The bills were paid and the meeting adjourned.



were eating grilled chicken or steak




class.

Robert Lee fourth graders attended the H.E. Butt Foundation Camp near Leakey, Texas. Thirty-two students with their teachers, Mrs. Cindy Bessent and Mrs. Carolyn Davis, along with sponsors and presenters, experienced three days of outdoor education

The Robert Lee Outdoor Education program was organized during the 1997-98 school year under the direction of camp directors, Cindy Bessent and Carolyn Davis. The curriculum was designed for hands-on and involvement of the subject.

Camp instructors were individuals that have been trained and certified in the subject matter, work for institutions in their field or have lived and worked in their area of expertise. The Texas Education

# Storage tank workshops

Owners and operators of petroleum and chemical storage tank systems may want to attend a series of free workshops regarding regulatory deadlines. The Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission recently announced that owners and operators of underground storage tanks must complete tank and piping upgrades, and must satisfy financial assurance (insurance) requirements by December 22, 1998. Also, owners and operators must identify and report petroleum contamination by this date to ensure that any required cleanup activities remain eligible for financial assistance from the state's petroleum storage tank remediation fund.

These workshops will be free and informal, and will be held in 51 cities across Texas during the months of March through July 1998.
