Overweight kids need healthy diets/exercise Generally, a young child should not be put on a strict reducing diet unless there is a specific medical reason. Severe food restrictions may interfere with bone, muscle and brain development. For most kids, the primary strategy for bringing their weight closer to normal is to slow weight gain until height catches up. This usually can be done by eating healthier and lighter, and by increasing the daily level of exercise.
It's especially important to try to preserve your over weight child's self esteem. One way is to approach weight loss as a family project so he does not feel ostracized. When planning meals, for example, offer the same healthy foods to the entire family to prevent your child from feeling deprived $c$ : singled out. The main reason more of today's kids are overweight is from living sedentary lifestyles rather than overeating. Television, computers and video games have re placed jumproping, bike riding, and other physical activities. Provide plenty of opportunities for physical activity by limiting television viewing and encouraging outdoor play. Get the entire family involved with bike rides, after dinner walks, and other fun fitness activities.

Here are some additional ideas to help your child lose weight:

Collecting Social Security
Young people who worry about collecting Social Security in the distant future should know that it is not just a retirement program. Disability and survivors benefits are paid to workers and their families. This protection can be extremely important, especially for young families. Some 42 percent of male workers and 28 percent of female workers will become disabled or die before they reach retirement age
