## Students attend classes on Frio <br> River

Robert Lee fourth graders attended the H.E. Butt Foundation Camp near Leakey, Texas. Thirty-two students with their teachers, Mrs. Cindy Bessent and Mrs. Carolyn Davis, along with sponsors and presenters, experienced three days of outdoor education.
The Robert Lee Outdoor Education program was organized during the 1997-98 school year under the direction of camp directors, Cindy Bessent and Carolyn Davis. Monies were raised by cookie sales by the fourth grade students and grants received from companies interested in helping to underwrite the program. The outdoor education program paid for the substitutes needed to cover for any teachers taken from their classes to attend camp. Robert Lee I.S.D. provided the transportation for the students, sponsors and supplies to the camp.
The curriculum for the outdoor education camp was designed by the fourth grade teachers. Angelo State University, the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the Children's Museum of New Braunsfels were some of the resources for instructors.
The Texas Education

Agency recognizes the Outdoor Education program as a classroom learning experience. While the students are not sitting in their classrooms at Robert Lee I.S.D., they are not counted absent.
