *Focaccia (Italian flat bread) also makes an interesting sandwich base. Layer with thin strips of lowfat cheese and garden fresh tomato slices. Sprinkle with basil and oregano, then drizzle with balsamic or red wine vinegar and a little olive oil.



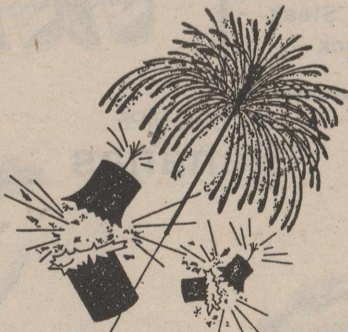
