FSA Office recommends small grain certification

Producers are encouraged to certify all small grain grazing and small grain for harvest. Based on 1998 disaster programs it is to your advantage to certify for eligibility purposes. We never know when another disaster year will be upon us. Also, once you have received a NAP payment on a crop, it will protect your yield to certify each year. Failure to do so will amount to a reduction in your yield.

Producers who intend to harvest small grain need to come to the office before harvest and sign up for a possible LDP payment.

If you have insurance or not, if your small grain fails, you need to file an ASCS-574 for future programs.

June 1, 1999, is the final date to certify all small grain crops in Coke and Sterling Counties.



Ushers for the evening were Tyler Lott, Monica Rodriguez, Travis Taylor, and Brian Abalos.


RL Bands have spring concert

The High School Band ended the evening with a very diverse musical program that included music that is very symphonic to music that is Jazz and Rock. They played exceptionally well.



*Read the care labels and follow instructions.

Sort clothes before washing and drying.

*Follow the instructions on laundry products.

Removing stains: Spots and stains are easier to remove if they are treated quickly. To remove a stain, use a blotting motion, do not rub the stain. Retreat stains that are not completely gone. Do not dry stained clothes in the dryer or the stains may become permanent.

Read the care labels: Following the manufacturer's recommended instructions can mean the difference between a garment that lasts and one that can be ruined easily. Read the care labels in your garments. They contain care procedures recommended by the clothing manufacturer.

Sorting: Sort clothes before washing to keep colors from fading onto other colors, to prevent transfer of lint and soil, and to make it easier to

choose the best water temperature and detergent for your clothes. Sort clothes by color, fiber content of fabric, texture, construction, and soil.

Laundry Products: Many choices of laundry products are available today. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for amounts to use. Soaps are designed for light, gentle washing. Detergents work to remove a variety of soil amounts. Granular detergents work well on mud and clay soils. Liquid detergents are usually effective in removing grease and oil stains. All detergents work better in water temperatures above 65 degrees. Fabric softeners reduce static cling, minimize wrinkling and soften clothes.


Drying: Choose a drying cycle that fits the care label instructions. Generally if clothes can be washed together they can be dried together. Do not overload the dryer. Keep lint filter clean. Air drying is recommended for some garments.




