## Rainwater

R.C. "Taos" Rainwater, 79, died Sunday, May 11, 1997, at $7: 30$ at his home in Robert Lee after an eight-year battle with cancer.
Service was held in Robert Lee at 10:00 am Wednesday, May 14 at the Pecan Baptist Church. Military graveside service was held at $3: 00 \mathrm{pm}$ at Hillside Memorial Gardens in Hillside Memorial Gardens in

He was born in Dandridge, Tennessee, on November 10, 1917, and moved to Ennis Creek near Snyder in 1930. He married Bessie Norrid in Carlsbad, New Mexico in 1947. R.C. and Bessie reared their family in Snyder reared their family in Snyder where he retired from Johnpoor health. In 1975 they repoor health. In 1975 they re-
tired at Lake Spence. tired at Lake Spence.
He was a very proud American and veteran of World War II. He was inducted into the Texas Army at Brownwood in 1942. R.C. made the historic landing at Salerno, Italy, when the US invaded Europe in September 1943. During the war, he was decorated with the Silver Star, Bronze Star, and Purple Heart, and numerous ribbons.
R.C. will always be remembered for his wit and sense of humor and his positive attitude about all the pain he endured throughout his life. But, he never complained. He was shot in the lung at Anzio, Italy, hospitalized for six weeks from third degree burns in an oil fire in 1953, and endured eight major surgeries since 1977.
In 1987, R.C. realized that God had a plan which led to his baptism while recovering from throat surgery at St. John's Hospital. Three years later he and other members of the Lost Chords Club of San Angelo, served as honorary co-chairmen of the Tom Green County Great American smoke Out. He spoke to over 1,000 elementary children as an American Cancer Society volunteer.
Survivors include his wife, Bessie, of Robert Lee; one son, Kenneth Wade and his wife, Sherry, of Hobbs, New Mexico; two daughters, Jean Hamilton of Robert Lee and Odessa; and Patsy Maddux and her husband, Ron, of San Angelo. His grandchildren include, Johnny Wade of Ruidoso, New Mexico; Craig

Wade of Abilene; Deanne Hamilton of Odessa; Joie Hamilton of Houston; Robin Wade of Corpus Christi; Chelsea Maddux of San Angelo; Lori Sofinowski of Beaumont, and Trey Upton of Kerrville. He is survived by two great-grandchildren, Eric and Ryan Wade of Minot North Dakota. He is also survived by special friends, Delton Shirley of Odessa; Sheila Butler of Odessa; Bob Thayer of Houston, Myra Wade of San Angelo; and members of the 36th Division, the Lost Chords, and Pecan Baptist Church.

He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers, Tinsley, and Luther Ray Rainwater, one grandchild Royce Wade, and a special nephew, Skeet Whatley.

## Spains clean up

at national show
Hal and Kimberly Spain have just returned from the national Corriente Show and Roping, held this year at Shawnee, Oklahoma, April 23-26. The North American Corriente Association (NACA) was formed back in the early 80 's to provide a registry for roping and rodeo cattle, and to maintain and improve the characteristics of this unique breed of cattle, which originated in Mexico. In the past, stock producers from the United States have purchased these cattle from Mexico to lease or sell, or put on ropings in the United States. Many of the good characteristics of these Mexican cattle, used primarily for team and steer roping and steer wrestling, have been diluted with Brahma and other breeding, as the Mexican producers have upgraded their herds.
As a result, good roping and rodeo cattle are becoming increasingly difficult to find across the border. The NACA was formed to provide a source for these cattle in the United States. The association now has over 20,000 cattle listed in their registry, and their membership numbers over 1,000 producers. The national show now hosts approximately 400 entries from across the United States.
The Spain heifer entries started the week out on a somewhat negative note, with their top heifer placing tenth in the 2 -year-old class. Their luck changed in the bull class, as their 2-year-old bull placed second out of twenty-nine entries in this class. They finished the day off as good as it can get with a first place finish
and a trophy buckle in the get-of-sire class. The day after the show, the breeder's ropings were held, with Hal's luck still holding, taking second in the first roping, and third and fourth in the second roping, for a total of $\$ 565$ in winnings.
