West Coke County EMS receives TDH grant

Fran Lomas and Jeanette Jacobs recently attended a reception for the disbursement of grant funds by the Texas Department of Health. The event was held at the Central Fire Station in San Angelo Friday, Dec. 13.

Of the \$34,000 in grants allocated to local rural areas, West Coke County received \$1,740 for additional training equipment to be used by the EMS. The grant was the fourth received in four years from the TDH, stated Lomas, who is grants writer for the service. "It is very unusual to receive funding after three consecutive years. I was quite

Wayne Arrott will be retiring after serving the county as Constable for twenty-two years. He will retire to ranch-


Tim Millican has served as County Commissioner for eight years. He also plans to resume his ranching interest.

again and again! The children at Medina Home for Children in Medina, Texas, are the beneficiaries of this largeheartedness.


Bronte Nursing Home News







Coping with illness during the holidays

It's the holiday season and you know what that means there is shopping to do, presents to wrap, decorations to hang, cookies to bake and family gatherings to plan. So much to be done, it can seem overwhelming. When the holiday spirit fills the air and it seems like everyone else is celebrating, how do you cope when your loved one is suffering from a serious illness? Dealing with the illness of a loved one is never an easy task, and it can be particularly overwhelming during the holidays. "Feelings of grief may overcome the family, especially near the holidays, as they realize a loved one is no longer healthy," said Fran Greeson, licensed clinical social worker at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tenn., who works with many families every year who are coping with a sick child. "Family members get sad when they realize their holidays won't be free from worry and illness."

Many families coping with illness become even more depressed by thoughts of past holidays when everyone was together and healthy. "It's important to realize when one member of the family is seriously ill, it's really a 'family illness' because the whole family is affected," said Greeson

To help families cope with a "family illness," Greeson recommends support services including counseling and spiritual support. "It is also im-

portant to plan holiday parties and maintain traditions to help families ease the sadness," adviseo Greeson.

Besides support from a social worker, counselor, clergy member, or friend, families coping with an illness need time to relax and reflect on the positive things in their lives for which they can be thankful.

Greeson suggests the following to help those coping with illness manage the holiday stress:

- Do not "over give"
- Give equally to all members of the family
- Allow yourself to be flexible
- Make an effort to maintain holiday traditions but don't put pressure on yourself to be the perfect host/hostess
- Take advantage of time when the patient feels well use this time as an opportunity to create joyful memories that will last a lifetime
- Accept that the moods of the patient or family may be unpredictable

Christmas Trees

It's time to spruce up your home for the holidays. The drought may have slowed the growth of Texas Christmas trees, but it didn't kill any. Extension forester Lanny Dreesen says there will be no shortage this season. And there's more good news -Dreesen says prices should be about the same as last year. A standard six-foot tree should cost around 25 dollars. It could be a little more in the city and a little less in the country. Virginia Pine is the most common Christmas tree for Texas. It makes up about 80 percent of the trees grown here. The second most popular is the Afghan Pine. For the freshest, longest lasting trees, Dreesen recommends cutting your own. He says those trees will still be producing sap that will seal the cut end of the tree. What you need to do is cut off another half inch as soon as you get the tree home. Then put it immediately into water. A Virginia Pine can take up to two gallons of water in the first afternoon, so you will need to replenish the water supply frequently.

 Selecting a Christmas Tree: Christmas trees can quickly turn from symbols of a joyous season to an ignition switch for disaster. It doesn't take much to send a dry tree up in flames. Keeping your tree supple and your home safe begins with the selection in the tree lot. Extension forester Lanny Dreesen says forester, Lanny Dreesen, says a good test is to press a needle between your thumb and index finger. If the needle cracks and bends, the tree is already dry. Once you've found a good tree, be careful where you put it. Some trees

will last for months if they're watered well and placed in the right spot. Do not put them near windows where the sun will dry them out. And keep them away from fireplaces and other heat sources. Dreesen warns that spruce trees have a bad habit of dropping needles when they get the least bit dry. He says the noble fir is a beautiful tree, but it is quite costly and may dry out during the long trip from the Pacific Northwest. Dreesen recommends the home-grown Virginia Pine as the tree with the greatest longevity.

 Hypoallergenic Christmas Tree: So if you're looking for an alternative to your traditional tree and you could benefit from a pollen-free holiday environment, give the Leyland Cypress a try. The Leyland Cypress is a combination of the Alaskan Cedar and Monterrey Cypress from Mexico. It was developed by the British in the 1940s as an ornamental tree. The tree was brought into Texas in 1982 as an alternative Christmas tree for growers. Because it's a true hybrid, the Leyland cannot produce pollen, giving allergy sufferers the option of having

a natural evergreen in the house for Christmas. The most common Christmas tree grown in Texas is the Virginia Pine. It is a thick, very dense evergreen. The Leyland Cypress is less dense and looks more like a fir tree. The Leyland Cypress was in short supply last year because growers did not have the tree long enough to build up a good supply. Tree farms should be better stocked this year.

· Cactus For Christmas: Poinsettias are the perennial favorites for Christmas, but once the holidays are over, those plants get thrown out with the wrapping paper. This year, why not select a plant with better staying power. Doesn't cactus seem appropriate in the Southwest for Christmas? Christmas cactus is becoming a more popular holiday plant. Experiment Station horticulturist Dr. Harvey Lang says some people prefer it over the more traditional poinsettias because after the flowers fall off, you still have an attractive and hearty plant. There are more than 70 varieties of Christmas cactus with names such as Christmas Charm, Red Radiance, Twi-

light Tangerine and Peach Parfait. As the names suggest, they come in shades of red, orange, purple, yellow and white. Lang says Christmas cactus are tough. They'll tolerate temperatures ranging from 35 to over 100 degrees. The require little water, but unlike many cactus, they prefer low light or shade. Lang says Christmas cactus will typically bloom a second time in February. Growers control the blooming time by controlling the amount of light the plant gets. You can do the same at home each year by exposing the cactus to less light. The shorter the day and the warmer the temperature, the earlier the bloom.





Keep the holidays happy, healthy

A whirl of holiday parties . . . last minute shopping . . marathon cookie-baking sessions - they can only mean one thing. It's holiday time!

But do year-end deadlines and an over-booked holiday calendar leave you feeling less than jolly? This year, try these simple strategies from the Centrum Center for Nutrition Science to keep your holiday season filled with good cheer:

There isn't time to do everything. Do you really have to bake 12 different kinds of cookies, write personalized cards to everyone you ever knew, and go to every party? Make a list of the things you really need and want to do, then prioritize the activities - delegating whenever possible.

Remember the basics eat wisely. Don't let too many holiday treats crowd out a healthful diet. Try to eat balanced meals every day based on the USDA Food Guide Pyramid, which identifies the appropriate balance among the food groups necessary for a healthy diet. Get added assurance by taking a complete multivitamin and mineral supplement that contains 100 percent of the Daily Value (DV) for essential vitamins.

Stay in step with physical activities. Exercise helps to relieve holiday tension and burn extra calories from too many servings of eggnog. If you can't squeeze in your usual fitness routine, take a few extra turns around the mall or dance the night away at holiday parties. For an average person weighing about 150 pounds; one hour on the dance floor can burn approximately 210 calories.

Be a smart snacker. Don't go to parties hungry have a piece of fruit or cut-up vegetables for a snack before you leave. Savor small protions of once-a-year favorites and take a pass on high-calorie snacks you can eat anytime. One glass of holiday eggnog has approximately 342 calories and 19 grams of

Nix a post-party hangover. If you drink, keep alcohol - and calories - under control by alternating alcoholic drinks with sparkling water or diet soda. A 12 ounce can of beer contains approximately 150 calories compared to diet cola which has zero calories. Also remember, never drink and drive.

Keep holiday spirits bright. Calm jangled nerves with soothing activities - take a bubble bath, read a good book or listen to your favorite symphony, for instance. Don't let anxiety about pulling off a perfect holiday season cause you stress . . . remember you can't be all things to everyone.

Take holiday merriment in moderation

Think 'moderation' for a merry, but healthy holiday season.

'The holidays are not a time to try and lose weight, because festivities are often centered around lots of food and drinks. People should consider themselves successful by simply maintaining their weight during the holidays," said Lynne Scott, a registered dietitian and director of the Diet Modification Clinic at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Eating healthy for the holidays is not the difficult if you plan ahead. It is hard to resist the temptations of traditional favorites, but low-fat recipe alternatives can keep you on track. If you are spending the holidays away from home, prepare a low-fat entree or vegetable tray to take with

Beware of sweets. Just because an item is fat-free does not mean its calorie-free. "People tend to think they can eat all they want if the item is fat free," said Scott, "but usually the calories in the fatfree item are close to the same as its fattening counter-

For parties, Scott says to eat before you go to avoid snacking on refreshments that are usually high in calories and fat, survey the entire buffet table before making your selection and choose moderate portions. Always have a drink in hand to sidestep a waiter putting something in your hand and avoid lingering near the food and bar area.

Finding time for exercise during the holiday season should also be a priority, since it can help keep you focused on maintaining your healthy



To participate in the "Hunters for the Hungry Program" donors can take their










Tips for poinsettia care

Though poinsettias are a challenging plant to care for, they can survive year-round with the proper care, according to Patti Pickett of Magic Farms greenhouse.

She usually gives the following tips:

• Expose poinsettias to full daylight, but not direct sun.

Keep room temperature
 72 degrees or below during
 the day or 60 degrees at night
 the higher the humidity, the
 cooler the temperature.

• Check soil daily and water thoroughly when the dirt is dry to the touch, but drain excess

 New Year's Day: continue light watering and fertilize.

• Valentine's Day: if the plant gets long and leggy, prune it to eight inches above the soil.

 St. Patrick's Day: remove faded and dried stems and bracts; add soil, preferably a sterile mix available commer-

cially.

• Memorial Day: trim off two or three inches on each branch to promote side branching. Repot and move plants outside, first to indirect and then direct light.

 Labor Day: move plant indoors, but make sure it gets six hours of direct light. Reduce fertilizer.

 Autumn Equinox: about September 21 give plants 12 hours of uninterrupted darkness and 11 hours of bright light daily; keep night temperatures in the low 60s; con-

Scams exposed by postal system

During the Great Depression of the 1930s, hobos would leave a secret mark on the gate or doorway of a house where they got a handout to let other transients know they could expect help.

In an updated version, people who run telephone marketing scams are selling their lists of people who were targeted successfully so other telemarketers can cash in on careless and gullible consumers.

Now, federal and state authorities are teaming up with the American Association of Retired Persons to try to put the operations out of business.

State attorneys general and federal authorities and volunteers from the AARP, working with lists seized by the FBI, will try to call more than 5,000 people across the country to warn them they are the objects of telemarketing fraud.

The effort was announced Thursday at a Fort Lauderdale news conference by Massachusetts Attorney

General Scott Harshbarger, president of the National Association of Attorneys General.

"Telemarketing fraud is a multibillion-dollar criminal enterprise that threatens the economic security of older Americans in every state in the nation," said Harshbarger.


"Lists of individuals who have been victims of fraud are valuable to criminals because they have proven to be susceptible or vulnerable," according to the FBI's Charles Owens.


Postal inspectors warn that telemarketing scams are especially active during the holiday season.

"People should be careful about responding to unsolicited letters or phone calls requesting donations to unfamiliar charities," said Chief Postal Inspector Kenneth Hunter.


The National Consumers League advised people to ask for written information on investment offers and warned people to never pay for a prize or a sweepstakes entry.



An ordinance establishing curfew hours for Minors, defining terms; creating offenses for minors, parents of minors, and business establishments violating curfew regulations; providing defenses; providing for enforcement by the City's Ordinance Enforcement Officer; providing for review of this ordinance within 18 months after the date of passage; providing a saving clause; providing a severability clause; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. CURFEW HOURS FOR MINORS.

(a) Definitions. In this sec-

tion:

means: 12:01 am until 6:00 am.

(5) MINOR means any person under 17 years of age. (8) PUBLIC PLACE

means any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access and includes, but is not limited to streets, highways, and the common areas of schools, hospitals, apartment houses, office buildings, transport facilities, and shops.

(e) Penalties

(1) A person who violates a provision of this chapter is guilty of a separate offense for each day or part of a day during which the violation is committed, continued, or permitted. Each offense, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

(2) When required by Section 51.08 of the Texas Family Code, as amended, the municipal court shall waive original jurisdiction over a minor who violates Subsection (b)(1) of the section and shall refer the minor to juvenile court.

Parenting for an enjoyable Christmas

This time of year the magazines are filled with pictures of clean, beautifully dressed, calm, smiling children happily playing with their Christmas toys.

That may be one reason why parents become frustrated or even angry when their children fuss, whine, or misbehave during holiday celebrations. Young children will respond differently to Christmas activities depending on their age. Parents can save themselves a lot of grief by knowing what is normal and predictable behavior from young children and planning their family activities accordingly.

Parents should consider the following:

· Babies under 12 months can easily feel overwhelmed by too many toys, relatives or foods. Give the baby plenty of rest and time alone with

· Toddlers will be lovable and cute, but not too involved in Christmas. Some toddlers will be fearful of strangers, including visiting relatives. Childproof your Christmas decorations, since toddlers will want to touch hot lights, pull on electrical cords and handle decorations that arouse their curiosity

· Two-year-olds will be excited about lights and decorations. They cannot anticipate, so they cannot wait to open gifts or eat the cookies, and they may throw tantrums to prove it. Two-year-olds are just as likely to play with the box as the toy inside and since they don't want to share well yet, they will often hit and grab toys.

 Three-year-olds will love gifts, both the box and the gift inside. They are more likely to have a sunny disposition on Christmas and be able to play with other children, so getting together with relatives may be easier. However, parents will still want to limit the extent of activities. Any three-year-old who has been excited for too long is capable of fighting and

Four-year-olds can remember well and anticipate activities. They love the holiday, including parties events, especially if they are not too long. They can participate in decorating and other simple projects in advance of Christmas. In general, they should get along with visiting relatives, but may sometimes be rude and uncooperative when tired or overextended.

 Five-year-olds will show marked improvement in behavior because they are beginning to set their own limits. This is an ideal year to read about Christmas to them. Since they like to hold and do things alone, it is also a good year for projects. This may also be the first year for really liking Santa.

Wherever a child is developmentally, parents should try to enjoy that stage and let it help determine family activities at holiday time.


