The Robert Lee City Council is sponsoring a strategy session Thursday, April 26th at 7:00 pm in the courtroom at the Coke County Courthouse. Citizens who want Robert Lee to move forward have an opportunity to learn from an expert at this session.

Directing the meeting will be Troy Williamson, Director of the Economic Development Center at the University of Texas, Permian Basin. Mr. Williamson was Regional Services Director of the Concho Valley Council of Governments in San Angelo until 1998 and was responsible for the Concho Valley Economic Development District as well as several other services.

Mr. Williamson is especially aware of the concerns of small cities as he served as Mayor of Snyder from 1987 to 1993. He presently serves on the advisory committee to the Rural Affairs office of the Texas Department of Economic Development.

Mr. Williamson will respond

to the recent economic survey concerns and lead a discussion as to what steps should be taken to act on some of the solutions suggested. The response to the survey was very encouraging and many of the suggestions are feasible and will make Robert Lee better equipped to attract tourists, businesses, and people looking for a good place to live.

Working toward improvements

A meeting with Judy Fort of the Texas Agriculture Department was held April 11 in the Coke County Library. Robert Lee Council members, county officials, city superintendent, and several interested residents discussed ways to revive city-owned property to make it attractive to residents and tourists alike.

The group toured Fern Havins Park and it was agreed that the park would be an excellent bird-watching site. The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department as well as Dan Brown of Christoval will be consulted as to the best use of the land for this purpose. Several of the group volunteered to begin working toward the improvement of the park. Anyone who would like to be involved in this project is asked to call City Hall for information.

Ms. Fort toured Mountain Creek lake, the old lakes at

the landfill, and Lake Spence. It was agreed that these areas could be up-graded to attract birders. It is said that birders are careful of the land and understand that leaving the habitat areas undisturbed is important. Bird watchers are said to spend time shopping and eating out in addition to bird watching.

J. T. Henry honored

J. T. Henry was honored Tuesday, April 17, 2001 when the Coke County Retired Teachers Association met at the Ag building at Bronte High School. The building has been named in honor of J. T.

Henry.

The staff of BISD hosted the luncheon prepared by the current Ag students under the direction of Jay Henderson, present Ag teacher. Preceding the meal, Henderson introduced Eric Johnson, FFA president, who extended the welcome to unit members and visitors. He spoke of the many changes Mr. Henry experienced in his 38 years as Bronte Ag teacher. He taught from 1936 to 1974.

Following the consumption of good food, Rick Howell, BHS principal, spoke on the importance of the Ag program in building character as well as teaching skills. He stated that J. T. Henry did this as a teacher and continued to serve the community upon retirement through a fraternal group, city government, his church, and coffee shop talk.

Bill Gentry, a Henry student of the class of 1950, spoke of Henry's influence on his life.

J. T. Henry responded by telling how he came to Bronte in 1936. His future wife, Sybil, came to Bronte to teach in 1937. They found each other and were married in 1938. Their marriage of 63 years has been sustained by their service in teaching and service to the Bronte community. Sybil was the commercial teacher and later 6th grade teacher. Their daughter, Linda Boyer,

a music teacher in San Angelo, attended the Tuesday celebration.

J. T. stated that his success as a teacher was due to the students who responded to the teaching and to the support of the community. Under his direction they built the concession stand, the ticket booth, and seating at the high school stadium. His students learned how to give to the community. He stated that his program was not about livestock but about students. He didn't teach the subject - he taught boys and girls.

There were 27 RTA members present and at least 20 visitors including a dozen who had been students of Henry.

Louis Bridges and Ed Cumbie both spoke of being in J. T.'s first class in 1936. Ed told of going with J. T. and Sybil on their honeymoon. It was a trip to El Paso for the state FFA meeting. Others who lauded Henry and told of experiences with him were: Royce Lee, Jimmy Bickley, C. B. Barbee, and Benny Corley.

Janet Wommack presided at a brief business meeting where Kenneth Rasco was appointed to serve as vice president for the coming year. The next meeting will be May 21 at the home of Jerry and Bette McCutchen on Humble Road.

The plaque by the front door of the Ag building sums up the deep appreciation and affection held for J. T. Henry. It reads: This building is dedicated to J. T. Henry for his unmatched zeal and dedication in furthering the skills and excellence in his students. Agricultural Teacher, 1936 -1974 FFA Seal, presented Sept., 2000.


The "RITE Approach to Economic Development" will feature the latest in community planning, business retention, rural telecommunications and tourism initiatives that can help communities in their rural development efforts.





Clutter, clutter everywhere

Want to save time and reduce allergens? Get organized! Cleaning professionals say that getting rid of excess clutter can reduce housework by 40%. Having lots of stuff around does more than clutter up a room, it makes cleaning much more difficult and provides the ideal place for dust and its allergens to accumulate.

Sort

*Circle the room, handling everything. For each item, ask yourself: Do I use it? Do I love it? Don't keep items that used to be important to you, or might be important someday. Keep only those items which are important to you now.

*Sort "keepers" into categories, putting like with like. For example, put T-shirts in one pile, sweaters in another, jeans in a third, etc. This allows you to see everything you own, by category, at a glance.

*Sort discards into labeled cartons: trash, giveaway, tag sale, belongs elsewhere. This last box is for items you want to keep, but need to be moved to another room or into storage.

Purge

*Eliminate duplicates and broken or outdated items. Avoid the trap of keeping things just because you paid good money for them. If you aren't using something, give it to someone who will.

*Adopt a charity for your giveaways. Knowing your belongings are going to people you care about makes it easier to part with them.

*Consider off-site storage if you have items you can't bear to part with (tax records, college papers, memorabilia, extra furniture). It will get the items out of the house without the trauma of permanently purging them.



*Assign a specific location for each item, e.g., one drawer for T-shirts, a different one for belts, etc.

*Store items at their point of use for easy retrieval and clean up - books next to your

reading chair, cooking utensils in a drawer next to the range, etc.

*Keep accessibility and safety in mind. Don't jam things too tightly in a drawer or stack things so high that it's hard to reach them.

Containerize

*Use covered plastic or metal containers to store similar items together and keep them dust-free.

*Measure or count the items you need to store to ensure buying the right size containers. Choose attractive colors that match the decor of your

*Label containers so everyone can easily follow your system.

Equalize

*Put things away as you use them. Daily clean up takes no more than three to five minutes per room.

*Follow the "One In, One Out" Rule. Before buying something new, decide what you will eliminate to make room for it.
