Property tax exemptions available for disabled veterans

Veterans with a service-connected disability may reduce their property taxes by filling out a simple exemption form at the Coke County Appraisal District office. The percentage of disability determines the size of the exemption. It ranges from a \$5,000 to a \$12,000 deduction from the veteran's property value.

Chief Appraiser Patsy Dunn explained the following persons are eligible for the applications: a disabled veteran; a surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as long as the spouse remains unmarried; a surviving minor child of a deceased disabled veteran, if the veteran's spouse does not survive the veteran and if the child is both under 18 and unmarried; a surviving spouse of a person killed while on active duty, whether the spouse has remarried or not at application time; and, a surviving minor child of a person killed while on active duty, if the child is both under 18 and unmarried.

Any eligible person who has not received this exemption must apply by April 30. "But, if you received the exemption

in 1998, you do not have to reapply in 1999," Mrs. Dunn said. An applicant may claim the exemption on only one piece of property, such as a home or any other property the applicant owned on January 1. The applicant must be a Texas resident to qualify.


Special guests were the bride-elect's mother, Mrs. Gayla Cox, and the prospective groom's sister, Lori Renfroe, both of San Angelo.

Tips for Parents and Gamilies

Choosing Child Care

Here are some suggestions to help both first-time and experienced parents choose child

People – Watch the staff with the children. Listen to their voices. Are they patient? Do they seem to enjoy the children or just tolerate them? Do they offer the children choices or do they tell them what to do? Are they enthusiastic or sound bored? Do they threaten or say "no" often?


Place – Look around. Are there places to build, read, do art, move, climb, sit all cozy, or read in? Is there room to move about without running into others? Is the place well lit, clean, fresh-smelling, too noisy, too quiet, or too wild? Are there good play areas and interesting, safe equipment. Is there grass, shade, sand, or place to ride on toys?

Things – Look at things that are there for your child to use. Do they look safe and in good condition? Is there a good variety? Do these things look interesting or challenging? Are there things that would be fun to feel, see, hear, and smell? Are there enough items so that children won't have to wait for a long time? Does the outdoor area have things to ride or climb on or dig with?

Put Yourself in Your Child's Shoes – Try to imagine what the child-care facility would look like through your child's eyes. Try to get a feel for a program. If you have chosen a facility, make follow-up visits to keep updated on changes in staff and environment.

Child Care in Texas – All Texas child-care providers are supposed to complete a criminal history check and are checked against a child abuse and neglect database. If the facility you are visiting does not have a certificate from the Child Care Licensing division of the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services (PRS), then it is possible that the facility is operating in violation of state law.



Proclamation of April as Fair Housing Month

WHEREAS Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended, prohibits discrimination in housing and declares it a national policy to provide, within constitutional limits, for fair housing in the United States; and

WHEREAS The principle of Fair Housing is not only national law and national policy, but a fundamental human concept and entitlement for all Americans; and

WHEREAS The thirty anniversary of this National Fair Housing Law, during the month of April, provides an opportunity for all Americans to recognize that complete success in the goal of equal housing opportunity can only be accomplished with the help and cooperation of all Americans.

Everyday Herbs

You have probably been hearing a lot about herbs lately. They are on the news and in the papers, on store shelves and maybe even in your doctor's office. Herbs have been proclaimed to do everything from soothing your mood, to improving your memory, to helping your weight like magic! Although some herbs may have some medicinal value, we would like to remind you of something that herbs have been proven to do for many years. Something that has been overlooked as late. That something is making your food taste delicious!

Herbs are a wonderful way to flavor your food. Cooking with herbs can help you reduce the amount of salt you use, or even eliminate it. Herbs such as rosemary, basil, tarragon, dill, parsley and thyme can help you lower the sodium in your diet, fight cancer and make your dining delicious.

Dried herbs have a higher concentration of flavor than fresh, so use only one third the amount of fresh herbs called for in recipes. Store in air tight containers in a dry and dark place such as a kitchen cabinet. They do not need refrigeration. Mark the date and replace dried herbs after three to six months because they lose their flavor over time.

Never use herbs? Here are some helpful tips.

 Select brightly colored fresh herbs that are not limp or vellowing.

• Wash stems and leaves in cold water. Drain well and pat dry with paper towels.

 Chop herbs on a wooden board with a heavy, sharp knife.

 Store washed or chopped herbs in an air tight container or resealable plastic bag in the regrigerator for up to a week.

 Or place washed herbs as you would a bouquet of flowers in a pitcher of cold water and let stand at room temperature for a day.

• Freeze fresh herbs that have been washed and dried by placing separately on a baking sheet and freezing until stiff, then transferring to a resealable bag.

 Dry fresh herbs by tying sprigs together and hanging upside down inside a paper bag cut with holes. This way, any leaves that fall will be caught and the color of herbs, which can be bleached by exposure to light, will be preserved.

 Or dry by arranging herbs in a single layer between two sheets of paper towel.
 Microwave on low for one to two minutes and let cool.





COUNTRY AGENTS

Tomatoes are big items in local gardens

If you are still weary of those exorbitant tomato prices since the winter freeze, you may consider growing your own tomatoes.

Growing tomatoes in the backyard can be a fascinating and rewarding venture, but it can be frustrating, too. A sickly tomato plant that produces few, if any fruit, certainly doesn't help anyone's gardening spirit. Whether you're growing tomatoes for the first time or as an old pro, you may profit from some useful advice on avoiding some common pitfalls.

First, don't grow tomatoes unless they can receive sunlight for at least six hours a day. Tomato plants placed between tall shrubs, under trees or between buildings simply will not produce a good tomato crop.

Second, good soil is essential for good growth and high yields. Often, poor soil can be improved with liberal amounts of organic matter and proper fertilization. A dark, heavy clay or even a fine sand can be improved by working 3 to 4 inches of organic matter into the soil where the tomatoes are to be planted.

To raise a few tomato plants, prepare a space at least 2 feet square for each plant. The soil should be worked to a depth of at least 12 inches. Liberal amounts of organic matter and a small amount of fertilizer such as 10-20-10 or 12-24-12 should be mixed into the soil.

The key to growing tomatoes successfully is choosing the right variety of tomatoes. Select varieties that resist many of the common diseases. A few varieties most suited for our area include: Celebrity, Big Set, Merced, Bingo, Spring Giant, Fantastic, Carnival, or the small fruited Small Fry Hybrid.

Transplants should be planted somewhat deeper than they were originally growing. Plants growing in peat pots or peat blocks should not be removed, but rather the entire container should be planted. Sometimes it is helpful to break the

bottom of the pots, but avoid damaging any of the roots.

When setting tomato plants in the garden, use a starter solution to assure adequate fertility during the early stages of growth. Starter solutions can be purchased at local garden centers, or can be made by mixing one to two level tablespoons of a complete garden fertilizer in a gallon of water. About one cup of the starter solution should be applied in the plant hold prior to planting.

For best results, transplants should be set in the garden on cloudy days or late in the afternoon. The plants should be protected from adverse conditions such as high winds or excessive heat for a week or so after transplanting.

Almost all tomato varieties should be staked, trellised or caged for best results, any method is good if it keeps the fruit off the ground. Tomatoes that are allowed to contact the soil often develop fruit rot.
