Tickets are available for \$5 a person at the First National Bank in Bronte, City Hall, and through Chamber Directors.


# New Director named at Robert Lee State Bank

#### FSA announces hog producer program

Producers qualify for the direct cash payments if they (1) marketed fewer than 1,000 hogs during the last 6 months of 1998 and (2) are still in operation. Eligibility is based on marketings during the last 6

Producers will be paid up to \$5 per slaughter-weight hog (or equivalent for feeder pigs) multiplied by the number of hogs marketed during the last 6 months of 1998. The actual payment may be less than \$5 given the limited amount of funding. Producers will only be paid on up to 500 market hogs (or the equivalent number of feeder pigs), so the maximum payment per operation is \$2,500.

Sign-up for producers is February 1, 1999 through February 12, 1999.

Don't be bugged by the Y2K; It's a challenge, not a problem by William H. Allen President-Robert Lee

If you haven't spent the past
year fishing through the ice at
the North Pole, you've probably seen the headlines and
heard the news reports on the

the Y2K.

Scare stories are being written daily about just what could (or could not) happen when the world's clocks click over to 12:01 am on January 1, 2000. Will airplanes fall from the skies? Will automobiles stop in their tracks? Will telephones

work? Microwaves? They are all legitimate questions, since everything we use in our modern society involves computer chips, and the fact that years ago manufacturers decided to take a shortcut to save space and placed the numbers "00" into the brainy devices instead of "2000."
