## 60th annual stock show begins today

more importantly will involve more than 90 youth exhibitors from around the county.

The county stock show offers the youth of Coke County an opportunity to exhibit their livestock projects which they have worked with for over 11 months in some cases.

## Over 10,000 view Bryan's Barn display

Beginning in September of 1999, and increasing in intensity through October November, and December Bryan's Barn west of Roben Lee was a busy place.
The Bryan family and friends put out more lights and other Christmas paraphernalia than had ever been displayed in previous years.
Additional power made it possible to increase the display to include the full six-acre area, including Bryan property west of Messbox Creek.
As information concerning the Barn increased on radio TV, newspapers, magazines, and by viewers telling others, "You've got to see it!" crowds grew in number. The smallest number, 55, registered opening night, December 1 , 1999. The largest number, 907, registered Decembe 23.

It is impossible to get every viewer registered. Many go inside the Barn, but many do not.
Some walk or drive through, and many local families drive through every night. Considering the number registered, it is estimated that over 10,000 people saw Bryan's Barn light display in 1999.

(3) each from Arkansas, New York, Kansas, and Kentucky. There were two visitors each from Louisiana, Georgia New Hampshire, Maryland Florida, Virginia, and Arizona. Only one registered from Illinois.
Seven countries other than the U.S.A. were represented Mexico, Cairo, Egypt, Nairobi Kenya, Amman, Jordan, Canada, Nigeria, Africa, and the Union of South Africa (Every year some new country is represented.)
