Bronte ISD Agriculture Bldg. named in honor of J. T. Henry

William Come to Ville

(Editor's Note: The following article appeared in the April 20, 2001 edition of the O/E, without the picture(s). We recently received the picture(s), and thought it a nice tribute to Mr. Henry to re-run the article and the pictures together).

J. T. Henry was honored Tuesday, April 17, 2001 when the Coke County Retired Teachers Association met at the Ag building at Bronte High School. The building has been named in honor of J. T. Henry.

The staff of BISD hosted the luncheon prepared by the current Ag students under the direction of Jay Henderson, present Ag teacher. Preceding the meal, Henderson introduced Eric Johnson, FFA president, who extended the welcome to unit members and visitors. He spoke of the many changes Mr. Henry experienced in his 38 years as Bronte Ag teacher. He taught from 1936 to 1974.

Following the consumption of good food, Rick Howell,

BHS principal, spoke on the importance of the Ag program in building character as well as teaching skills. He stated that J. T. Henry did this as a teacher and continued to serve the community upon retirement through a fraternal group, city government, his church, and coffee shop talk.

Bill Gentry, a Henry student of the class of 1950, spoke of Henry's influence on his life.

J. T. Henry responded by telling how he came to Bronte in 1936. His future wife, Sybil, came to Bronte to teach in 1937. They found each other and were married in 1938. Their marriage of 63 years has been sustained by their service in teaching and service to the Bronte community. Sybil was the commercial teacher and later 6th grade teacher. Their daughter, Linda Boyer, a music teacher in San Angelo, attended the Tuesday celebration.

J. T. stated that his success as a teacher was due to the students who responded to the teaching and to the sup-

port of the community. Under his direction they built the concession stand, the ticket booth, and seating at the high school stadium. His students learned how to give to the community. He stated that his program was not about livestock but about students. He didn't teach the subject - he taught boys and girls.

There were 27 RTA members present and at least 20 visitors including a dozen who had been students of Henry.

Louis Bridges and Ed Cumbie both spoke of being in J. T.'s first class in 1936. Ed told of going with J. T. and Sybil on their honeymoon. It was a trip to El Paso for the state FFA meeting. Others who lauded Henry and told of experiences with him were: Royce Lee, Jimmy Bickley, C. B. Barbee, and Benny Corley.

Janet Wommack presided at a brief business meeting where Kenneth Rasco was appointed to serve as vice president for the coming year. The next meeting will be May 21 at the home of Jerry and Bette McCutchen on Humble Road.

The plaque by the front door of the Ag building sums up the deep appreciation and affection held for J. T. Henry. It reads: This building is dedicated to J. T. Henry for his unmatched zeal and dedica-

Public hearing slated

Coke County Commissioners Court will hold a public hearing at 9:00 am on June 11 for the purpose of redistricting the County Commissioners Court, Justice of the Peace, Constables and election precincts according to state and federal law.

The court met May 18, 2001, and worked on maps regarding the distribution. The Commissioners have come up with a map they feel is best for the county. The main changes came about between Pct. 1 and 2. The court hired the firm of Allison, Bass, and Associates to assist with the redistricting. The court is looking at reducing the number of election precincts to four. This is being done to reduce the cost of elections. With early voting increasing each year, the numbers voting on election day is decreasing and the need for seven election sites is no longer necessary.

Two high school seniors from Bronte have been awarded Carr Academic Scholarships at Angelo State

University for the 2001-02 academic year.

The students include Crissie D. McCoulskey and Elizabeth K. Morgan from Bronte High School.

Carr Academic Scholarships are being awarded for 2001-2002, ranging in value from \$1,500 to \$6,000, to qualified undergraduates. During the current year more than 1,000 students from throughout Texas and the nation, as well as numerous foreign countries, are attending Angelo State University on Carr Academic Scholarships.

As a general rule, entering freshmen must rank in the top 15 percent of their high school class and present either a combined math and verbal score of 1140 on the SAT I or a composite score of 25 on the ACT.

Carr of San Angelo, the undergraduate scholarships may be renewed annually by the university for students who maintain the required academic record. During a four - year course of undergraduate study at ASU, Carr Academic Scholarships can be worth from \$6,000 to \$24,000


Smith - Vaughn to exchange vows






