#### Parents urged to visit school libraries

The Library Development Division of the Texas State Library and Archives Commission encourage parents to get involved with their school library this fall by attending library open houses and visiting with school librarians.

"It's important for the library to be the hub of the school,' said Library Development Director Jeanette Larson. "School academic success can be directly related to the quality of the school library."

In its last session, the Legislature directed the State Library to develop guidelines for school to enhance their library programs. "These guidelines are now in place," Larson said, "and we urge parents to visit the school library and ask about the qualities of a good library. Voice your support for library programs to your school boards, principals, and superintendents.

Among the qualities needed for a viable librarylearning atmosphere are:

\*a flexible schedule for access so that learning takes place continuously and when needed;

\*collaboration between classroom teachers and library staff;

\*new books and other print material on a wide variety of topics that encourage and support reading and learning;

\*up-to-date technologies supporting Internet access, automated circulation and catalogs, multimedia production capabilities, and access to an area for o


Facts assembled by the **Texas Library Association** show that:

1. The total average expenditures for school libraries, including staffing and facilities, is \$82 per student, or 50% of the \$164 per student spent for guidance counseling services.

2. School libraries spent less than \$11 per pupil for books in 1994-95, and with the average hardcover book currently costing about \$35, that's less than one book per three pupils.

3. School libraries account for only 1.7% of total school district expenditures.

4. Each school librarian in Texas serves an average of nearly 900 students and over 100 staff.





#### Deadline for bidding on forfeited state land Oct. 27th

A catalogue listing 220 tracts of forfeited state land reserved exclusively for bids from Texas veterans is now available from the Texas Veterans Land Board (VLB). Bids will be opened on October 27, 1998, at 1 pm.

"There's always a great demand for these tracts because veterans realize our forfeiture rules enable them to buy Land with no down payment," said Texas Land Commissioner Garry Mauro who is chairman of the VLB. "They understand that whether it's for recreation or an investment, these tracts are a very good value."

The catalogue, which contains bidding instructions and

(Nations Bank Bldg) Brownwood, TX a detailed description of each tract, can be ordered by calling 1-800-252-VETS.

Located in 97 Texas counties, the tracts range in size from five to 100 acres. The tracts, known as Type I tracts, can be purchased with no down payment. Bids are restricted to eligible Texas Veterans.

The VLB will finance the entire loan amount of all winning bids. There is no limit on the amount loaned or on the number of tracts that an individual can bid on. However, eligible Texas veterans are limited to one purchase in the sale.

"The sale gives Texas vets an excellent opportunity to buy good land with 100 percent financing and a low interest rate," Mauro said.

Mauro noted that setting aside new forfeitures exclusively for bids from Texas veterans is a long-time VLB policy.

Tracts not sold in the October sale will be offered to both veterans and non-veterans through local real estate agents.

Texas veterans will receive a 7.64 percent interest rate with a 30-year assumable fixedrate loan. A \$25 non-refundable fee for each bid is required.

The sale will be by sealed bid only, with a minimum bid set by the board. All bids must be received by October 27 at 1 pm. Details of the sale can be obtained by calling 1-800-252-VETS.
