Resuscitation attempts failed, and he was pronounced dead by Coke County Judge Jackie Walker at 6:37 pm.


Casey, an 8th grader at Robert Lee Junior High School, was active in 4-H, choir, and sports. He was also a member of Robert Lee Baptist Church.

# Evangelists to come to FBC-Bronte

This Sunday, May 24, Bronte's First Baptist Church will be hosting Donnie and Madeline Jones for two very special services. These services will be held at 10:55 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Donnie and Madeline Jones are full time evangelists from Longview, Texas. This couple has scheduled over 40 revivals and concerts each year for the past 13 years in the United States and 17 foreign countries testifying and singing for their Lord. Donnie and Madeline have touching testimonies of how God called them out of the peak of their careers into full time service for Him. They have been featured at numerous state conventions including the Southern Baptist Convention, Texas Baptist Convention, Texas Baptist Evangelism Conference, and the Baptist World Alliance.

A native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, Donnie is a former middle school principal of one of the premier middle schools of that city with an enrollment of 1,200. After 13 years in Baton Rouge, Donnie accepted God's call to preach and moved to Longview, Texas.

Madeline grew up in Longview, Texas, and took voice lessons at an early age because they thought it would help her to breathe. When she was 4, her breastbone began to grow out until it stuck out about six inches from her chest, which was causing her lungs to collapse. She was not expected to live. At the age of 10, she still did not weigh 30 pounds. Because she was reared in a Christian home, many people in her church, First Baptist Church of Longview, were praying for her to be healed. Her father asked the 4,000 in attendance at a Texas Baptist Men's rally to pray for her also. "In two or three weeks, I began to feel better, and the growth went down," Madeline says. "That year, I gained about 30 pounds."

The morning service will include a children's time with Donnie and Madeline, Madeline singing "I Bowed on My Knees and Cried 'Holy'" with the church choir, Donnie and Madeline singing "There Is Healing in His Hands," and Donnie bringing a message entitled "Life's Greatest Question." Parker and fellow recruits began their training at 5 am by running three miles and performing calisthenics. In addition to the physical conditioning program, Parker spent numerous hours in classroom and field assignments which included learning first aid, uniform regulations, combat water survival, marksmanship, hand-to-hand combat and assorted weapons training. They performed close order drill and operated as a small infantry unit during field training.


Parker and other recruits also received instruction on the Marine Corps' core values honor, courage and commitment, and what the words mean in guiding personal and professional conduct.
