

Blood Drive scheduled at Wackenhut

The Wackenhut Correctional Facility will sponsor a community blood drive in Bronte Tuesday, December 22nd, from 12 noon until 4 pm, inside the visitation area of the facility.

United Blood Services of San Angelo will conduct the drive, where organizers hope to draw 15 to 20 donors. Donors are asked to provide identification, such as a driver's license or UBS donor card. Donors are also asked to know the name of any medication they are currently tak-

Appointments are available, but not mandatory, by contacting Donna Andrews at 473-5700. Donors with appointments will be taken before walk-ins. The entire donation procedure takes approximately 45 minutes.

Patients in need at area hospitals rely on volunteer blood donors to keep the blood supply ample. Because a unit of whole blood is separated into components, one donation can help up to three patients.

Not everyone is able to donate blood. Some people have a medical condition that would keep them from ever donating, or they may have a condition that results in a temporary deferral. Listed below are some of the qualifications that must be met before someone can donate blood. The donor must:

·Feel well and healthy at time of donation;

•Be at least 17 and no older than 79;

·Weigh at least 110 pounds;

 Not have received a tattoo or accidental needle stick in the past 12 months;

•and must not have had a positive test for hepatitis.

However, many medications and vaccines do not defer a donor. For example, someone can donate if they are taking the following types of



Academy Richey will review the latest technology for enhancing student learning and participate in advanced leadership training from some of the nation's foremost trainers of executives from business and industry. Academy members will also spend several sessions working in the Decision Support Center at Lamar, a high tech laboratory for improving the speed and quality of management decision

Also as a part of the Academy IBM hosts the superintendents for a week of training at their Advanced Business Institute at Palisades, New York. At these sessions Academy members participate in training sessions

with business and industry executives from around the country to hone their leadership and decision-making skills. The superintendents will also be taken on a field trip to an exemplary school district to study practices that have helped make that district suc-

Thompson says the knowledge superintendents glean from work in the Academy is immediately applicable to any district, regardless of size or location. To assist participating districts in incorporating these management concepts the Academy will host a three day summer conference for Academy superintendents and their boards where they will be led through joint leadership training and planning activities. Participants will also meet with boards and superintendents of similar sized districts to share ideas for increasing student achieve-

The year-long Academy is designed to provide the most professional growth opportunities with the least amount of time away from the district. During the year superintendents will meet on six different weekends at Lamar University. The schedule is planned so that half of the training will be on Saturdays or during the summer when school is not in session. In addition Academy members will form cohort groups to work on joint projects and to visit and study other districts in the cohort

Executives from IBM along with Lamar faculty jointly plan the curriculum and manage Academy operations. According to Thompson, this type of cooperation between university and business insures the Academy incorporates the best of both theory and prac-

To date this year, they have responded to 37 calls. 24 calls were in the county, and 13 in






ences at Texas Woman's University, says that the holiday season can be one of joy, giving and love - if family members, parents, children, relatives and friends take time to appreciate one another in the spirit of giving.

"The holiday celebration has a special meaning for children, and it helps to build positive family memories and cohesiveness among members. The season gives people an opportunity to renew and keep the bonds between family members - to create an environment of unity.

Often families have their own favorite rituals - special meals, gift exchanges, stockings and other symbols of the season - and today they should learn to blend traditions when couples marry or children leave home. "But whatever you do and however you choose to observe the holiday season, don't lose sight of its meaning and don't get caught up in other people's expectations," says Hildreth.

Listed below are some rituals that families might want to blend with their traditions, plus some other advice for the

·Put up the tree together and think about baking cookies with your children - even "grown-ups" can do that. (Hildreth's siblings, for example, have a Sisters' Day and a Brothers' Day during the holidays - a time when mothers visit daughters and fathers spend time with their sons. "My family has done this for as long as I can recall, and my mother and her sisters did it, too," she recalls.)

·Celebrate gift giving, but remember that hand-made gifts are especially appreciated, and people often prefer to have you and your time rather than a gift. For those persons who have large families and who budget their funds, choose names.

 Remember that giving is better than receiving - and teach family members through activities that this old adage is true. "Find ways to give gifts, money or time to people who are in need or who are less fortunate than you," says Hildreth. "While you may want to emphasize visiting hospitals, children's homes, the elderly and others in the community during the holidays, you should do so with the hope that family members will continue to do these things throughout the year."



Holiday travel safety urged

The holiday season can be a treacherous time on Texas roadways, but there are precautions drivers can take to protect themselves.

Janie Harris, Texas Agricultural Extension Service passenger safety specialist, said the most important priority for holiday travel is to plan the trip carefully.

"Find out what the weather conditions are going to be," Harris said. "Know what you are going to be facing as you head down the highway."

She added it is important to take into account where you will be traveling.

"If you are traveling to areas where you think there might

be a possibility of ice or snow make sure your tires are equipped to deal with those conditions," Harris said.

She said drivers must arm themselves with the tools necessary to deal with many situations if they should happen to have any car trouble.

"Take extra blankets or coats with you so that if you happen to be stranded you have some extra protection against the cold temperatures," Harris said.

Harris added that another key tool in safe travel is to equip yourself with a cellular phone.

"I read an article about a lady who was lost in a blinding snowstorm somewhere in Nebraska and she stayed on

her cellular phone with the authorities until they could find her," she said.

Col. Dudley Thomas, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, agrees that it is important to be prepared in the event of an emergency.

"Keep blankets, a first-aid kit, flares, jumper cables, tire chains, a flashlight, ice scraper and gloves in your car," he said. "Take a food supply of candy bars or dried fruit in case you become stranded."

When dealing with the mechanics of winter travel, it is important to remember to keep you car in tip-top shape.

"Check your car battery before cold weather sets in," Thomas said. "Battery power dips in colder weather.

Also, keeping the gasoline level as high as possible will prevent water from condensing in the gasoline tank.

"It also is a good idea to check the automobile's motor oil, transmission fluid, ignition system, lights, heater and wipers before leaving, Thomas said.

Once on the road, Thomas urged drivers to remember that winter travel conditions

may change very quickly.

"Remember that ice forms first on bridges, overpasses and shady areas," he said. "If you hit a patch of ice, stay off your brakes and decelerate slowly, holding the car steady as you go over the ice."

He added that speed is a major problem when driving on ice and it is important to remain a safe distance behind the car in front of you.

"If your car goes into a skid, take your foot off the gas pedal but don't hit the brake," he said. "Steer gently in the direction you want the front of the car to go.'


Thomas said the car will regain traction and control as it begins to straighten out.

Highest & lowest priced homes in North Texas

North Texas can claim some of the highest- and lowestpriced homes in the state, according to the December issue of Trends, a monthly statistical report from the Real Estate Center at Texas A&M University.

Four of the five highest median prices in October were in North Texas cities. three of the five lowest medians could be found there,

Plano's median topped the state at \$152,500. Denton was second with a \$125,000 median. Northeast Tarrant County was third with \$124,300. Irving had the fourth highest median price with \$122,900. Austin made the top five with \$118,800.

According to Trends, the Sherman-Denison area's median of \$62,100 was lowest in the state. Port Arthur and Odessa-Midland had the second and third lowest medians at \$63,800 and \$64,100, respectively. Paris was fourth at \$65,000. Wichita Falls' \$67,500 was the fifth lowest in Texas.

Alternatives will have you gobbling up holiday dinner

If visions of the traditional turkey dinner are not the first to dance in your head this holiday season, you are probably not alone. Americans will consume approximately 67 million turkeys over Thanks-giving and Christmas, and though most will be baked as usual, there are ways to spice up the customary feast.

One alternative to consider is adding spices underneath the bird's skin. Dr. Sarah Birkhold, Texas Agricultural Extension Service poultry specialist, said adding seasonings between the skin and meat will help infuse the flavor more evenly.

"A good idea is to loosen the skin around the bird and add some thyme and sage with butter underneath the skin," she said. "This infuses the flavor in the meat instead of associating it directly with the skin, which some people like to cut off to reduce fat intake."

Grilling the turkey is also an option to consider. Birkhold said it is important to make sure the temperature of the grill is high enough before putting the bird on the grill.

"If you choose to grill or smoke the bird, it is important to get the temperature up to 200 to 250 degrees Fahrenheit at a minimum before you start to cook the bird," she

Deep fried turkeys are also becoming increasingly popular, Birkhold said. This is a method of cooking where the entire bird is submerged in a hot oil bath and fried. In addition to vastly reducing cooking time, frying the turkey can add spice to an old tradition. Birkhold suggests injecting the turkey with a marinade to bring out the bird's natural fla-



Holidays are chance to mend and build relationships

While celebration and expectation, family and friends are part of the holiday season, forgiveness often is forgotten in the rush. Family members see one another and remember old times - the good and the bad - and sometimes grudges replace giving. Instead, the holiday season can be a perfect opportunity to "mend fences" and build stronger relationships, according to family therapist Dr. Bill Anderson, associate professor of family sciences at Texas Woman's University.

"Our society has brain-washed us to think in terms of buy and spend, to expect more and to spend more and to equate money with happiness. Then we tie these ideas in with family - and it doesn't work," says Anderson. "Christmas and the holidays are a time of giving, regardless of religious orientation. It is a time to take stock of our relationships, particularly in our families - both the family of our origin and our immediate family - and to consider ways that we can give to one another. And we should forgive and ask for forgiveness.

Family, according to Anderson, is a place or an environment where people can have the best (closeness and friendship) or the worst (separation, anger and grudges). He says that families should ask themselves: how can I give to my children, spouse or parents? "What the way of this process

me fact that we live together; family members know our weaknesses and we know theirs. When we live with people in the same house and share our lives, there is more possibility of hurt than with neighbors or co-workers.

"We have to remember that love is reciprocal; therefore, the higher the expectations we have of our home life, the greater the chance we will be disappointed," he adds.

What steps can families take to forgive and grow, particularly during the holiday season? Anderson suggests focusing more on time together and less on gifts. "Families today make choices: is it more important to watch TV or to turn it off and talk with a

spouse or the children, for example. We can control some of the fast pace of life talk or go for a walk together. We still have the same amount of time together as we had as families 50 years ago - we just have to make choices to spend more time together."

He fondly remembers one family's gift to each other several years ago - love letters to one another, instead of presents from the store. Anderson says, "During the holiday season, we should ask ourselves: what would I like to contribute this Christmas? What would my family members like from me?" Families should focus on people, not consumerism because "society's focus on consumerism has made us a lonely society."

So....how can we mend family "fences" - relationships and connections that have broken down because of unrealistic expectations or hurt feelings? Forgiveness is the key, plus communication. "Life is too short to get even with everyone," says Anderson. "Holding a grudge eats away at people and makes them unhappy. People live together, hurt each other and must forgive; otherwise, we end up isolated and un-

Here are some tips to help mend those fences:

•Call, write, send a card, visit or make a gift. "All of these things have a strong impact on others; these are what people are lonely for," says Anderson.

·Forgive and ask for forgiveness.

·Look at the positive aspects of a relationship and focus on those.

·If you have seen someone you don't particularly like, make a list of what you don't like about them. Then make a list of their strengths and use those ideas to communicate with them. They will respond positively to you when you recognize their strengths.

·Sometimes you must bundle your hurts and put them away and then look for the good in another person.

·Realize that "I am not perfect. I have weaknesses; therefore, maybe I can live with other people's limits and look for their good qualities."

•Remember: you can only fix yourself, not someone else.

·Also remember that com-

monalities are important. Look for ways to work together and negotiate, if necessary. Look for similarities, not differ-

"Unresolved differences that you have with other family members are very painful, particularly at this time of the year," says Anderson. "Family systems are not fooled by silence or distance. They remember. There's a void that people still see, and cutting yourself off doesn't work because you and the other person have not resolved your problems. So celebrate your family during the holidays, forgive one another and spend time together."






