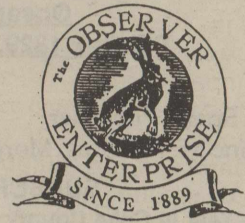

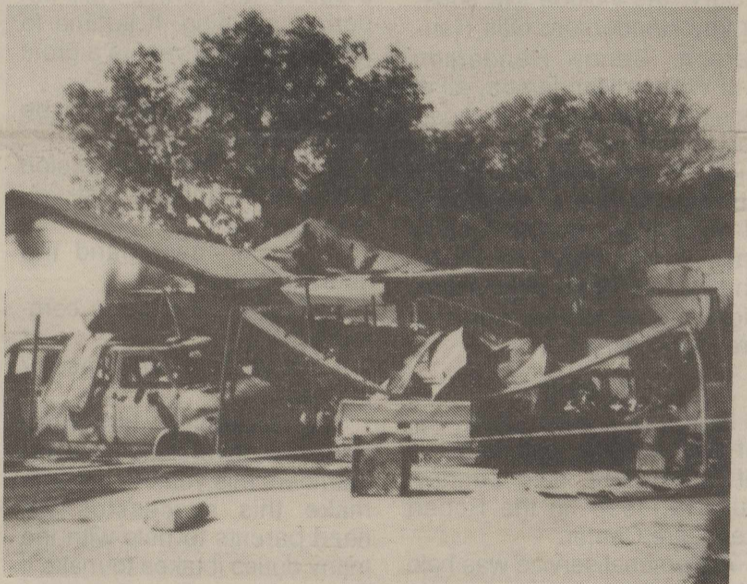
Pecan Baptist Church will hold revival services Sunday through Wednesday, August 2-5. Bro. Lynn Stephens will be the evangelist for the services.

**Coke County Library news**

**Backroads of Texas: 15,000 miles of Straight Shots and Roundabout Routes** is available from the Coke County Library. The authors divide the state into four regions and indicate whether the route is on US highways, Texas state highways or interstates. The introduction of the book gives a brief history of the state and also provides a section on facts. For instance, Texas is a producer of most of the world's supply of sulfur. East and north Texas supply most of the supply of clay for clay products.

Bronte, "altitude 1,893, occupies a land of notched mesas and takes its name from the English novelist;" and Robert Lee, "altitude 1,780, is also famously named. Its close-by Spence Reservoir provides good fishing and campsites."

Perhaps when it cools off we will see some visitors with this book by Ed Syers (author of *Off the Beaten Trail*).

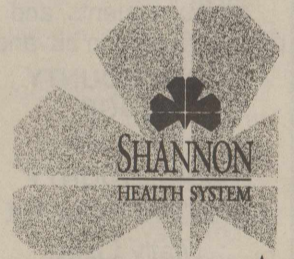

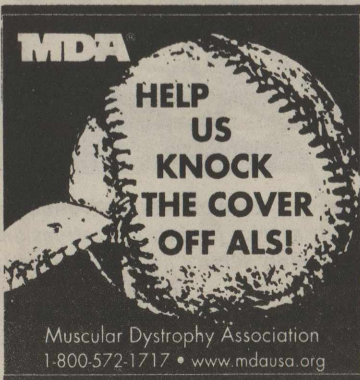

### Commissioners' Court Meets

The Coke County Commissioners' Court met on July 13, 1998. The meeting was called to order with the pledge to the flag and prayer led by Commissioner Lee.

The minutes were approved as presented.

Bids for roofing of the courthouse were discussed, and the court decided to re-submit bids.

The Treasurer's affidavit was approved as of June 30, 1998.

Also approved, was construction of a communication line by GTE.

The trappers report and the extension report were both approved.

The Court certified 275.62 miles to the state as county maintained roads.

The ladies request to keep the pool open until the last of

August for Water Aerobics was approved. Also approved, was Teen Night once a week until the pool closes. The cost will be \$2 a person, with \$1 going to the lifeguards and \$1 to the county for chemicals, etc. The teens will be required to have one adult present at all times.

The court appointed Paul Burns and Royce Lee to research the disposal of illegally dumped trash.

New fees were adopted for the recreation halls and swimming pools effective January 1, 1999. The recreation halls will be \$40 for a half day, \$80 for a full day. Swimming pool season tickets will go to \$25. Daily swims will be \$2.50 for adults and \$1.25 for children. Trailer hook-ups will be increased to \$10 per day.

An inter-local agreement with the cities of Robert Lee and Bronte was discussed regarding streets.

The commissioners approved a resolution to increase employer's contribution to TCDRS for retirement. They also approved the Coke County Appraisal District Financial Report for 1997, the Hoblitzelle Foundation grant award of \$30,509 for improvements to the Bronte Park, and funding from TNRC for the grant for surveillance equipment for the Sheriff's department to be used in investigation of illegal dumping of trash. Construction of a communication line by GTE was also approved by the commissioners.

The bills were paid as presented and a budget workshop was conducted.
