KTXS Weather Program

George Flickinger, Chief Meteorologist from Channel 12 KTXS in Abilene, visited the Bronte Schools Wednesday, April 5th. He presented a program on thunderstorms, tornadoes. hail and lightning. He told the students how these storms form, the dangers they present to each of us, and how to be safe during the different storms. He showed the students video footage of tornadoes and lightning. He answered their questions and explained how they make weather forecasts at the sta-

The Bronte schools received a school net weather instrument station from KTXS in March that has enabled the station to take weather readings from Bronte. The station is computerized and connected to KTXS 24 hours a day. The computer program also has a teaching program about weather for elementary and secondary students. The weather active monitor is connected to both science rooms and the library for easy access. by all teachers and students. It gives readings of current, local temperatures, barometric pressures, humidity, wind speed and direction. It even gives the wind chill factor and dew point for our location. The students presented George with a Bronte Longhorn cap and a Longhorn playoff T-shirt that he displayed at the end of the KTXS weather forecast. Students in the 3rd through 8th grades met in the new science labs for the programs.



Brown - Thompson attend National Affairs Awards trip

Over 120 Texas Farm Bureau members, including Coke-Sterling County Farm Bureau members Robert Brown and Donnie Thompson, stormed Capitol Hill in late March to air concerns of agricultural producers and the state's largest farm organization.

Brown and Thompson found the Texas group was well received in Washington, D.C. as most of the Texas Congressional delegation and both Senators Phil Gramm and Kay Bailey Hutchison personally took time out of extremely busy schedules to visit. The two Coke County men said the legislators listened with open minds.

"We think our lawmakers feel it's important to hear the concerns of actual agricultural producers," Brown and Thompson said. "We were able to talk directly with them about both the problems and opportunities of Texas agriculture."

Issues discussed with lawmakers included the farm program, crop insurance, regulatory issues and taxes.

This was the 25th anniversary of the National Affairs Awards trip. The two men qualified for the trip by actively voicing agricultural concerns to their representatives and senators at the national level.




RLISD school board meets



Rules of the Road -Bike-wise

Bicycles are not toys. They are actually vehicles operated on the streets and highways. For this reason, children (and their parents) should understand that they should be skilled in riding bikes, avoid high-traffic areas and know the rules of the road - the traffic laws of your community.

Riding in the dusk or dark is dangerous and should be avoided if possible. If a bicycle must be ridden at these times, reflectors and lights are essential for safety and are required by law.

Check with your local sheriff's office to find out what local ordinances apply to bike riders. Many communities require lights and horns on

bikes. Many city ordinances also direct that bikers wear helmets at all times.

Many accidents occur when bikes and cars cross each other's paths, such as at driveways and intersections. Instruct your child to look ahead and watch for cars and assume that they will not see her on her bike. Motorists, who are looking out for other cars, can easily overlook bicyclists.

To help your child remember the rules of the road, encourage her to remember SIPDE. This stands for "Scan, Identify, Predict, Decide, Execute," the safety taught method to motorcyclists. This system stands for:

Scan the street, sidewalk and

cross streets ahead. Identify potential hazards. Predict cars' movement. Decide on a course of action. Execute the maneuver that will keep you safe.

And, above all, never let her get on her bike without her helmet. We know for certain that bike helmets save heads and lives!
