Surprise snow blankets Coke County

Old Man Winter blew into Coke County this past weekend with full force. Beginning Saturday evening with severe thunderstorms, the weather worsened Sunday with freezing rain, sleet, and finally snow.

Weather causes accidents in county

Weather was the cause of numerous one-vehicle accidents in Coke County Sunday, November 24.

The worst accident occurred approximately six miles south of Bronte on Hwy 277 when the driver lost control of his vehicle on the ice. The car hit a culvert and flipped, landing upside down in a creek. The driver, 74 year old Felton Palmer Brashier of Ranger, was killed. Passengers in the car included Betty Brashier, 70, Dorothy Beams, 72, Roberta Nuwnham, 71, and Elva Larson, 94, all of Ranger. All passengers were transported by ambulance to Shannon Medical Center in San Angelo.

Other accidents occurred Sunday on Hwy 277 and Hwy 208, but involved no injuries.



ECCHD Board actions told

The Board of Directors of East Coke County Hospital District met in a called meeting Monday, November 18, to officially order a rollback election for January 18, 1997, at Bronte City Hall.

The purpose of this election is to allow voters the opportunity to vote for or against rolling the tax rate back from the \$00.6875 per \$100 valuation rate as proposed by the Board of Directors to the roll-back rate of \$0.37924.

In other action, the Board appointed Bob Lasswell to fill the unexpired term of LeDrew Arrott and Ron Cooper to fill the unexpired term of Royce Lee. Both Mr. Arrott and Mr. Lee had resigned in earlier meetings.

L.O. Clark assumed duties on November 21 as interim administrator until a permanent administrator can be employed.





Plan for a safe holiday bird

Whether a novice or an experienced turkey cooker, plan ahead and follow these steps to make the process of preparing and serving the holiday turkey safe and worry-

*Decide how much turkey you will need before you shop. You'll need about one pound per person, or one and one-half pounds per person if you want plenty of leftovers.

*Make sure you have the equipment needed. Do you have a roasting pan large enough to roast a large turkey? If not, an alternative would be to roast two small birds instead of one large one. For best results, plan to use a meat thermometer to register internal cooking temperature.

*Decide whether to buy a fresh or frozen turkey. A frozen turkey can be purchased well in advance, but a fresh bird should be bought only one to two days ahead.

*If you have a frozen bird, plan for enough days to refrigerator-defrost it. A rule of thumb is about 24 hours of defrost time for each 5

pounds of turkey. *When handling the bird, wash hands, sink, counter, utensils and platter thoroughly with soap and water before and after handling. This will help prevent contam-

ination and potential food safety problems.

*If you plan to serve stuffing, the safest alternative is to cook the stuffing in a separate pan. Stuffing inside a bird can remain at temperatures that encourage bacterial growth. If you choose to stuff a bird, do it right before roasting, not ahead of time.

*Preheat the oven to 350° Place the turkey breastside up in a shallow roasting pan. Insert a meat thermometer in an inner thigh of the bird.

Allow 15 to 18 minutes per pound cooking time for an unstuffed bird and 18 to 24 minutes for a stuffed bird. A whole turkey is done when the internal temperature reaches 180° F in the inner thigh (dark meat). A turkey breast should reach 170° F internal temperature. Stuffing should reach at least 165° F.

*Allow the cooked turkey to sit for 20 minutes before



*It's very important to refrigerate leftovers immediately after the meal. Carve leftovers from the bone and refrigerate immediately. Cooked turkey and stuffing should not remain at room temperature for more than two hours.

*If you choose to roast the turkey ahead of time, it needs to be de-boned after cooking and refrigerated in shallow containers. The meat can be reheated in the oven or microwave before serving.

Guest speakers at the November 14 meeting of the Sorosis Study Club were Royce Fancher and Nancy Woodward.




