The December issue of Southern Living magazine featured winning recipes from its Southern Living Holiday Recipe Contest. One of these awards, among 5,500 entries, in several categories, went to Susan Cearley of Tennyson.

On Tuesday, Susan said it was a real surprise when back in August she received a notification from the magazine saying her recipe for Tortilla Soup had been selected as a runnerup recipe to appear in the December issue. She said, "I had almost forgotten the spring entry that I had gotten off the magazine's website about the contest. The \$500 check wasn't bad either."

The cook says she likes to try new things and since she has lived on a ranch much of her life, she uses common ingredients easily kept in the kitchen or freezer. "You can't run to the store every time you cook," she laughed.

Susan readily agreed to share her winning recipe with O/E readers.

Tortilla Soup

4 corn tortillas, cut into 1inch pieces

1 large onion, chopped

4 to 6 garlic cloves, minced 2 tablespoons dried cilantro

* Fry tortilla strips in 1/2 cup hot oil in a large skillet until crisp. Drain on paper towels.





Charles Dickens is wellknown for his book A Christmas Carol, the story about the Cratchets and the Ghost of Christmas Past. By now, the movie and several cartoon versions have appeared on television and maybe a few have read the book.

Not so well-known is the Dickens' book that he wrote for his children entitled The Life of Our Lord. The book was written "during the years of 1846-1849. The book was not written for profit, nor publicity. His purpose was to teach his children about the life of Jesus Christ, championing the virtues of mercy and forgiveness." This was Dickens gift to his family. The book was finally published in 1934 after the only living son died leaving the manuscript to heirs who voted to share the book. The story becomes very powerful in its simplicity.

A recently released book A Midnight Carol: A novel of How Charles Dickens saved Christmas by Pamela Davis tells a fictional story of Dickens' life around the time

when he had no income and was living in poverty. The story reflects Dickens own dealings with greedy creditors and unscrupulous people. His characters, the Cratchets, are based on his own family and situation. The novel saved Dickens from poverty and made him a hero to the London public. Although A Midnight Carol is fictional, the author obviously admired Dickens and the book is well researched.

The Fire Department is not taking any chances, they have alternative plans for any kind of situation that might occur. The Fire Engines are ready in case of a fire, Radio Communications are planned in case the electricity goes off. The generator at the Fire Station is ready. WCCEMS will switch to their old frequency, for communications, if the repeater fails. The Fire Department will use battery powered radios. The men are all on alert.

They held a meeting on the 20th, and discussed the possibilities, The What if's...What if the Electric or gas should go off...We all need to have an alternative plan. The people with a fire place can keep warm, what about the rest? Have they made plans to keep warm. Most furnaces use electricity, for the blower fans. It takes electricity to push the gas to your home. If it is off for an extended period of time, what about meals? Hopefully the Electric Co. and the Gas Co. will have their employees on alert, should anything go wrong, and fix it in a short time

We must consider what can happen and make plans by having extra blankets handy,



native limestone buildings or witness historic re-creations on the quadrangle, they can experience anew that bygone era when times were hard and soldiers were far from home.

Since frontier winters in the 1870s and 1880s were bleak times filled with unrest and fear, Christmas celebrations were eagerly anticipated events. Soldiers and families at Fort Concho planned special meals and held elaborate parties and dances, using any available trees and decorations to produce a festive atmosphere. Soldiers especially loved planning special surprise presents for the few children at the fort. In 1875, one such soldier gave Colonel Grierson's son, George, a little brown puppy much to the delight of both George and the puppy! Instead of the modern custom of putting wrapped toys under the tree for the children, the tradition at Fort Concho was to hang the toys in amongst the branches of the huge tree in Officer's Quarters No. 1 (exceptions being made for the puppy variety, of course). Whatever the activity, Christmas became a time of renewal and hope - a treasured time of togetherness.

And togetherness is what Christmas at Old Fort Concho is all about. Every year, the first weekend in December is jam-packed with nonstop activity and entertainment for "kids" of all ages. > by Francis Church Is There a Santa Claus?

We take pleasure in answering at once and thus prominently the communication below, expressing at the same time our great gratification that its faithful author is numbered among the friends of The Sun:

Dear Editor! I am 8 years old.

Some of my little friends say there is no Santa Claus.

Papa says, "If you see it in The Sun it's so." Please tell me the truth: Is there a Santa

Claus? Virginia O'Hanlon.

115 West Ninety-Fifth Street.

Virginia, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age. They do not believe except they see. They think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds. All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little. In this great universe of ours man is a mere insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole truth and knowledge.

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give your life, its highest beauty and joy. Alas! how dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus. It would be as dreary as if there were no Virginias.

There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and sight. The eternal life with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies! You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys on Christmas Eve to catch Santa Claus, but even if they did not see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove?

Nobody sees Santa Claus, but that is no sign that there is no Santa Claus. The most real things in the world are those that neither children nor men can see. Did you ever see fairies dancing on the lawn? Of course not, but that's no proof that they are not there. Nobody can conceive or imagine all the wonders there are unseen and unseeable in the world.

You may tear apart the baby's rattle and see what makes the noise inside, but there is a veil covering the unseen world which not the strongest man, nor even the united strength of all the strongest men that ever lived, could tear apart. Only faith, fancy, poetry, love, romance, can push aside that curtain and view and picture the supernatural beauty and glory beyond. Is it all real?

Ah, Virginia, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

No Santa Claus! Thank God! he lives, and he lives forever. A thousand years from now, Virginia, nay, ten times then thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood.

Brenda Hines typed the following story from an 80 year old Robert Lee Observer dated Nov. 7, 1919. It is about my grandfather John Eddie Roberts from Robert Lee. He left the old railroad depot, as a young man, to serve his country in World War I. He was in the navy and trained in San Pedro, CA. That base is no longer in use. The family has photos taken while on his duties in California, and of early day sites in Alaska, of whales, and sites in the Aleutian Islands, and many letters.

Mr. Roberts only remaining child, Wilma Roberts Scott, resides in Bronte.

S.S. Unalga fights thrilling battle

When the influenza struck Unalaska in the far north wireless calls for aid resulted in the formation of a party of doctors and nurses to bring medical aid and food to the stricken communities. The writer of the following article, Miss Bertha Perry Warden, was one of the nurses of the expedition.

SOS. Never was there a more urgent and hopeless cry for help radioed across space from the far north than that from the flu stricken inhabitants of Unalaska, which was picked up by the U.S. Revenue Cutter Unalga wireless, as she plied her way north, one of Uncle Sam's silent watchers of the coast.

Far north, near the tail end of the 88, "Land that God got" lays the little village of Unalaska, one of the Aleutian groups. Just a narrow strip of coast line, some half mile in length shows all there is of the village, composed of a few modern buildings the remainder being "barasabas" or native huts; the population a few hands full of white, government mostly employees, the rest of the 360 habitants being Aleuts.

Such a peaceful, snug, little community out there on the "edge of the beyond" till one day in early May, like a bolt from the sky, more fearful and overwhelming than an avalanche from their own snow covered mountains

descended upon them the dread plague influenza, with such suddenness that for the first few days they did not realize what had befallen them.

By the third or fourth day more than half the population were stricken and a feeling of helplessness akin to terror settle upon them as they pictured themselves a mere handful of souls alone in the relentless grip of the dreaded foe of the twentieth century.

There they were 2,000 miles from civilization, their only doctor, one of the first flu victims, the few white women too ill in bed to fulfill a woman's mission of ministering angel, the babies and children uncared for. Their loneliness and remoteness increased the sense of disaster as each day brought fresh victims and more deaths.

Uncivilized, dirty in their habits and bodies, underfed from lack of fresh food, the natives offered little resistance to the disease and their plight grew more pitiful every hour.

Urgent indeed was their message for help further north they knew whole villages had to be wiped out by flu for need of skilled aid.

sooner was the

message read by the Unalga's Captain Dodge that the engines throbbed out their reply to the order for full speed for Unalaska and across the Berring Sea.

So fraught with treacherous passages and sudden fogs, raced the game little cutter, every man from captain to the cabin boy preparing for the grim fight ahead.

On arrival at Unalaska they found the entire population of some 360 souls stricken with the flu and only very inadequate help at hand into the fray, organizing their forces in order to give the maximum aid in the shortest time.

In a very few hours the ship's surgeon had attended the worst cases, established a local hospital, stationed "gobs" at the various houses where the inmates needed nursing and issued orders for the burial of the dead.

Officers and men alike regardless of rank, working night and day to dispose as soon as possible of the accumulated dead, some very dead, and half eaten by the malamute dogs. Coffins were built, roughly and quickly, and back on the side of a snow clad hill the remains of the flu victims were laid to rest as one of the officers read a simple service at the gravesite.

With the care of the sick well under control the next problem was what to do with the children, many of them orphans and quiet uncared for. A thorough inspection of the barabaras brought to light some 50 kiddies of all ages, down to babies of a few

weeks old, all very dirty, some to the point of starving and many wild-eyed from fear of the dogs, half husky, half wolf, grown fierce each day in their search for human flesh.

The children were brought to the European part of the village and installed in an empty wooden house, which had been cleaned and aired by the "gobs". When the question arose who is to take charge of the dirty little imps it just naturally fell to the lot of Pete, the master of arms, Greek by birth, a born fighter of men, and protector of all things helpless and small. On board it was always Pete who as a matter of course took unto his big heart the pets of the ship.

So Pete it was to whom fell the responsibilities of caring for the orphans of the "USS UNALGA ORPHANS HOME." With the aid of some "gobs" he took them in turn and bathed and clothed them. Those children who had no clothing were laid flat on the bolt of material and their outline penciled.

The garment was then cut out and sewn together and if not the latest fashion was surely a perfect fit.

When it came to bathing the babies Pete scratched his head and wondered how, finally he decided that the art of bathing the dogs and babies must be the same so taking each howling infant in turn he held it with one hand firmly by the scruff of the neck and scrubbed it down with warm water and soap with the other hand.

When the native women were convalescent enough to walk down to see the children they almost had a relapse on hearing of Pete's nautical bathing performances,

declaring loudly that he would kill them, the natives are not fond of water.

With the sick people and children properly taken care of the next task was the cleaning up the native barabaras. They were built for the most part of earth. Very often they are dugouts on the side of the hill. They are for the most part unspeakably dirty, and alive with vermin, so in cases where inhabitants had all succumbed to the flu the contents of the barabaras were burned as the only sure means of disinfecting them.

When Unalaska was convalescent and the survivors from the flu were getting down to normal life again, the Unalga continued her mission of mercy some 600 miles further up the Alaskan coast, at the entrance of the Nushagat River.

Here they found the natives practically wiped out by the flu and their work was chiefly a matter of inspecting the various native villages along the banks of the river burning the barabaras and burying the dead.

Some of the bodies had been lying there for weeks and many were eaten entirely by the dogs. The dogs had become very savage and it was necessary to send shooting parties ashore to kill them before the burial parties could land. In one barabaras was found a native who had made his own coffin and nailed it to the wall, some six feet from the floor like a bunk in a ship. Evidently when he fell sick he had crawled in there and died for here was his body, found unharmed by the dogs but in advanced state of decay.

As sailors the boys on the

Unalga were heroic, but as flu fighters they were Christ like, for they were fighting a grim foe for which ninety-nine percent of them were not equipped with even the necessary knowledge for self protection.

(Editors Note: Eddie Roberts passed away in 1946.)







A Texas Christmas) As migrants, my family spent holidays in different parts of the state. We traveled around the areas of West Texas following the harvest, so we would usually end up in cotton country for Christmas, always a joyful time for my family.

The connections my father had with the cotton gin owner helped our family of eight take residence in an office building that was too old to use anymore. Somehow, my mother made it a home. It was in this old office building, made out of tin, that we spent one of my most memorable Christmases.

That Christmas I was seven, and my father, as a result of a terrible ginning accident, had been hospitalized for what seemed like an eternity to us kids. With my father in the hospital, we had to be very conservative. Christmas was near and worries of Santa Claus not coming were abundant. Because basic needs always took precedence over holidays, my mother found



ways to compensate for what she could not buy. This year was special to me because she chose me to help her locate a Christmas tree.

The empty field across the street from our residence was filled with hundreds of cotton trailers all lined up in rows. We went out and chose the best tumbleweed out of the hundreds that were trapped under the cotton trailers. Mom made choosing one a very special occasion. Once chosen, the tumbleweed was trimmed, cleaned, and taken inside. My mother's fingers bled from the cuts she got while trimming our tree. Then, we watched her decorate it. The next morning our special tumbleweed tree stood on a small table sparkling beautifully. There were no gifts to accompany the tree, but just having it made the day

extremely special. Because my dad was ill, it was my mom, my five brothers and sisters and I against the cruelty that life sometimes brings. In my mind, at age seven, we overcame that cruelty together, as a family.

Hotline established to answer children's insurance questions

State Representative Robert Junell (D-San Angelo) reports that the Texas Health and Human Services Commission has established a toll-free hotline to accept inquiries about the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and other insurance options for children.

By calling the hotline, families of uninsured children can access information about health coverage through Medicaid and the Texas Healthy Kids Corporation. They can also leave their name and address so that a joint application for CHIP, Texas Healthy Kids and Medicaid can be mailed to them as soon as it becomes available.

"Getting information about access to quality health insurance out to parents of uninsured children in our area is vital," Junell said, "and the hotline provides a centralized place for them to get information about all of the options which may be available."

Representative Junell helped spearhead the effort to enact CHIP legislation which provides health insurance to children of working parents who earn too little to afford the cost of private health insurance. The program is expected to be fully operational by May 1, 2000.

"There are so many children

falling through the cracks when it comes to health insurance and the CHIP helps to fill this gap and provide them the quality health care services they need and deserve," said Junell.

The number for the toll-free hotline is 800-647-6558. Rep. Junell encourages families to call the hotline with any questions they may have.





Make Holiday time a safe time

With lots of cooking and entertaining at holiday time, it's easy to get caught up in the excitement and to overlook some basic safety precautions. Even cooks with decades of experience are susceptible to kitchen mishaps.

A safe kitchen begins with a clean, clutter-free environment. If things are put away in their proper place, there is less chance of accidents. Cuts and burns are just two of the possible injuries. Others include slips, sprains, falls, strains, bruises, shock and electric poisonings.

Fire and hot utensils are the most obvious dangers. The basic rule for stove safety is never leave cooking Turn pot unattended. handles so they do not hang over the front of the stove where they can be bumped or pulled down by a curious child. When lifting a pot lid, tilt it so it directs the steam away from face and hands. Use dry potholders to remove hot dishes from the oven or stove.

Oil and grease present special hazards. Water and hot oil do not mix; instead, they create dangerous splatters. Food should be free of water and ice when it's lowered gently into hot oil. Grease that is smoking is too hot. Smoke indicates that the grease can easily ignite. If a grease fire starts, never try to put it out with water. Extinguish it by turning off the burner and sliding a lid over the pan or using a drychemical fire extinguisher.

When cooking, wear short or roll-up sleeves, rather than loose, flowing garments. If clothing does catch fire, drop to the floor and roll back and forth to smother the flame. If the burns are severe, call for medical help. If minor, rinse with cool water for at least five

environment can be hazardous. A cabinet door left open can result in a bumped head. Worn flooring or food spills left on the floor increase the chance of slipping. Frayed extension and appliance cords increase the chance of shock or fire. Poor lighting means poor visibility, which increases the possibility of an accident. Check all these things carefully.

Test smoke detectors regularly. Many people find it easier to remember to do this at the same time they change their clocks. Keep a first aid kit handy. A fire extinguisher that is capable of putting out both grease and electrical fires should be an essential

piece of equipment in every kitchen. Store it where it is easily and quickly accessible.

Childproof the kitchen. Children are curious all year long, but at holiday time they are more excited than usual...and the adults around them are more distracted than usual. If there are small children underfoot, it's particularly important to childproof the kitchen.

Keep things inaccessible. This means to use door locks on cabinets containing medicines, cleaning supplies, lighter fluid and pesticides; tightly close garbage to keep children out; and install gates at entrances to kitchens with steps. Stove shields, which detach easily for cooking, prevent children's access to burner and oven controls. These control knobs can also be removed when not in use. Install childproof plugs in unused electrical outlets and cover the garbage disposal switch with a dome-type outlet plate. Most important of all:


Knives are another kitchen hazard. Knives should be kept sharp, as a dull knife requires extra pressure, which increases the possibility that the blade, hand or cutting board will slip. Use knives only for cutting and not for tasks like chopping ice or prying open a container. Never soak a dirty knife in the sink - feeling around for a knife in soapy water is courting an accident. Wash, dry and put knives away immediately after use. When not in use, knives should be stored in a special slotted rack or wood block or in a separate drawer with blades pointing to the rear.












This gorgeous poinsettia, belonging to Dora Gallaway of Bronte, is rare in that this is the second year for it to bloom.

How to care for poinsettias at home Location and temperature.

The poinsettia thrives on indirect, natural daylight, and exposure to at least six hours daily is recommended. If direct sun cannot be avoided, diffuse with a light shade or sheer curtain. To prolong the bright color of the poinsettia bracts, daytime temperatures should not exceed 70 degrees Fahrenheit. Avoid placing the plants near drafts, excess heat, or the dry air from appliances, fireplaces, or ventilating ducts.

Water and Fertilizer.

Poinsettias require moderately moist soil. Water the plants thoroughly when the soil surface feels dry to the touch. Remove the plant from decorative pots or covers, and water enough to completely saturate the soil. Do not allow the poinsettia to sit in any standing water, root rot could result which could kill the plant. It is not necessary to fertilize the poinsettia when it is in bloom.

Outside Placement.

Since poinsettias are sensitive to cold weather, frost, and rain, outside placement during the winter months should be avoided. However, in mild climates, an enclosed patio or entry way may be suitable, provided the night temperatures do not drop below 55 degrees Fahrenheit. Make certain the delicate bracts are well protected from wind and cold rain.

After the Holidays.

Keep the plants in indirect sun and water regularly. Place your plants outdoors, where they can bask in the warmth of spring and summer, after outside night temperatures average 55 degrees Fahrenheit or above. When the bracts age and lose their aesthetic appeal, usually by late March or early April, cut the poinsettia back to about eight inches in height. By the end of May you should see vigorous new growth. Continue regular watering during the growth period. Fertilize every 2 to 3 weeks throughout the spring, summer, and fall months with a well-balanced, complete fertilizer. Around June 1, you may transplant your poinsettias into larger pots. Select pots no more that four inches larger than the original inner pot. A soil mix with a consid-



> erable amount of organic matter, such as peat moss or leaf mold, is highly recommended. If you wish, you may transplant the poinsettias into a wellprepared garden bed. Be sure the planting bed is rich in organic matter and has good drainage. Pruning may be required during the summer to keep plants bushy and compact. Do not prune after September 1. **Re-flowering.**

The poinsettia is a photo periodic plant, meaning that it sets bud and producers flowers as the autumn nights lengthen. The plants will naturally come-into full bloom during November or December, depending upon the flowering response-time of the individual cultivar. Timing the bloom to coincide closely with the Christmas holiday can be difficult without the controlled environment of a greenhouse. Stray light of any kind, such as from outside street lights or household lamps, could delay or entirely halt the re-flowering process.

Starting October 1, the plants must be kept in complete darkness for 14 continuous hours each night. Accomplish this by moving the plants to a totally dark room, or by covering them with a large box overnight. During October, November, and early December, the plants require 6 to 8 hours of bright sunlight daily, with nighttime temperatures between 60 and 70 degrees Fahrenheit. Temperatures outside this range may delay flowering. Continue the normal watering and fertilizer program.

Following this regime for 8 to 10 weeks should result in a colorful display of blooms for the holiday season.


