# Burning poses threat

Due to the extreme dry weather the conditions are perfect for range fires. The smallest of sparks can set off a blazing fire.

The County Commissioner's Court would like to request that all outside burning be stopped until weather conditions change. We simply cannot afford to take a chance.

We have volunteer firemen, and when they have to leave their jobs, it takes them away for a minimum of two hours, with some fires running into days. This is time without

compensation for their work. Also, rarely do they fight a grass fire without ruining at least one tire. Then they have to do the repairs on the trucks and get ready for the next fire.

These dedicated men need our help now, and the Court is confident the citizens of Coke County will do their part. Below are listed the fires for the last month. If you meet a fireman on the street, be sure to tell him how much you appreciate him and that YOU, FOR ONE, WILL NOT BURN UNTIL CONDITIONS IMPROVE.

\* Bronte volunteer firemen had six fires during January and February. All fires were grass fires with thirty-five men responding to the six fires. One fire was started by a welder, and the other causes were not reported.

\* Robert Lee volunteer firemen had three fires in February. All three were grass fires and they had an average of eight men responding to each fire.

We've been lucky so far this year with the conditions we have, so PLEASE, PLEASE do your part and do not burn.

# Sheriff warns of phony paving crew

According to Coke County Sheriff Marshall Millican, reports from around the county indicate an unscrupulous paving crew may be working in the area again. A few years ago a group used the same technique by contacting homeowners, saying they had asphalt left from a larger job and would lay it for practically nothing. They would almost have enough to finish a drive and sell the rest of the job at an exceptionally high price, using high pressure tactics after "giving" them the initial asphalt. The first rain caused the loose mix to disintegrate and weeds to push through.

#### Edmiaston


Don B. Edmiaston, 89, of Bronte died Wednesday, February 21, 1996 in an Abilene hospital.





# Profiling local candidates-



Paul Burns (Editor's Note: After some discussion, Paul Burns decided that he'd rather give the voters an update on our cur-

rent county economic situation in lieu of a personal pro-

file. Below is the result of that interview.)

In order to give the residents of Coke County a realistic picture of what we are facing in county government, we must go back and get a little economic history. In 1986, county ad valorem tax valuations (the basis for our county tax revenue) totalled \$282 million. In 1995, this same figure has gone down to \$175 million, a 38% drop from the 1986 figures. What this means is that the county has roughly 38% less funds to operate on than we had in

This has led to some very difficult choices in county government as to which programs should be funded and at what level, and which departments should receive reductions and by how much should they be reduced.

The county missed an excellent opportunity by not adopting the unit road system, which could have consolidated some of these func-




## Smith snags hole-in-one

### BISD recognized for employee safety

Mr. Allen Richey, Superintendent of the Bronte Independent School District, was recently honored for outstanding employee safety by the North Texas Educational Insurance Association at its annual meeting conducted in Austin, Texas. The Association consists of 121 participating school districts located throughout northern and central Texas. The district is a member of a uniquely designed partially self-funded workers' compensation program developed by Hibbs-Hallmark & Company and administrated by Claims Administrative Services, Inc., both located in Tyler. Hibbs-Hallmark & Company currently provides workers' compensation programs to over 26 percent of all schools in Texas. The purpose of the meeting was to recognize those districts that have held both the number and severity of employee accidents to a very low level. The combined savings during the 1994-95 school year for all participating districts was over 2.5 million dollars when compared to the costs of fully insured programs. The total savings for all districts since inception of the programs in 1991 exceed \$28

million dollars. The Bronte Independent School District was a Gold award recipient with the actual losses from employee accidents equaling less than 50 percent of the fund set aside by the district for claims expenses. The actual savings to the school district was \$12,714.
